DON'T WANT THE REAL CRIMINALS

Colorado Officers Refused Evidence to Convict Perpetrators of Vindicator Explosion.

The Denver papers' sensational charges made and sworn to by Major Francis E. Ellison, of the Colorado National Guard, who was in the Vindicator Creek District during the period when the explosion occurred, and the charges that he made, were not taken in the matter, though he asserts that his information was not taken in the matter and conviction of the men responsible for the planting of the infernal machine. Further, he charges that by the special direction of Major T. E. McClelland and General F. M. Boardman, postmaster at Vindicator, United States officials, a series of fights were commenced between men of Vindicator and the soldiers of the National Guard on duty there. He asserts that each fight was planned by either General Boardman or General McClelland and carried out under their actual direction. The instructions were to "knock them down; knock their teeth down their throats; land in their faces; kick in their ribs, and do everything except kill them."

Would Not Commit Perjury.

LABOR PARTY WINS

Workers of Queensland Elect Thirty-Four of Their Candidates for Parliament.

The Labor party in Queensland, Australia, gained a signal victory in the recent elections. Complete returns show that the workingmen's party is by long odds the strongest in that state.

The Laborists had 24 members in the last Legislature; now they have 34 seats. The Laborists dropped to 19 seats. The Laborists to 14 members, and there are also two independent members. Labor is now the power in Queensland, for it is hardly possible that all the parties can be united against the workers, despite the fact that their platform is strongly Socialist.

This is the second Australian state to come under the domination of the Labor party, the West Australian Government being now in control of the workingmen's party.

THE CANADIAN LABOR LEAGUE

Political Movement for the Working Classes Started on a Sound Basis.

After several weeks of consideration, the committee appointed by the District Council have arrived at a satisfactory understanding. It is proposed to give the members of a party that will spread its influence and numbers, and before very long will be a power in politics that will give returns to the workers for the labor expended. The following are the platform and notes, and it is to be hoped that every worker will take the matter up and go in for it:

PREAMBLE

We assure that the working out of our present system of government does not alter to the people of this country an equitable share of the material things of life, and to the end that a better system may be inaugurated, guaranteeing to all equal privileges and opportunities, we call upon all men to join hands under the banner of the Canadian Labor League, formed to bring into force the following progressive reforms in our present system of government:

PLATFORM

1. Public ownership of all natural or permanent and public utilities.
2. The initiative, referendum and power of recall.
3. Abolition of all bonuses to railway and industries.
4. To the people belong the values created by the growth and organization of society, and in the end that they may get their rights in that respect as plebeian as to a legislature.
5. Equal protection to the worker and manufacturer.
6. Abolition of all child labor.
7. Women franchise.
8. Abolition of the appointive Senate.

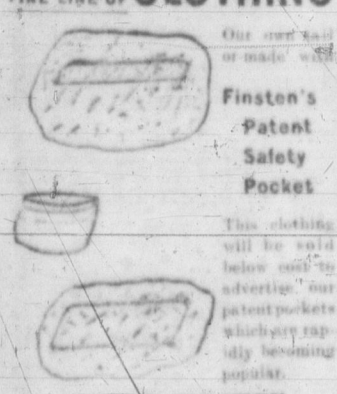

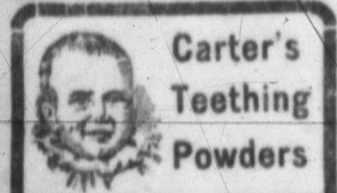
