WHENCE COMES THE COLOR.

Beautiful Hues Thrown Out by a Black and White Top. Scientists of England have been giving a great deal of serious consideration lately to the study of a mere toy which they are still unable to satisfactorily explain. It is a toy called the "artificial spectrum top," in which mere tracings of black and white are made to assume colors when in motion. The top as now constructed consists of a revolving disc, half black and half white. On the white half are short concentric arcs of black. When the top revolves close under a bright lamp these arcs appear, not as gray lines, as might be expected, but as lines of color. To most eyes the effect is as follows: (1) - When the revolution is such that the black line is preceded by the black half of the disc and followed by the

remainder of the white. It appears red. (2) - When the direction of rotation is reversed it appears blue. (3) - When the lines are on the central portion of the white (as in the present case) the color given is green. (4) - Intermediate positions give approximately the intermediate colors of the spectrum. A few people see these colors differently, and one or two people, by no means color blind, can see no color at all. Curiously enough, a few people who are somewhat color blind can see the colors on the top very well.

Interesting News for Farmers

A cow will shrink in her milk because of lack of a supply of drinking water sooner than from any other cause, and it may be safely stated that insufficient water when the cows are in the pasture is a very frequent occurrence on farms.

Nothing is gained by feeding an animal more than it should be allowed at one meal.

Food that is left over is usually wasted. Give as much as will be eaten clean. This may be done by observing the animal for a few days. It is sometimes better to feed rather less than a meal than to allow too much, but it will be necessary to understand the characteristics and peculiarities of each animal to know how to feed to the best advantage.

Humus is a term applied to certain organic matter in soils.

It expresses no definite product, but applies to the entire product of organic decomposition, or rather, an intermediate stage of this decomposition. This process of organic decomposition results in the production of ammonia, which combines with certain acids, and is absorbed. Thus the humus may be taken as a measure of the nitrogen in a soil.

After the sheep are sheared all the ticks on the flock will find their way in a day or two, on the unshorn lambs.

This is the time the owner of the flock takes to clean them off. It is done very quickly by immersing the lambs, except their heads, in a solution of tobacco stems, made in boiling water and allowed to cool. The lambs are left in about half a minute, so that the wool will be thoroughly saturated down to the skin. If the lambs get any of the liquid in their mouth or nose it will make them sick for a few hours, but without any permanent bad effects.

A PROMISING FUNGICIDE.

Copper Sulphate Solution Compared With Bordeaux Mixture and Other Preparations. It is now about three years since a strong solution of copper sulphate first came into use as a fungicide upon the bare branches of trees before the buds opened, and the results obtained from its application have been so favorable that it is recommended by nearly if not all of the spraying cauders. When used at the rate of from one ounce to fifteen or twenty-five gallons of water it destroys the mycelium of such fungi as winter upon the branches, and prevents the germination of such spores as may come in contact with it; but at this strength it will destroy the foliage, hence it cannot be used later in the season.
