

David McCrissin said that on the evening of June 15th he refused to hire a horse to Hughes.

James A. Covenay, who is employed in Frank Donnelly's stable, told the court that O'Brien and Hughes had a mare named Kitty from the stable on the night of the fire and returned to the stable about 11.30 o'clock.

Afternoon Session.

"Have the shoes on Kitty, the mare which was used on the Friday night by John Hughes and Joseph O'Brien been changed since the Sunday following the fire at Crawford's," was the most important matter brought out at the trial yesterday afternoon.
