How's Trade? One of the largest manufacturers in Canada of a class of goods universally worn by all classes was satisfied yesterday with the above question. He replied, "I never had a more satisfactory year in my long experience, collections have been good, and I have plenty of orders to keep us busy until spring." He then launched out into a denunciation of growers about "hard times," and said that after a prolonged visit to the States, to inspect factories of his own class, he had come home more than ever convinced that on the whole Canada was commercially better off than the Republic. He granted that in the U.S. some men made large gains, but, "taking this country, man for man, there is a higher average of comfort in Canada."

In connection with the letter of Mr. Paul Campbell with regard to taxation; it may be said that he and others have applied to the Attorney-General of Ontario for a commission to investigate the matter and to ascertain the facts, so that if the facts justify the allegations made by them legislation in the direction indicated may be secured.

IMPORTANT JUDGMENTS.

A Busy Day at Osgoode Hall Yesterday—Findings of the Divisional Court in Heavy Actions.

The Common Pleas Divisional Court yesterday morning delivered judgment in a number of cases, among which are the following of general interest:

The Street Railway Mass Pay. Osgoode v. Toronto Street Railway Co.—A motion by the defendants to set aside the verdict of \$6000 damages for the plaintiff. Action for damages for injuries sustained by the plaintiff by reason of a collision between his carriage and a street car on the defendant's line. The motion was refused.

The Attorney-General Lases. Attorney-General v. Lawrie—An appeal by the plaintiff from the judgment of Mr. Justice Meredith, who tried the action as St. Catharines and dismissed it without costs. Action to recover rent for water power and for certain lands near Port Huron. The defendant contended that he was not liable, his lease having expired and the plaintiff having accepted one Sylvester Nelson, an assignee of the lease, as tenant of the lands. The motion was dismissed with costs.

A Promissory Note Case. Ontario Investment Association v. L. F. Hellmuth—An appeal from the judgment of Chief Justice Armour in favor of the plaintiff. The defendant was the indorser of a promissory note for \$4000, made by G. S. Hellmuth, since deceased, to one Henry Taylor, being a renewal of a note for \$5000 given in consideration of an advance to G. S. Hellmuth and indorsed by the present defendant on the strength of a statement made to him by Taylor, that the loan was secured by a pledge of stock of the plaintiff associated with G. S. Hellmuth, and valued at \$12,000 or \$15,000. The motion was dismissed with costs.

Must Spend Christmas in the Contract. Reg. v. Harper—This was an appeal from the order of Mr. Justice Ferguson refusing to release William Harper from the Central Prison, where he was sent for four months by Magistrate Denison for vagrancy. The court dismissed the appeal with costs, so Harper must spend his Christmas in the Contract.

No Negligence Shown. Sterritt v. Rice—A motion by the plaintiff to set aside the verdict for the defendant in the action which was tried by Chief Justice Galt and a jury at Toronto. Action for damages for injuries to the plaintiff resulting, as alleged, from his being struck by the shaft of a milk wagon negligently driven by the defendant's servant. The jury found that the driver was not guilty of negligence. On this motion the plaintiff contended that the findings of the jury were not warranted by the evidence; that the plaintiff was taken by surprise; that the evidence of one William Sterritt was improperly rejected; and that evidence for the defendant was improperly admitted. The motion was dismissed with costs.

A Peculiar Suit. Mulligan v. Thompson—A motion by the plaintiff to set aside a non-suit and judgment for the defendant in an action tried before Chief Justice Armour. The action was for damages for the seduction of the plaintiff's daughter, a married woman, prior to her marriage. At the trial the learned judge refused to admit evidence by the married woman tending to bastardize her child which was born subsequent to the marriage. The court allowed the motion and set aside the non-suit.

Salt in the Milk. Reg. v. Stone—A motion to quash a conviction for supplying adulterated milk to a cheese factory under Dom. Act, 62 Vic., cap. 43. The wife of defendant, thinking the milk a little sour, had put a small quantity of salt into the can, which was taken to the factory. The motion was dismissed with costs and the conviction confirmed.

No Right to Collect Tolls. [Reg. v. McQuade—This was a motion to quash the defendant's conviction by James Walker, a justice of the peace for the county of Frontenac, for passing a "check-bar" over a toll gate in the Kingston and Perth macadamized road. It appeared that the defendant when he passed the toll gate proper was really on a lane on his own farm, but that he also passed through a "check-bar" erected by the toll-keeper on a concession road, crossing the Kingston and Perth roads at right angles near the point where the toll-gate is placed. The defendant contended that the concession road was a public road maintained by statute labor and was not macadamized, and that there was no right to collect tolls upon it. At all events a claim of right was set up sufficient to cost the magistrate's jurisdiction. The conviction was also attacked on other grounds. The court quashed the conviction with costs against the informant.

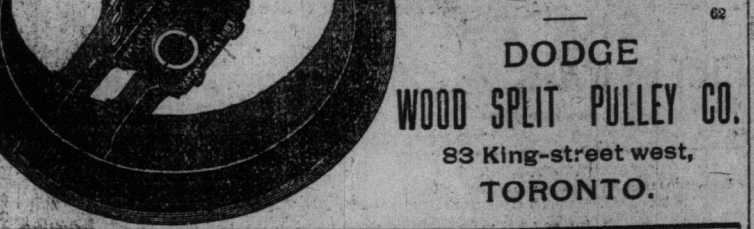

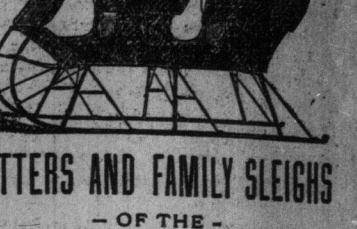
