C A P. XXXV.

An Act to amend and continue several Laws relating to the allowing the Importation of Rape Seed and other Seeds used for extracting Oil, whenever the Prices of Middling *British* Rape Seed shall be above a certain Limit; to the allowing the Importation of Seal Skins cured with Foreign Salt, free of Duty, to the Twenty-fourth Day of *June* One thousand eight hundred and nine, and to the Encouragement of the *Greenland* Whale Fisheries, to the Twenty-fifth Day of *December* One thousand eight hundred and six; and to continue several Laws relating to the allowing the Use of Salt, Duty free, in the preserving of Fish in Bulk or in Barrels; and to the discontinuing the Bounty payable on White Herrings exported, to the Twenty-fifth Day of *March* One thousand eight hundred and nine; to the permitting Sir *William Bishop*, *George Bishop*, and *Argles Bishop*, to carry on the Manufacture of

Maidstone Geneva, to the Fifth Day of *July* One thousand eight hundred and nine; and to the Admission to Entry of Oil and Blubber of *Newfoundland*, taken by His Majesty's Subjects carrying on the Fishery from and residing in the said Island, to the Twenty-fifth Day of *December* One thousand eight hundred and five. [3d *May* 1804.]

WHEREAS the Laws herein-after mentioned have by Experience been found useful and beneficial, and it is expedient that the same should be further continued and amended; be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That an Act, made in the Thirty-fifth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for allowing the Importation of Rape Seed and other Seeds used for extracting Oil, from any Country whatever, whenever the Prices of middling British Rape Seed shall be above a certain Limit*, which was to be in force for One Year, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament; and which was by Two other Acts, made in the Thirty-sixth and Thirty-eighth Years of the Reign of His present Majesty, further continued until the Twenty-fourth Day of *June* One thousand seven hundred and ninety-nine, and by another Act of the Thirty-ninth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, amended and further continued until the Twenty-fourth Day of *June* One thousand eight hundred and four, shall be and the same is hereby further continued until the Twenty-fourth Day of *June* One thousand eight hundred and nine: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall extend to alter or affect the Duties granted by an Act passed in the last Session of Parliament, intituled, *An Act to repeal the Duties of Customs payable in Great Britain, and to grant other Duties in lieu thereof*.

II. And be it further enacted, That an Act made in the Thirty-first Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to allow the Importation of Seal Skins cured with Foreign Salt free of Duty, for a limited Time*, which was to continue in force from the Fourteenth Day of *June* One thousand seven hundred and ninety-one, and until the End of the then next Session of Parliament, and which was by Two other Acts, made in the Thirty-second and Thirty-ninth Years of the Reign of His present Majesty, continued until the Twenty-fourth Day of *June* One thousand eight hundred and four, shall be and the same is hereby further continued until the Twenty-fourth Day of *June* One thousand eight hundred and nine: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall extend to alter or affect the Duties granted by Two Acts passed in the last Session of Parliament, the One intituled, *An Act to repeal the Duties of Customs payable in Great Britain, and to grant other Duties in lieu thereof*; the other, intituled, *An Act for granting to His Majesty, during the present War, and until the Ratification of a Definitive Treaty of Peace, additional Duties on the Importation and Exportation of certain Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, and on the Tonnage of Ships and Vessels in Great Britain*.

And be it further enacted, That an Act, made in the Twenty-sixth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for the further Support and Encouragement of the Fisheries carried on in the Greenland Seas and Davis's Streights*, which was to be in force for Five Years from the Twenty-fifth Day of *December* One thousand seven hundred and eighty-six; and also so much of an Act, made in the Twenty-ninth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for further encouraging and regulating the Newfoundland, Greenland, and Southern Whale Fisheries*, as relates to the Fisheries carried on in the *Greenland Seas and Davis's Streights*; which, by an Act made in the Thirty-second Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, were amended and continued until the Twenty-fifth Day of *December* One thousand seven hundred and ninety-eight, and which were by several subsequent Acts further continued; and by an Act of the Forty-second Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, amended and further continued until the Twenty-fifth Day of *December* One thousand eight hundred and four, shall be and the same is hereby further continued until the Twenty-fifth Day of *December* One thousand eight hundred and six, except so much thereof as relates to allowing Vessels employed in the said Fisheries, to complete the Number of Men at certain Ports.

IV. And whereas the Laws herein-after mentioned have by Experience also been found useful and beneficial, and it is expedient that the same should be further continued; be it further enacted, That so much of an Act, made in the Forty-first Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for allowing until the Fifteenth Day of October One thousand eight hundred and one, the Use of Salt Duty free, in the preserving of Fish in Bulk or in Barrels; for protecting Persons engaged in such Fisheries from being impressed into His Majesty's Service; for discontinuing the Bounty payable on White Herrings exported, and for allowing a Bounty on Pilchards now cured, whether exported or sold for Home Consumption*, as relates to allowing the Use of Salt Duty free, in the preserving of Fish in Bulk or in Barrels, and to discontinuing the Bounty payable on White Herrings exported, which was continued by Two Acts of the Forty-second and Forty-third Years of the Reign of His present Majesty, until the Twenty-fifth Day of *March* One thousand eight hundred and four, shall, from and after the said Twenty-fifth Day of *March* One thousand eight hundred and four, be, and the same is hereby further continued until the Twenty-fifth Day of *March* One thousand eight hundred and nine.

V. And be it further enacted, That an Act, made in the Thirty-ninth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to continue and amend so much of an Act, made in the Thirty-third Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, as permits Sir William Bishop, George Bishop, and Argles Bishop, to carry on the Manufacture of Maidstone Geneva*; which said Act was to commence and take Effect from and immediately after the Fifth Day of *July* One thousand seven hundred and ninety-nine, and continue in force for the Space of Five Years to be computed from that Day, shall be and the same is hereby further continued until the Fifth Day of *July* One thousand eight hundred and nine.

payable in Great Britain, and to grant other Duties in lieu thereof, as relates to the Admission to Entry of Oil or Blubber of Fish, or Creatures living in the Seas, actually caught and taken on the Banks and Shores of the Island of Newfoundland and Parts adjacent, wholly by His Majesty's Subjects carrying on the said Fishery from the said Island and residing therein, on Payment of the Duty by the said Act imposed on Train Oil or Blubber of Newfoundland of British Fishing, which was to continue in force until the Twenty-fifth Day of December One thousand eight hundred and four, shall be and the same is hereby further continued until the Twenty-fifth Day of December One thousand eight hundred and five.
