

Young Vernier does not intend to repose on his laurels. He attributes every mathematical discovery to "intuition," of which he evidently believes that he has a considerable stock at his command. It remains to be seen whether young Vernier will succeed in carrying out his threat of demolishing the existing system, and it is quite possible that he overrates his powers. 


