





A copy of the Detroit Times just received tells of the swimming pools in the Clara public bath-house, one of two that are provided in that city. It is named after a former St. John lady, Mrs. Clara Arthur, who was instrumental in having public baths introduced in Detroit. Two pools are provided, one for the men and boys, and one for the women and girls. They are 44 feet long by 17½ feet wide, 5½ feet at the shallowest. Men are taxed five cents, with soap and towels thrown in; women and children one cent, with free towel, and an extra penny for a cake of soap, with shallowest. 





