SECOND DAY'S PROCEEDINGS.

THURSDAY, JULY 2nd.

The Synod met, pursuant to adjournment, at 10 a. m.

His Lordship Bishop Kingdon in the chair.

Prayers.

The roll of the Clergy and Lay Representatives was called by the Secretary, and the attendance marked.

The minutes of the last meeting were read, and on motion approved.

On motion the rules of order were suspended to allow the Treasurer to read the list of parishes which have not paid the assessment to the Contingent Fund of the Synod for this year.

The Treasurer then read the list.

The Secretary read a report of communications received from parishes on the subject of the amalgamation of the Diocesan Synod and the Diocesan Church Society.

Bishop Kingdon made a verbal report from the Committee on Transfer of Church Property in newly constituted parishes and on amendments to the Church Act, asking that the Committee be discharged.

Rev. Canon Brigstocke moved the following resolution of which he had given notice yesterday, seconded by Hon. D. L. Hanington :

APPENDIX A.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON EXPENSES OF
PROVINCIAL SYNOD.

To the RIGHT REVEREND THE LORD BISHOP and the DIOCESAN SYNOD
OF FREDERICTON.

The Committee appointed at the last Session of the Synod "To ascertain the causes of the continually increasing expenses of the Provincial Synod, for a share of which this Diocese is assessed," beg to report.

1st. That Section 10 of the Constitution of Provincial Synod provides that "The expenses of the Synod shall be provided for and its financial concerns managed by a Committee of the Lower House, after a manner to be approved by both Houses."

Your Committee cannot find any record in the Journal of Provincial Synod of 1889 of the appointment of any such Committee as the Constitution requires.

Your Committee therefore submit that it may be open to question whether any of the expenses of that session have been properly incurred.

As to the amount of the expenses, your Committee find that they have increased from \$249 in 1862, to \$1,201 in 1889; or from \$492 in 1877 (the first session after the Dioceses of Nova Scotia and Fredericton became members of the Ecclesiastical Province), to \$1,201, as reported in 1889.

Your Committee desiring to obtain further information on this subject in order to report to the Synod, sent a letter to the Treasurer of Provincial Synod, of which the following is a copy:

Dear Sir,— At the last meeting of our Diocesan Synod the Treasurer stated that he had been called upon to remit \$150 for our share of the Provincial Synod expenses.

After some discussion, a Committee was appointed "To ascertain the cause of the continually increasing expenses of the Provincial Synod, for a share of which this Diocese is assessed, and to report to the next meeting of the Synod."

On behalf of this Committee I shall be much obliged for any information you may be able to give us on the subject.

Reference to the Journals shows that the expenses of Provincial Synod have increased from \$249 in 1862, to \$1,201 in the account submitted in 1889 (page 109 of the report of that year); or from \$492 in 1877, which was the first session after the Dioceses of Nova Scotia and Fredericton joined, to \$1,201, as above.

The expenses of the last session are not yet in print but they must be again considerably increased, as a Diocesan Assessment of \$125 has been sufficient until now that \$150 is required.

As there are eight Dioceses this will be \$200 more.

In addition to any general information you may be able to give me on the subject, can you tell me if any Committee has been appointed to manage the financial affairs of the Synod as provided in Section 10 of the Constitution (page 178, Report 1889), and also in the Rules of Order, Section 3, Sub-section 6, of the same Report.

I do not find any such Committee in the List of Standing Committees.

APPENDIX C.

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE DIOCESAN BOARD OF DOMESTIC AND FOREIGN MISSIONS.

ST. JOHN, N. B., June 29, 1891.

*To the LORD BISHOP OF FREDERICTON, and the MEMBERS OF THE
DIOCESAN SYNOD.*

In submitting a report of the contributions sent in by the various Parishes of the Diocese, in aid of Domestic and Foreign Missions, during the year now closed, your Board has to record with regret the fact that, owing partly doubtless to the depression which has effected the agricultural interests throughout the entire Province, the sums entrusted to your Board have fallen about \$400 below the exceptionally high total of last year.

With fair prospects, however, of a more prosperous season and a full harvest this year, your Board have every reason to hope that, with sustained efforts on all our parts, more satisfactory results will be reported at the next meeting of the Synod.

The total sum received by the Treasurer was \$1,465, against \$1,860 received last year.

For Domestic Missions and evangelistic work within the borders of our own Dominion, including Algoma and the North-west, but outside the organized Dioceses in connection with the Provincial Synod of Canada, the following sums were received: Domestic Missions (Unappropriated), \$220.79; Diocese of Algoma (General), \$155.75; Indian Homes in Algoma and North-west, \$206.63; North-west Missions, \$82.31. Total, \$665.48.

For Foreign Missions: S. P. G., \$260.69; S. P. Christianity among the Jews, \$95.79; Parochial Missions to Jews, \$131.60; Bishop Blyth's

work in Cairo, \$56.78; C. M. Society, \$32.06; Mission in Japan (Rev. J. Cooper Robinson), \$66.94; Zenana Mission, \$6.46; Benson's E. I. Missions, \$100; Bishop Corfe, Corean Missions, \$50 (the latter name appearing in our list for the first time). Total, \$800.32.

There has been a falling off in S. P. G. contributions of \$144; Bishop Blyth's Fund, \$30. On the other hand, the Parochial Mission to Jews Fund has gained \$30; the Missions to Japan, \$13; Society for Promoting Christianity among the Jews, \$22.

[No contributions have been sent in from Chatham, Baie Verte, Burton, Baie du Vin, Bathurst, Canning, Dalhousie, Grand Manan, Gordon and Lorne, Lancaster, Ludlow and Blissfield, New Denmark, Petitcodiac, Simonds, St. George and Pennfield, St. Martins, St. Marys, St. Stephen, Westmoreland.] Rothesay contributed to no less than six funds. The highest contribution from any parish is \$288 from Trinity Church, St. John.

Your Board had again to appropriate a sufficient sum to pay its portion of the Bishop of Algona's Stipend from the Domestic Missions (General) Fund, as only \$5 were in hand, and nothing was paid in during the year for this special purpose.

Thankfulness and hopefulness may well possess the hearts of all members of the Church throughout the Dominion, when they review the advance in the work of Domestic and Foreign Missions which is reported by the Parent Society during the past year.

The hope expressed by your Board at our last meeting has been realized, and the son of a Canadian family, born in Canada, and trained by the Church in Canada, has been sent out as a missionary of the Canadian Church to labour in the Diocese of Japan under Bishop Bickersteth.

Thus the Board of Management are able to say that they have at length entered directly on the Foreign Mission Field, and it will be a matter of devout thankfulness to all of us to feel that Canada's Church is now sharing the burden and privilege of direct evangelistic work among the heathen in the old world.

The total sum contributed for Domestic Missions last year was \$21,000.29; for Foreign Missions \$14,710.96—both sums being considerably above the amounts estimated as likely to be received by the Board for these two funds.

There has been on the whole a steady increase in the annual contributions throughout the nine Dioceses of Canada during the last five years, and a marked increase of \$8,000 for the year closing 31st July last.

In promoting the evangelization of the heathen in foreign lands, the needs of the growing heathen population within our own borders have not been overlooked. The "Chinese invasion" on the Pacific Coast has aroused the interest of Church people throughout the continent,

and a first appropriation of \$500 to help the Bishop of British Columbia to provide a clergyman specially to minister amongst these people has been made by the Board. The sum thus devoted to the conversion of the heathen in our own Dominion is miserably small, but it is hoped that in time a sympathy will be awakened which will be shown in a practical way by special donations for this particular effort.

Your Board recommends that a special effort be made during the year to recall our people to a sense of their duty with regard to the general mission work of the Church, and would recommend the circulation of *The Canadian Church Magazine and Mission News* wherever practicable for adoption as a parish magazine. This publication gives an excellent summary of the general work of the Church at home and abroad, and at Sussex, where it has recently been introduced, it is steadily growing in popular favour. The stress and labour of providing for the needs of our own parishes, and the daily round of care and toil which is the lot of the clergy of this Diocese, may appear to offer some excuse for indifference to the claims of "the stranger and the heathen." There is in this matter, however, no room for personal choice. The duty of preaching the Gospel is laid upon every Church as one test of loyalty and faithfulness to Him who is the Head and Life of his people. A Church that does not evangelize, or help in evangelizing, is already a decaying Church. Above all, let us betake ourselves to prayer. The modern revival in Foreign Church work dates from the first Day of General Intercession on behalf of Missions. That day was the Church's answer to the sneer of the world that Christians no longer believed in the power of their own prayers. And the marvellous results which have followed upon the solemn appeals of that day, since year by year repeated, to the Great Head of the Church—in the founding of new bishoprics, the opening up of Japan, Central Africa, and the Corea to missionary enterprise—was His answer who said: "The harvest truly is plenteous; but the labourers are few: PRAY YE, therefore the Lord of the Harvest that He will send forth labourers into His harvest."

A detailed statement of receipts and expenditures has been furnished by the Treasurer, and now lies upon the table for inspection of members of the Synod.

To the MOST REVEREND THE LORD BISHOP OF FREDERICTON, METROPOLITAN, and the DIOCESAN SYNOD OF FREDERICTON :

The Committee of Synod, appointed at the last meeting to take steps to raise a fund to defray the expenses of the delegates from this Diocese to the Conference at Winnipeg on the consolidation of the Church in British North America, beg to report :

That they were eminently unsuccessful in accomplishing the work committed to them. REPORT OF DELEGATION TO WINNIPEG.

To HIS LORDSHIP THE METROPOLITAN, and the SYNOD OF THE DIOCESE OF FREDERICTON.

Gentlemen—The lay delegate and two substitutes appointed to attend the Conference at Winnipeg on the 15th and 16th of August last being unable to attend, it became my duty, as third substitute, to be present, and I accordingly arrived in Winnipeg in time for the opening session of the Conference.

I beg to report that the Conference was of the opinion that it is desirable to unite and consolidate the various branches of the Church of England in British North America, at the same time retaining the Ecclesiastical Provinces under the General Synod.

A proposed basis of union was agreed upon, which I beg to submit herewith, the pamphlet containing the same containing also full minutes of the proceedings of the Conference.

In regard to finances, I beg to report that I received from the committee, appointed to raise funds for the expenses of the delegates, the sum of \$60, and my expenses were \$105.

APPENDIX I.

REPORT OF THE STANDING COMMITTEE OF THE SYNOD ON SUNDAY SCHOOLS.

*To the RIGHT REV. THE LORD BISHOP, and the DIOCESAN SYNOD OF
FREDERICTON.*

The Standing Committee of the Synod on Sunday Schools respectfully submit the following report:

Soon after their appointment in July last the members of the Committee met together and organized by appointing the Rev. Canon Roberts Chairman, and the Rev. J. H. Talbot, Secretary. Owing to the removal of the Rev. J. H. Talbot from the Diocese, the Rev. O. S. Newnham was afterwards appointed Secretary in his place.

The Standing Committee of last year, in the list of questions sent out to the Parishes, inserted the following: "Would you favour the holding of a Sunday School Convention for the discussion of the Sunday School work of the diocese?" In their report to the Synod they made the following recommendation, based upon the answers received to the above question: "Your Committee would recommend that the Synod take some action towards the holding of a Convention for the Sunday School workers of the Diocese, in order that the whole subject of Sunday School work may be discussed, and effect given to some of the valuable suggestions received from the Parishes." In connection with that recommendation the following resolutions were passed at the meeting of the Synod, as found on page 21 of the Synod Journal of the year 1890: 1st. "That a Committee be appointed to consider the advisability of holding a Sunday School Convention, with power to make arrangements for the same if it be found feasible." 2nd. "That the Committee to which the Rev. Canon Roberts' resolution regarding a Sunday School Convention be referred, be the Standing Committee of the Synod on Sunday Schools."

Your Committee beg to say that at once, after organization, they took steps towards carrying out the directions of the Synod. They first communicated with the Deaneries, asking for the names of persons who would be willing to write papers, or to speak at the proposed Convention. Replies, with the names of such persons, were received from all the Deaneries. Your Committee then decided to hold a Convention of Sunday School workers in St. John, on Tuesday and Wednesday, May 12th and 13th, and arranged a programme for such Convention which programme is appended to this report.

The Reverend Canon Brigstocke kindly offered Trinity Church and School House for the service and meetings, which offer was gladly accepted. A good congregation attended the service in Trinity Church

on Tuesday evening, May 12th, when His Lordship Bishop Kingdon preached an excellent sermon from 2 Kings, iv., 26.

A large number of Teachers attended the meetings in Trinity School Room on Wednesday morning, afternoon and evening, and your Committee feel the Convention was a success. They would here testify to the readiness with which the invitation to write papers, or to speak, was responded to, and also to the thoroughness with which the papers and addresses were prepared, for upon this depended, to a great extent, the success of the Convention, and they are only sorry that they had not the means at hand to publish, at least, the papers, and to circulate them among the Sunday School workers of the Diocese.

Considering the success which attended this first Diocesan Sunday School Conference, your Committee would respectfully suggest that a Sunday School Conference be held from year to year in the various centres of church work in the Diocese; and also, that some steps be taken to organize the Sunday School work of the Diocese by the formation of a Diocesan Sunday School Association.

A good work is already being done by the Deanery Sunday School Unions, and a diocesan organization might be formed from representatives from the Deanery Associations.

While turning their attention to the special work which came before them this year, your Committee have not neglected the requirements of the Canon under which they are appointed, and at the proper time they sent out to the parishes of the Diocese a form for statistical and other information concerning the Sunday Schools. This statistical report will be found appended to this report.

Following is a brief summary:

Returns have been received from 49 parishes. From the following parishes no returns have been received, although the forms were sent out a second time:

Bathurst, Baie des Vents, Restigouche, Bright, Burton, Stanley, Hampton, Salisbury, Trinity, St. Stephen, St. George and Pennfield, Musquash, Petersville, St. Paul, St. John, Canterbury, Prince William, Richmond, Gordon and Lorne.

The total number of Schools reported is 92. Teachers, male, 163; female, 385. Total, 548.

The total number number of Scholars reported is; Male, 1,703; female, 2,376; no sex given, 468. Total, 4,547.

Taking the numbers of previous years in the case of those parishes which have neglected to report, the totals will be as follows; viz.. Schools, 125; Teachers, male, 203; female, 461; no sex given, 33, Total, 697.

Scholars, male, 1,981; female, 2,855; no sex given, 751. Total, 5,587.

By comparing these numbers with the summary given last year it will be seen that there are 6 schools less reported, 23 Teachers more, and 53 Scholars more.

The total amount of Sunday School collections reported is \$1,957.60. Your Committee would again call the attention of the Clergy and Sunday School Superintendents to the importance of supplying the information asked for, for without it the annual report of your Committee loses much of its value.

In conclusion, your Committee feel that in these days of so much carelessness in religious belief, the Church should take special pains to have her children thoroughly grounded in the faith, and, as much of the teaching is given in the Sunday Schools, every means should be taken to make them as effective as possible.

APPENDIX J.

REPORT OF THE GOVERNORS OF KING'S COLLEGE, WINDSOR, N. S.

*To THE MOST REVEREND THE LORD BISHOP, and the MEMBERS OF
THE SYNOD OF THE DIOCESE OF FREDERICTON.*

The Governors of King's College, appointed by the Synod, beg leave to submit the following report:

That the internal working of the College has been most satisfactory to your representatives, the discipline perfect, and the tone admirable, there having been no serious case of discipline during the academical year.

It is not yet possible to state the probable number of matriculants for the academical year 1891-92; but it is already known that upwards of sixty per cent. of the applicants have failed to pass the required examinations, the immediate cause being the determination of the authorities to uphold the reputation of the University for scholarship. The standards have been raised until it is no longer possible to obtain a first class in any examination under seventy-five per cent. This alteration must work disadvantageously to the College from a numerical point of view, until the true value of the change is made apparent.

In common with nearly all educational establishments in these Provinces, King's College continues to be financially straitened; but the authorities have several schemes under consideration for permanently improving its financial position. An important step in this direction was taken by the Associated Alumni on Wednesday, the 24th of June, when they pledged themselves to raise for the future, by subscription, one thousand dollars annually, in addition to their ordinary annual grants.

The matter of admitting women into the University as matriculated students has, since making our last report, been advanced to *this* extent: Women may now matriculate, and may also hold nominations; and, in the event of these privileges being claimed, as seems to be probable, provision has been made, and a separate room assigned for their accommodation between lecture hours.

Your representatives feel constrained to express regret that under existing regulations which permit students in Arts to select any three subjects for Degree after Responsions, it is permissible for students holding Divinity Scholarships to take for their Degree other subjects to the exclusion of Classics; and your representatives have good ground for believing that the Divinity work of those students who do

not take Classics as well *after* as *before* their *Responsions* is comparatively unsatisfactory.

Your representatives have good reason for saying that the next annual report will find the College abreast of the latest modern improvements as regards heating and lighting. This we esteem to be a matter of great moment.

The Collegiate School continues to be more than full, there being about sixty boys in attendance. The discipline of the Academy, and its closer and more profitable relation to the University, are matters that are now under the consideration of the Board of Governors.

Your representatives called the attention of this Synod in their report last year to the fact that initial steps had been taken towards establishing a Church School for Girls. Before the session closed a message was received from the Synod of the Diocese of Nova Scotia to the effect that a scheme had been agreed upon. And in accordance with a notice of motion made at the time of presenting the report, the matter was thereupon brought up in our own Synod, the result being that the scheme was adopted and a trustee appointed by the Synod, who will further report for himself.

Your representatives cannot close this report without expressing what they deem to be a well grounded hope that the night of this ancient University of the Church is already far spent, and that a day of greatly extended usefulness and prosperity is at hand.

APPENDIX K.

REPORT OF THE TRUSTEE FOR THE CHURCH SCHOOL FOR GIRLS AT WINDSOR, N. S.

To THE MOST REVEREND THE METROPOLITAN OF CANADA, and the
SYNOD OF THE DIOCESE OF FREDERICTON.

Your Trustee begs to report that on the 7th of August he attended the first meeting of Trustees at Windsor, N. S., when it was arranged to purchase the property known as "Edgehill," containing about three acres of land, for the sum of \$6,600, to which some five acres have since been added. The house on the property was temporarily fitted up for a school until the new school was built. I attended four other meetings, viz.: On the 12th November, 8th January, 27th May, and 23rd June, ultimo.

Miss Machin, Lady Principal, and four Lady Assistants, were engaged as the Staff. Miss Machin is well known in the Dominion, and she has already given our school a name that has placed it second to none in these Provinces.

The school was formally opened on the 8th January last with forty-two pupils, the extent of the comfortable accommodation. The number has since increased to forty-five, and but for want of accommodation the number would have been very much larger.

The Easter Term ended on the 23rd June, when the School was formally closed. I am happy to be able to state that, after paying all current expenses from the day of opening till the closing on the 23rd ult. (six months), there was a balance in favour of income of over one thousand dollars—a result that is largely referable to the unwearied personal attention of the Secretary, Henry Y. Hind, D. C. L.

The corner stone of the new School was laid on the 23rd ult., by Sir John C. Allen, Chief Justice of New Brunswick. This building, when finished, will increase the accommodation to eighty pupils. It is hoped that the structure will be completed and ready to move into at the beginning of the Michaelmas Term: that is, on Saturday, September 20th, and, from reports received, it will be full on the day of opening. I would, therefore, recommend those who have daughters to send next term to make early application to Henry Y. Hind, D. C. L., Windsor, N. S.

I regret to say that only five (5) persons in Fredericton and twenty-seven (27) in St. John have as yet taken stock in the School. Surely there are more Churchmen and women in those cities that will come to the assistance of the School. \$27,000 have already been subscribed, of which New Brunswick has only taken \$4,215; \$20,000 will be yet required.

Of the amount of stock taken in New Brunswick I canvassed all but \$1,200. I regret that the Church people of this Diocese, after the Synod had approved of the scheme, and had appointed a Trustee, did not strengthen their Trustee's hands by showing that they were in sympathy with the project by taking a fair amount of stock.

I canvassed the following places: Amherst, Sackville, Dorchester, Moncton, Chatham, Newcastle, Bathurst, Dalhousie, Campbellton, Richibucto and St. John, at my own expense. I was asked by the School to canvass St. John, which I did twice, two days each time. The result was most discouraging. I had more refusals in an hour in St. John than I had from Dorchester to the Restigouche, a distance of two hundred miles, and I received more support in Bathurst, a small village, in two or three hours than I received in St. John in three days.

Your Trustee is of the opinion that now is the time for the Church people in these Provinces to support a school which secures a Church education of the highest quality at a cost which has been proved to be

very much lower than what must be incurred by sending their daughters into other and more distant Provinces.

A copy of the Calendar of the School, together with other documents of interest and importance, which gives a large amount of additional information, are attached to this report, from which it will be seen what care and pains are taken to secure the bodily health and comfort, no less than the well-being of the intellectual and religious interests of each individual pupil.

The Junior Branch in this Parish has been working successfully. By a sale in November \$80 were realized. The sum of \$50 was given to the Bishop Coadjutor for Home Missions, and a box of Christmas presents was sent to the family of a clergyman in a country parish.

The Secretary of the Woodstock Branch, Mrs W. F. Dibblee, writes that work has been steadily carried on, and that the receipts from sales of needlework amount to \$240. The Parish Hall is not yet completed, but it is hoped it may be ready for use before winter.

The Secretary of the Women's Aid Association Branch at St. James' Church, Ludlow, has much pleasure in being able to state that at a sale of work held by the members last summer, sufficient funds were raised to insure the Church for three years, to procure matting for the floor, and to purchase material for repainting the outside of the building.

By untiring efforts the Branch at Carroll's Crossing (or Lower Ludlow) have at last succeeded in getting the roof of their Mission House shingled, and also in procuring clapboards for the walls.

The little Branch at the Storey Settlement have held two sales in the house of Joseph Storey. The first realized \$25, and the second \$15. These sums have been handed to the Bishop Coadjutor to be expended on the new Church at Doaktown.

The W. A. A. Branch in Doaktown intend to have a sale during the summer, and hope that through the kind assistance of their many friends the new Church may be rendered fit for service by the first of October.

A branch was formed in Kingsclear during the past year, and have been engaged in active work. They purpose having a sale of work on the 9th of July, the proceeds to go towards putting a new roof on St. Peter's Church.

A Branch of the Association has been organized at Marysville, in the Mission of Rev. J. Parkinson. At a meeting held in February, the Rector presiding, Mrs. Love was elected Vice-President; Mrs. Tapley, Treasurer; Mrs. Brown and Miss Morehouse, Secretaries.

In the Parish of Burton the members of the Association held a sale in July, which realized \$177. In addition to this, a friend in England kindly sent a donation of \$50. The interior of the Parish Church has been painted and the building repaired. The balance due on the organ (\$30) has been paid. The Rectory has been insured for three years, and \$25 has been added to the Parish Endowment.

The St. John Girls' Branch has fifty-eight members. In June, 1890, \$25 was remitted to the Bishop Coadjutor for the maintenance of the work at Ludlow, and in December a similar amount, completing the annual donation for that object. In March, 1891, \$25 was sent to the Bishop Coadjutor, being part of the annual grant to Ludlow for this year. Boxes of suitable articles were sent to Prince William and Storeytown for the Children's Christmas Trees.
