BETRAYED HIS TRUST.  
Clerk in the Education Department Suspended  
FOR DIVULGING OFFICE SECRETS.  
Supplied the P.P.A. With Important Documents.

Eaten Williams, for 12 Years a Trusted Clerk of the Minister of Education, Charged With Supplying Photographs and Copies of Important Documents to the P.P.A. Organization for Use in the Campaign of June Last—The Accused Admits His Guilt to Hon. Mr. Ross and Surrenders the Parolined Papers.

Eaten Williams, for twelve years a clerk in the Department of Education, has been suspended pending the investigation of a serious charge. It is that of divulging private letters and documents for the purpose of making copies or photographs of them for political purposes.

Handed Over to the P.P.A. The Minister of Education asserts that he not only has Williams' admission that he took private papers for his own use, but claims that certain members of the P.P.A. organization induced Williams to get possession of his letters, and that he justified in this suspicion in a way that is now being investigated.

Mr. Ross interviewed. "I do not wish to say very much about the matter. Williams was guilty of most serious conduct, and he has been suspended on that account. I am extremely sorry for him; he seems to regret his conduct very much. He was appointed by me as one of my 'good boys.' You will understand that it is a grave offence for a clerk in my office to divulge or make copies of important private papers. The investigation is being held at the present time, and it will be necessary to discover the full extent of this offence. Although I have reason to believe that he was not a conspirator, it is possible that the papers he had in his possession."

As to the exact nature of the papers in question, the honorable gentleman was reticent. They are supposed to relate to the various matters connected with the school question, which has already been mentioned. It is believed that Mr. Williams had in his possession a number of letters and documents, some of which were of a confidential nature. The government is endeavoring to find out whether Williams had not an access to the files of the department, and if so, what he had done with them.

How the Copying Was Done. It is not thought that Williams had betrayed his employers of late in any way. Most of the parolined charges against him took place last year. His method is supposed to have been that of removing letters and other papers and making photostatic and written copies of them over night. Most of them he brought back next day, but a number he kept back and these he handed to Hon. G. W. Ross yesterday.

Williams, now 29 years of age and a married man, his salary was \$800 per year. He has three children and resides at Lumbino Mills. Formerly he lived at 23 Grosvenor-street. He was up to a point a well-to-do and a client partner in the firm of Brown, Ross & Williams, Manufacturers' Agents. He is a native of Ontario.  
To Be Rewarded. It is the hope of the government that it will be able to prove that a conspiracy existed to obtain possession of the documents remains to be seen. The more serious the case, the more anxious to punish Williams' accomplices will be the government. His dismission was practically a certainty, and the affair will be brought up on the floor of the House on Monday next.

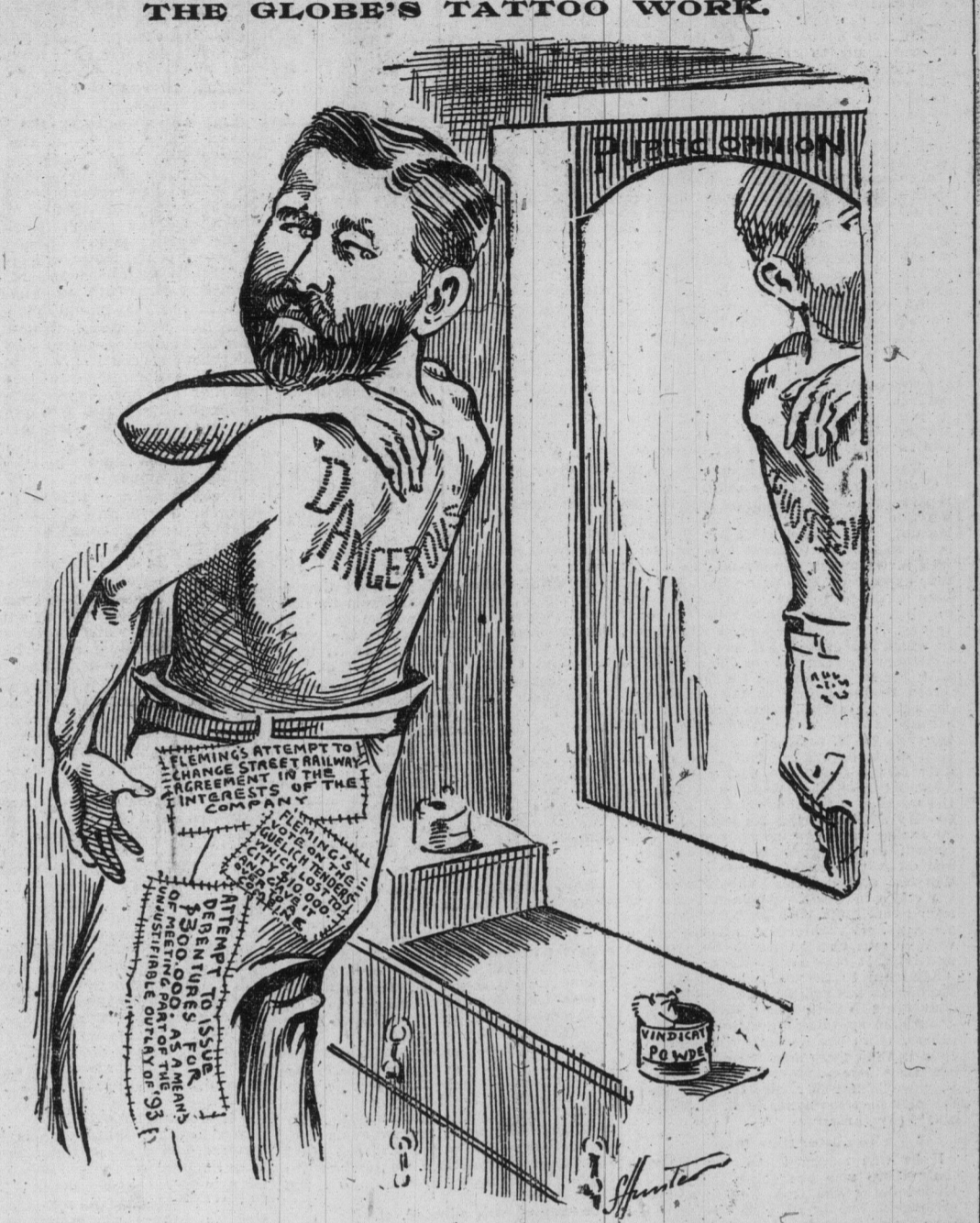

AN EASY WAY TO DECIDE THIS VERY IMPORTANT QUESTION.

Will the Citizens' Committee have a Pamphlet—Reason the Workingman is Left Idle—A False and Dangerous Policy.

Calling on a very prominent citizen, one who takes great interest in everything tending towards the civic and municipal, our reporter asked "If he would give him his views on the coming election and city matters in general."

"The great trouble in the past," said he, "has been an unusual million of increasing the city debt, trying to scrape along without sufficient money and leaving the workingman in a state of poverty; it's a false and self-sufficient policy."

"We should rather sympathize with, last year's Council. They had no city funds to handle, or it might have been different times in Toronto. Some good financiers, brainy men, handicapped for money when the city's credit could have been raised."
