# The Amateur Athletic Association of Canada.

GENTLEMEN,

The Committee in presenting you their report of the work done during the Association's year, regret that almost the first business that came before them was the resignation from the Committee of Mr. W. S. Weldon, of Montreal, who was compelled to resign through business reasons. The Committee endeavored to retain Mr. Weldon's services, but unfortunately without success. As Mr. Muntz, one of the Toronto members of the Committee, left for England during the summer season it left only four resident members, and as it is necessary for five to make a quorum, it was recommended that as the Toronto Athletic Club had, we are glad to say, joined our Association, that Mr. Nelson be appointed to fill the vacancy caused by Mr. Weldon's resignation and which was approved of by all the members of the Executive. The date for holding the annual championships this year was changed with the consent of all the clubs forming this Association from the last Saturday in September till to-day, as the former day clashed with the aunual meet of the N. Y. A. C., which promised to send a team to represent them if changed as above. Correspondence was commenced

with the London Athletic Club, in the early part of the season, with the view of getting some of the team coming to this side of the Atlantic to take part in our games, and which, we are glad to say, has proved successful.

The usual number of applications for reinstatement were received and disposed of as follows:

F. E. Barbour, Montreal, reinstated.

J. Y. McKendrick, Toronto, refused.

Chas. R. Fernley, Toronto, refused.

Geo. E. Harper, Wiarton, reinstated.

Chas. Miers, Wiarton, reinstated.

Fred. Bryan, Wiarton, reinstated.

Matthew Boush, Wiarton, reinstated.

It will be seen that no less than five men from Wiarton were reinstated during the year, but the recommendations were so strong including that of the Canadian Lacrosse Association, which body disqualified them, that the Committee felt justified in re-instating them.

Messrs. Geo. Carson and Carlton of the Capital Lacrosse Club, amateur standing was withdrawn for having competed in a foot race against professionals and on their club being notified, the Committee were supplied with affidavits showing that the parties mentioned had used every endeavor to protect themselves by protesting the entries in the race unknown to themselves. The Committee therefore withdraw the suspension placed on them.

The question of Class "B" men of the Canadian Wheelmen's Association belonging to amateur clubs, came up for discussion during the year. It was pointed out that a Class "B," who is none other than a professional as well as belonging to Amateur Clubs, often competed against Class "A" men, who are amateurs without affecting the

status of the latter class, as for instance, in road races, which the C. W. A. do not hold any jurisdiction over. As this matter is open to a great deal of discussion it was thought better to leave it over until this meeting.

Two new records have been added during the year. The one mile on snow shoes record having been reduced by Robert Davis, Lachine S. S. C., on the M. A. A. A. grounds on the 11th February, 1895, to 5 min. 40 secs. The other record was that made by Mr. A. W. Gifford, M.A.A.A., in the 880 yard race, on the 21st September last, at the Fall Games of the M. A. A. A.

HELD IN THE QUEEN'S HOTEL, TORONTO, SATURDAY, OCT. 5th, 1895.

### PRESENT.

Mr. Wm. Stark, President, in the chair.

The Minutes of last meeting were read and confirmed.

The Secretary read the Annual Report of the Executive, which, on motion of Mr. Macdonnell, seconded by Mr. Gardiner, was adopted.

The Treasurer, Mr. Irving, gave a verbal statement of the financial standing of the Association, and hoped to be able to return to Montreal a sum larger than that received, which, on motion of Mr. Martin, seconded by Mr. Freeman, was adopted.

A lengthy discussion took place by the gentlemen present as to what action this Association would take in regard to Class "B" men of the Wheelmen Association. The following resolution was adopted:

The attention of this meeting having been called to Art. IV. of the Constitution of the Amateur Athletic Association of Canada, which declares "that an amateur is one who has never pursued or assisted in the practice of athletic exercise as a means of obtaining a livelihood," and the attention of this meeting having been further called to the fact that the recognition of those known as Class "B" bicycle riders, appears to be a violation of this rule, it is moved by C. H. Nelson, and seconded by Mr. Freeland, that a sub-committee of the Amateur Athletic Association of Canada consisting of Messrs. Inspector Stark, C. H. Nelson, G. M. Higinbotham and W. E. Rundle be appointed to confer with a committee of the Canadian Wheelmen's Association to point out Art. IV. of the Amateur Athletic Association of Canada Constitution and endeavor to take such action as will remove the difficulty. Such sub-committee to report to a Special Meeting of the Executive of the Amateur Athletic Association of Canada to be held in May.

The President then appointed Messrs. Taylor, Storke and Higin-botham a Nominating Committee, and the following were duly elected officers of the Association for the ensuing year:

Moved by Mr. R. Starke, seconded by Mr. Walsh, that a vote of thanks be tendered to the retiring officers.—Carried.

Moved by Mr. Rundle, seconded by Mr. Nelson, that a vote of thanks be tendered to the press for their kindness to this Association during the past year.—Carried.

A vote of thanks was passed to the Queen's Hotel for their kindness in placing a room at the disposal of the Association for holding this meeting.

The meeting then adjourned.


