Dr. Sewall, of Washington city, while on visit to the cholera hospitals in the city of New-York, the same season, writes to a friend, that "of 204 cases of cholera in the Park Hospital, there were only six temperate persons, and that those had recovered, while 122 of the others when he wrote, had died, and that the facts were similar in all the other
