In January, twenty-five men lost their lives on the Grand Trunk Railway, by a collision; and one hundred mortals perished in Vineyard Sound, by the wreck of the unfortunate and ill-managed steamer City of Columbia...

In February, the terrible flood on the Ohio river occurred, causing immense destruction of property, and the loss of a number of lives; thirty-five men were drowned in Vineyard Sound, by the wreck of the unfortunate and ill-managed steamer City of Columbia...

In March, a mine explosion in Virginia sent one hundred and fifty-four persons into eternity; the Cincinnati "three days" riot that arose from the dissatisfaction of the people with the verdict of a military tribunal...

In April, the steamer Daniel Steinhilber was wrecked on Sable Island, and one hundred and twenty lives were lost; the steamer ...

In May, France and China made a treaty of peace; and in the present state of inquiry in regard to what will be the probable action of the present party in the U. S., in reference to tariff reform, it may not be uninteresting to state, that on the 6th of this month the Morrison tariff bill which was specifically to reduce all duties twenty per cent, was defeated in Congress by a vote of 159 to 155...

In June, an attack was made on the French troops by Chinese, at Langson, in violation of the treaty, and provoked a demand from France for a heavy war indemnity...

In July, the cholera made its appearance in Toulon and Marseilles, in France; the first news of the rescue of Lieut. Greely, of the Arctic Expedition, was received; Henry M. Stanley, the African explorer, reached England...

After completing the work of establishing satisfactory trading stations along the Congo river from the mouth of Stanley Pool, a distance of 1400 miles by river. Flow different points, results gained by Greely's expedition with Stanley—one is a record, and the other a pathway of civilization...

In August, the French flag was hoisted over the citadel at Han, the capital of Annam; and on the 23rd inst. the city of Chov was bombarded. The bombardment of sixteen workmen suffocated in an underground canal in France...

In September, the most terrible events were the Iceland hurricanes, which wrecked a large number of vessels, and caused a serious loss of life; the wreck of the British gunboat Vesp of the coast of Ireland, when fifty-two persons were drowned, including all on board...

In October, the burning of the royal palace at Copenhagen on the 14th inst.—the hurricane at Catania, on the 8th and 12th—a fire damp explosion at the mines at Ostram, Moravia, on the 15th inst.—the wreck of the British steamer Etchicoch, and the explosion of a steam boiler in the mines near Union, Penn., on the 26th inst., caused a loss of life of one hundred and eighty persons...

In November, one of the most notable events was the presidential election in the United States; the overthrow of the Republican party and the re-election of the Democrat, after an absence of the seat of power since the expiration of James Buchanan's term of office...

ESTIMATED LOSS, \$2,000.

On Saturday, 27th inst., at about 10 o'clock p. m., the quiet village of Lawrence town was suddenly alarmed by the cry of fire. On responding to the alarm, it was found to be no false alarm, as smoke was seen issuing freely from the belfry and south-west corner of the Methodist church...

A crowd soon gathered, and earnest efforts were made to subdue the fire, but owing to its headway within the narrow partitions of the building, the flames were not checked. It was not until about 11 o'clock that the fire was extinguished. As soon as it was ascertained that the church must burn, all available means were employed to save the contents of the building...

The loss is estimated at \$2,000. The church was a fine building, and its destruction is a serious loss to the community. The cause of the fire is not yet ascertained, but it is believed to have been caused by a candle or lamp that had been left burning in the church.

BONES AS FERTILISERS.—Henry Stewart sets forth the value of bones as a fertilizer in a very plain manner. They consist, when fresh, of 65 1/2 per cent of mineral matter of which 55 per cent, of the bone, is phosphate of lime, 3 1/2 per cent of organic matter, chiefly gelatine and fat, and five per cent of water. The organic contains 2 1/2 per cent of nitrogen; the mineral matter contains from 20 to 25 1/2 per cent of phosphoric acid, and 30 to 35 per cent of lime. The phosphoric acid and the nitrogen are the valuable elements, the former being worth, at six cents a pound, \$1.50, and the latter, at 25 cents a pound, 87 cents; 100 pounds of bone, then, in a condition to be available would be worth \$2.37. But bones when whole are only slowly soluble in the soil. In most soils they will decay and wholly disappear only in many years that it is necessary to reduce them to a fine state of division to render them useful. This is done by grinding them to powder or by burning them to ashes. The latter method is the cheaper, but the nitrogen is lost, and if any bones can be reduced to powder for less than the value of the nitrogen, the more costly method is the better. But in many cases it is impossible to grind them to a fine state of division, and the burning method is the only practicable method. This leaves the phosphate of lime in the finest possible condition to be available for plant food as in the raw bones or more so, because it is not held in an undecomposable condition by the gelatine.

Live Stock Notes.—We have seen farmers throw a fork of manure into each fence corner, and more on top of the manure pile, only to be half-trampled under their feet. The same manure wonder why they have not 'got farther' than the fence corner, and why their crops do not rack, lacks an important convenience. Remember that we can make hay in winter as well as in summer, by saving it always avoid the changes in feeding. One advantage of good manure is, that it helps to avoid sudden changes from pasture to dry feed. We do not believe in blanketing horses in the stable. It is advisable to throw the blankets when the team comes in warm after a drive, but only for an hour or two. Have the stables swept out to keep the horses comfortable and clean. When they are out of the stable, they will stand the water when out of doors. In the winter, sweep out the stables early in the morning, and clean the stalls with a good brush.
