Local and Provincial.

Mr C. R. Borden left on Saturday last for Boston.

We understand the closing exercises of the School of Horticulture will take place May 1st.

The spring meeting of the County Council begins on Tuesday next, at the Court-house, Kentville.

Miss Maggie, daughter of Mr D. B. Shaw, brought into our office on Wednesday the first mayflowers of the season.

Messrs Lewis Rice & Co., photographers, have had a new and attractive sign placed in front of their studio this week.

Appropriate Easter services were held in the various churches in town on Sunday. The churches had pretty floral decorations.

The bye-elections on Wednesday resulted in the election of Conservatives in Haldimand and Quebec West, and of Liberals in Antigonish and Vercheres.

At the Liberal Convention held in Kentville on Monday Dr. Borden was again unanimously elected to contest the county at the next election in the interest of that party.

A landslide on Monday morning last undermined the track of the D. A. R. near the Hancock Bridge between Kentville and Port Williams. Traffic was retarded somewhat on Monday and Tuesday.

A very successful missionary concert was held in the vestry of the Methodist church on Tuesday evening last. An interesting programme in the shape of music, readings and recitations was given by the children of the Mission Band.

On Tuesday of this week the case of C. I. Waite vs. Mrs Orr of Port Williams, for violation of the Canada Temperance Act, was tried before Stipendiary Magistrate Dennison at Kentville. J. J. Ritchie, Q. C., appeared for the defendant, and B. H. Armstrong, of this town, acted as counsel for the plaintiff. The case resulted in the conviction of Mrs Orr, and she was fined \$50 and costs.

The following changes in the staff of the Dominion Atlantic railway took effect on Monday: Mr. Theo. N. Begg, to be chief train dispatcher of the Eastern Division, vice Mr. H. N. Bailey. Mr. H. N. Bailey to be general agent at Yarmouth, vice Mr. Wm. Fraser. Mr. Wm. Fraser, besides his duties as manager and treating agent of the Maritime Express Co., will also combine those of traffic inspector of the Dominion Atlantic railway.

The members of "Crystal" Band of Hope, on invitation, paid a visit to Wolfville Division on Monday evening. Although the evening was not a pleasant one over half a hundred of the young people were present. The programme, which was largely furnished by the members of the Band, was a good one, and an enjoyable evening was spent by all. The Band of Hope is an organization that is doing a good work in our town, and the young people should be encouraged.

The installation of officers for St. George's Lodge, No. 20, A. F. & A. M., took place in the Lodge-room on the evening of Friday, April 12th. After partaking of an oyster supper, served in the Lodge-room, and listening to a number of speeches from visiting brethren, the Lodge closed wishing the newly installed officers success in the year's work.
