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
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
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
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TO BE USED

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The Order for Morning Prayer.

I The Service shall be the same with the usual Office for Holy-Days, except where it is in this Office otherwise appointed.

I Let him that ministereth read with a loud voice these Sentences of Scripture; and after them the Exhortation, Dearly beloved Brethren, &c.

O the Lord our God belong mercies and forgiveneffes, though we have rebelled against him : neither have we obeyed the voice of the Lord our God, to walk in his laws, which he fet before us.

In my trouble I will call upon the Lord, and complain Psalm unto my God. So fhall he hear my voice out of his holy temple; my complaint shall come before him.

I Inflead of the Venite, this Hymn shall be used.

NTO Thee, O Lord, will I lift up my foul; my God, Psalm I have put my truft in Thee: O let me not be confounded, neither let mine Enemies triumph over me.

Wherefore should the Heathen say, where is now their God? Pralm The Lord is King, be the Earth never fo unquiet; the Psalm

Lord is great in Sion, and high above all People. I shall find trouble and heavines, and I will call upon the

name of the Lord.

O Almighty God, who ruleft over all the Nations of the Earth, and on whofe gracious Providence they depend evermore for prefervation and profperity; extend, we befeech Thee, thine accuftomed goodnels to the people of this Kingdom; who, looking up to Thee, as the author of all Bleffings, and their fure Safeguard and mighty Deliverer in all dangers and difficulties, do now implore Thy watchful care and protection. Vouchfafe to guide us continually with Thy counfel, to firengthen us with Thy powerful arm, and to crown with fuccefs our neceffary endeavours againft the unjuft attempts of our Enemies, through our Lord and Saviour JESUS CHRIST. Amen.

O LORD God of our Salvation, in whofe hands are the iffues of Life and Death, hearken, we befeech Thee, to the prayers of Thy Servants, who call upon Thee in this time of Trouble. Have Mercy, we befeech Thee, upon Thy Servant, our Sovereign; make the Light of Thy Countenance to fhine upon him; and grant that He may long continue a nurfing Father to Thy Church, and Thy Minifter for Good to all his Subjects; and that in the prefent Crifis, he may be Thy bleffed Inftrument of reftoring Peace to the diffracted World. And when Thou haft lengthened his days on Earth, in the enjoyment both of Domeffic Happineis and of Public Peace and Profperity, crown him, O Lord, with everlaiting Glory in the life to come, through JESUS CHRIST our Lord and Saviour. Amen.

I Then fhall follow the Second and Third Collects at Mornning Prayer and the Litany, and then the following Prayer.

LORD, our Heavenly Father, we acknowledge, with penitent hearts, that we have been bleffed, beyond other other nations, in the knowledge and undifturbed Profefion of Thy Truth, and in the long Poffeffion of abundant temporal Profperity: and we confefs, that, like the Ifraelites of old, we have too often turned our backs on Thee, and fought our Peace and Security in our own Inventions. Reftore us, O Lord, to a dutiful fenfe of Thee in this Time of our Vifitation. Grant us Grace to put away all Ungodlinefs and finful Lufts, and fo to hold faft the Profeffion of our Faith in purity of heart and mind, that thy Judgments may be withdrawn from us, and we may become diftinguifhed Objects of Thy Mercy, through the Merits of JESUS CHRIST, our Mediator and Advocate.

I Then the People shall say this that followeth, after the Minister.

T URN Thou us, O good Lord, and fo fhall we be turned. Be favorable, O Lord, Be favorable to Thy People, who turn to Thee in weeping, fafting, and praying. For Thou art a Merciful God, full of compafilon, long fuffering, and of great pity. Thou ipareft, when we deferve punifhment; and, in Thy wrath, Thou thinkeft upon Mercy. Spare Thy People, good Lord, fpare them, and let not Thine heritage be bronght to confufion. Hear us, O Lord, for Thy Mercy is great, and after the multitude of Thy Mercies look upon us, through the merits and mediation of Thy bleffed Son JESUS CHRIST OUR Lord. Amen.

Inflead of the Prayer in time of War and Tumults, let the following be used.

O ALMIGHTY God, Maker of the Univerfe, and fovereign difpofer of the Affairs of Men, at whofe command Nations and Empires rife and fall, flourifh and decay; We thine unworthy fervants moft humbly implore Thy gracious aid and protection. We flee unto Thee for fuccour, in this time of Peril and Neceffity, when, in defence of our Liberty, our Laws and our Religion, we are exposed to the dangers and calamities of War, and threatened with invafion by a fierce and haughty foe, who would fwallow us up quick, fo wrathfully is he difpleafed.

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at us : for that we along among the Nations are found to withstand his violent and unjust Ambition. Vouchfafe, we befeech Thee, thine efpecial Bleffing and Protection to our most gracious Sovereign Lord, King George. Go forth with his fleets and armics ; and let thy mighty arm be with his Chiefs and Captains, as it was of old with thy fervants, * Judas, + Jonathan, and + Simon, when they valiantly withflood the wicked Tyrants of their times, the enemies of Thy Truth, and the oppreffors of Thy People. Direct his Counfels, profper all his meafures for the Welfare of his Kingdom, and the prefervation of our Church, and of our Conflitution. And let no internal Divisions, nor any other Sins and Provocations of this Nation, obfiruct his Defigns for the Public Good, nor bring down Thy Judgments upon us. But fpare Thy People, O Lord, fpare them ; and, by Thy Grace, fo unite us in a Spirit of Obedience to Thy Law, Zeal for Thy Truth, and Loyalty to Thine anointed Servant, whom Thy good Providence has fet over us, that we may evermore rejoice in Thy Salvation, through Thy Son Jesus CHRIST our Lord. Amen.

W E humbly befeech Thee moft Merciful God, that, by Thy Grace, Thou wouldft keep alive in us, who have this day prefumed to implore fuch great Bleffings at Thy hands, a conftant fenfe of Thy prefence, and of our dependence upon Thee. Suffer us not to return to our former finfulnefs and difobedience, nor again to yield to thofe evil paffions and defires, which have brought down Thy juft Judgments upon us : But fave us, O God, fave us, not only from our worldly, but alfo from our fpiritual enemies ; and moft efpecially fave us from ourfelves, for the fake of JESUS CHRIST our Lord. Amen.

I Then the Prayer for the High Court of Parliament, and the General Thanksgiving.

Then read to the end of Morning Prayer as usual.

I After the Prayer for the King [Almighty God, whofe Kingdom is everlafting] fhall be read the two Collects of the Day, as in the Morning Prayer, [O Almighty God who ruleft, &c. and O Lord God of our Salvation,] and then (hall follow.

ND unto the Angel of the Church of the Laodiceans. write; Thefe things faith the Amen, the faithful and true witnefs, the beginning of the creation of God ; I know thy works, that thou art neither cold nor hot : I would thou wert cold or hot. So then becaufe thou art lukewarm, and neither cold nor hot, I will fpue thee out of my mouth. Becaufe thou fayeft, I am rich, and increafed with goods, and have need of nothing; and knoweft not that thou art wretched, and miferable, and poor, and blind, and naked : I counfel thee to buy of me gold tried in the fire, that thou mayeft be rich; and white raiment that thou mayeft be clothed, and that the fhame of thy nakedness do not appear; and anoint thine eyes with eye-falve, that thou mayeft fee. As many as I love, I rebuke and chaften : be zealous therefore, and repent.

The Gospel. St. Luke, Chap. XIII. Ver. 1, to 6.

THERE were prefent at that feafon fome that told him of the Galileans, whole blood Pilate had mingled with their facrifices. And Jefus anfwering faid unto them, Suppofe ye that these Galileans were finners above all the Galileans, because they fuffered these things? I tell you, Nay : but, except ye repent, ye shall all likewise perish. Or those eighteen, upon whom the tower in Siloam fell, and flew them, think ye that they were finners above all men that dwelt in Jerusalem? After the Prayer [for the whole flate of Christ's Church] the following fhall be used.

A Prayer for our Enemies, and for support under Persecution.

LMIGHTY God, who has disposed the heart of our PRESIDENT to unite us this day in Prayer and Supplication for the pardon of our Sins ; Thou haft commanded us to love our Enemies, and to pray for them. that perfecute us. Vouchfafe to accept now our Prayers, for the Repentance and Conversion of men, who have caft off their Faith in Thee; and, following the vain imaginations of reprobate Minds, have plunged themfelves into Crimes and Impieties, which aftonish the Nations of the Earth. Open their eyes, O Lord, that they may fee and confider, with deteftation and horro; the ranges of their cruelty. Strike them, in Thy Mercy, with remorfe and compunction before they all up the measure of their Iniquities; and grant, O God, unto us, Thy Servants, Grace, whilft we behold with Compassion the miseries they have inflicted upon the objects of their fury, to recollect the many Calamities from which We, by Thy merwiful Providence, have been hitherto exempted. Continue to us, We befeech Thee, O Lord, Thy merciful protection, and thield us from the arms of the deftroyer .---And in all feafons, whether of fuccefs or adverfity, profperity or tribulation, give us hearts to be truly thankful for Thy Goodness, fearful of Thy Displeasure, and fensible of Thy Prefence; that, at all times putting our whole truft and confidence in Thee, we may fo pais through things Temporal, that we finally lofe not the things Eter-And to an thofe, who may be ordained to fuffer for nal. Thy fake, impart, O merciful Lord, fuch plentiful Succours of Thy Holy Spirit; pour into their Souls fuch Contempt of Pain and Death; kindle in their Hearts fuch Love of Thee, and Zeal for Thy Truth ; fill them with fuch animating Hope of Immortality, that, after the Example of the bleffed Saints and Martyrs of the primitive Ages, they may fo stedfastly confess Thee before men,

men, that, having glorified Thy Name by their Sufferings upon Earth, they may obtain of Thee an everlafting Crown of Glory. And, grant to us all, fuch a denial of Ungodlinefs and worldly Affections, that we may be able to look forward with hope to the Confummation of all Things, and to the glorious appearance of the Great God and our Saviour JESUS CHRIST ; to whom with Thee, O Father, and Thee, O Holy Ghoft, be honour and glory, world without end. Amen.

LMIGHTY God, who haft promifed to hear the petitions of them that alk in Thy Son's Name ; We befeech Thee mercifully to incline Thine ears to us that have made now our Prayers and Supplications unto Thee ; and grant, that those things which we have faithfully asked, according to Thy will, may effectually be obtained, to the relief of our neceffity, and to the fetting forth of Thy glory, through JESUS CHRIST our Lord. I Then the Prieft (or Bishop, if he be present) Shall les them depart with this Bleffing.
