Delegation to Unesco General Conference

The Secretary of State for External Affairs, the Honourable Paul Martin, announced today the composition of the Canadian Delegation to the thirteenth session of the General Conference of the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (Unesco) which will take place at the Organization's Headquarters in Paris from October 20 to November 19, 1964.

The Chairman of the Delegation will be Dr. Henry Hicks, President of Dalhousie University, Halifax, and President of the Canadian National Commission for Unesco. The Vice-Chairman will be Mr. S.F. Rae, Canadian Permanent Representative to the European Office of the United Nations, Geneva. Other members of the Delegation will be:
