Addresses were then given by Miss Tilley, Mrs. McMurray and Mr. Kenrick, and the meeting wound up with music and refreshments.

SECRETARY'S REPORT, 1905-'06.

There are 79 members of this branch, 28 of whom attend the weekly meetings, with an average attendance of 17. Twenty-three meetings have been held. Two bales have been sent out this year to the Gordon Indian Schools, Ou'Appelle, containing complete outfits for four boys, etc., and a box of Christmas gifts was sent to the Rev. E. Soward, of Kinmount, Ont. Our annual pledges amount to \$134.00, distributed as follows: Diocesan Missions, \$75.00; Blackfoot Home, \$30.00; Temiscamingue Mission, \$25.00; Central Rooms, \$4.00. Seven members contribute to the G.C.D. fund, \$22.69 being received from them during the year, and forwarded each month to the Diocesan Treasurer. Self-denial week was observed in Advent and the offerings forwarded to Mrs. Webster.

In November the Branch sustained a great loss through the death of the late Mrs. Wyatt, who for six years had been its President. Mrs. McMurray was unanimously elected to the vacant office, her place as treasurer being filled by Mrs. Macbeth.

On 5th March Mrs. McMurray was presented with a Life Membership in the W. A. by her many friends in St. George's W. A. and outside it.

The President and officers wish to thank the members and friends who have contributed money, materials, time and varied donations to the work of this branch, and trust in the future fresh efforts will be made to discharge our responsibilities.
