<i>NOTE.—In order to understand why this charge is made, it must be first known that certain Fees on all Public Instruments by which the Seal of the Province was affixed, for and prior to 1812, part of the emoluments of the person administering the Government of this Province; that in 1812 an allowance of £1000 Sterling per annum, to be in lieu of all Fees was granted by His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, since when such fees on Public Instruments, Land Patents & Leases have been paid to the Receiver General and by him credited to the Government; & as respects his honor & other similar charges in this account, an account is each half year, prepared by the Secretary of the Province of certain fees for the amount of which a warrant is issued in the name of the Receiver General who charges the sum as if actually paid, & in the same time gives credit to the Government for a like sum, & the fees on Land Patents & Leases are received & paid to by Samuel Ridout, Esquire, as Agent & appear credited to the Government at stated periods in this account.</i>
