policy on the subject, but for having, in the first place, commended us for not having done so, and in the second place, for not having done so, for not having done so, for at least not having attempted to do so himself.

It is about time that this foolish and farcical way of doing business should end. Last year our farmers and merchants were out to much annoyance and labor by the enforcement of a similar order.

Instead of trains being curtailed at this time of year, when the products of both land and sea are moving in large quantities, the number should be increased.

If the powers that be considered that the Railway should be operated for the public good—and we always imagined railways were constructed for just such a purpose—it would carry out this latter course.

If the change is made on the score of economy there are other far more practicable ways of affecting a saving.

We trust the protests that have been made will prevent the change from taking effect on the 2nd prox. If they do not, the people are justified in adopting such a course as will cause a cessation of the annoyance.

It is high time that such a nonsensical and unbusinesslike method of doing things were numbered among the antiquities.

Among the industries which do not appear to be affected by the depression is the ironing of the line, are lynching, train robbing and train wrecking.

The wobbling state of things there seems to have considerably increased their health and vigor.

Those who deal solely in the vernacular have added another to their already long list of quaint expressions.
