SOFT MILK COOKIES.—Two cups of sugar, one cup of butter, one cup of sour milk, five cups of flour, one teaspoonful of soda, spice or flavoring to the taste. Roll out, cut in shape, and bake.

BROWN BREAD.—One pint of Indian meal, one pint of rye meal, one-half cup of molasses, one teaspoonful of soda, one-half teaspoonful of salt, one and one-half pints of cold water. Mix and steam three hours, and bake one-half hour.

SPONGE CAKE.—Beat three eggs and one cup of powdered white sugar well together. Sift into one heaping cup of flour one teaspoonful of cream-tarar, and one-half teaspoonful of soda. Sift the second time, and add to the sugar and eggs; lastly, stir in a tablespoonful of hot water, and one half teaspoonful of flavoring.

LEMON JELLY CAKE.—Two large eggs, well beaten, one-third cup of melted butter, one cup of sugar, one-half cup of sweet milk, one and one-half cups of flour, a little salt, and two teaspoonfuls of baking powder, or one teaspoonful of soda. Bake in jilly cake tins.

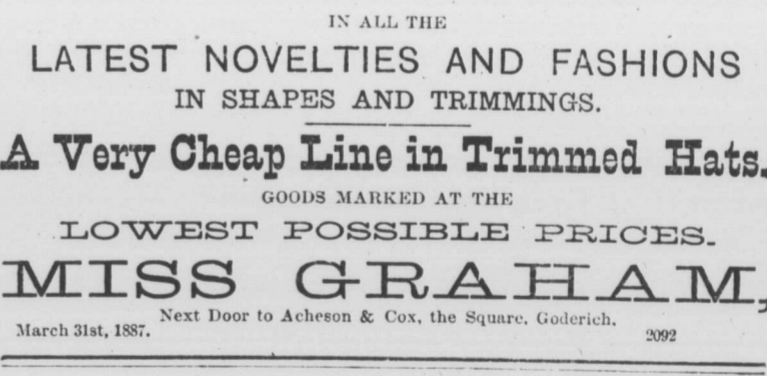

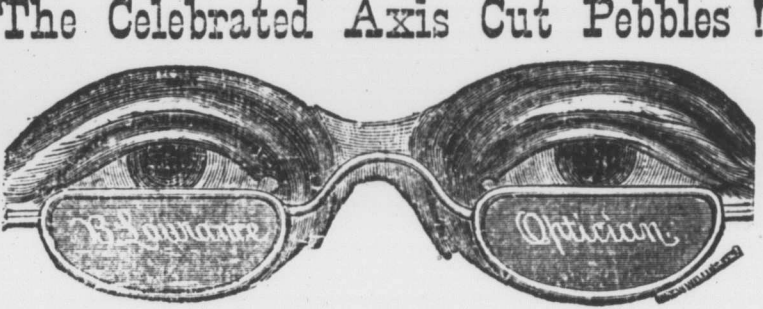

Household Hints.

To beat the white of eggs quickly add a pinch of salt. A ladder hair brush is the best for dusting fine china. Vinegar in the rinsing water for pink or green caresses will brighten them; soda answers the same end for both purple and blue. Old cotton flannel is the best cloth for wiping gilt or bronze picture frames. A small quantity of sal't of tartar dissolved in water is good solution for cleaning frames. One may utilize old matting which is no longer fresh enough to look well by putting it under carpets. It can be cleaned perfectly by washing it on both sides with hot salt and water; hang it on a line outdoors to dry. Grate the yellow rind of one lemon; add the juice, one tablespoonful of water, one half cup of sugar, one egg, and a lump of butter the size of a walnut. Let it boil two minutes. Rush—Three cups new milk, one cup of sugar, one half cup of yeast. Make a stiff batter at night, and let it rise until morning, then add one-half cup of currants, and flour sufficient to roll out. A little cinnamon may be added, if liked. Cut out like biscuit, and let rise very light before baking.

FOR THE GIRLS.

Gratulations Advance Tendered Them by a Male Adviser. Plain and fancy leather belts promise to be quite as popular for wear with light summer dresses this season at least. They will be worn somewhat narrower than the immense broad bands of leather worn last summer, which made a girls form look all out of proportion, and the distance from her neck to her waist about six inches. Buckles of leather will be looked upon with scorn by the advanced young lady, who will recognize nothing in belts that has not a silver buckle. Silver is the metal, and as her glove buttoner, perfume case, chataleine purse, and the dozen and one articles which she suspends from her belt are of silver, the buckle on the same must harmonize as a matter of finished taste. Very broad ribbon sashes will be worn extensively with dresses of every material. To be extensively stylish the ribbon must be extraordinarily wide, an entire width of silk being looked upon as only "a pretty fair width." "Moire" ribbon is the most fashionable; the sash is made separately from the belt, the latter being made of a narrower width of ribbon, to go around the waist, and the large sash is pinned to it at the back. A large quantity of pins is required to do the fastening, to insure its security, or the embarrassing predicament of losing one's sash at the most inopportune time will be the result. Large pins with fanciful heads, designed especially for fastening a sash securely to the belt, are seen, but being somewhat larger than an ordinary every-day pin, they are death to the ribbon.
