

### An Act to incorporate the Diocesan Church Society of New Brunswick.

Passed 14th April, 1853.

WHEREAS it has been represented to the Legislature of this Province, that certain persons hereinafter named, and divers others inhabitants of New Brunswick, Members of the Church of England, have associated themselves together as a Society under the following Constitution, Bye Laws, Rules and Regulations, that is to say:—

'1st. The Society shall be called the Diocesan Church Society of New Brunswick: 2d. No Constitution, Bye Law, 'Rule or Regulation of the Society, or any abrogation, re-' peal, change or alteration of the same, shall be of any force until it shall have been sanctioned and confirmed by the 'Bishop of and administering the Diocese for the time being, ' by writing under his hand: 3d. The payment at any one ' time of a sum not less than ten pounds shall constitute a life 'Member; and the payment annually of any sum however 'small, shall constitute the person paying the same a Member of the Society: 4th. The Society shall have a President, ' who shall be the bord Bishop of the Diocese; two or more 'Vice Presidents, of whom the Archdeacon shall be the first; one or more Treasurers; one or more Secretaries; two 'Auditors of Accounts; and an Executive Committee of ' twenty-four Lay Members of the Society, being life Members ' thereof, or subscribers of at least one pound to the Funds of ' the Society, who, with the exception of the President and 'Vice Presidents shall be annually elected at the Anniversary ' Meeting: 5th. The officers of the Society and the Clergy of ' the Diocese, shall be ex officio Members of the Committee; ' five to be a quorum, and three of the five Laymen: 6th. The 'Society shall embrace the following objects, and none other, viz.:-

'1. Missionary visits to places where there is no settled Clergyman, and aid to new and poor Missions:

'2. The establishment of Divinity Scholarships at King's College, Fredericton; and assistance where necessary to those who may be under preparation for the Ministry, especially sons of Clergymen;

'3. Aid to Sunday and other Schools in which Church principles are taught; and the training and encouraging of Schoolmasters and Catechists;

'4. The supply of Books and Tracts in strict conformity with the principles of the Established Church of England;

'5. Aid to the building and enlarging of Churches and Chapels;

6. Aid to the building of Parsonage Houses;

'7. The creation of a Fund towards the augmentation of the stipends of Clergymen who are poor; and towards the education of the children of such Clergymen; and towards the making a provision for those who may be incapacitated by age or infirmity;

8. The creation of a Fund for the Widows and Orphans

of the Clergy:

'7th. The Society will employ no Clergyman on Missionary ' services without the Bishop's license and appointment, and ' will submit its choice of Divinity Scholarships to his Lord-'ship's approbation: 8th. The Society will circulate no ' Books which are not in the Catalogue of the Society for ' Promoting Christian Knowledge, except such as the Bishop 'shall approve: 9th. It shall be competent to any Member ' of the Society to limit his subscription to any one or more ' of the objects above recited, which he may be most anxious to promote: 10th. The Members of the Society in each 'Mission or in each Parish of each Mission, at the discretion of the Missionary, shall constitute a local Committee: '11th. It shall be competent to each Committee to recommend 'any of the above recited objects to the special consideration ' of the General Committee, in the appropriation of the funds of the Society: 12th. The Society shall hold its Anniversary ' Meeting at Fredericton and Saint John alternately; at the 'latter place on the Thursday after the third Tuesday in January, and at the former place on the Thursday after the ' second Tuesday in February, in each year: 13th. The Com-'mittee of each Parish or Mission shall hold an annual ' meeting, on some convenient day, previous to the Anniversary 'Meeting, when the recommendation to the General Com-' mittee of special objects shall be determined on: 14th. Each 'local Committee shall be empowered to depute two Lay ' Members of the Society to be elected at the annual meeting ' of the Committee, to assist the Missionary in submitting the 'recommendations of the Committee to the consideration of 'the General Committee: 15th. For this purpose the Mis-' sionaries and Lay Deputies shall meet in General Committee on the two days or more if need be, previous to the An-' niversary Meeting, to make the annual appropriation of the 'Funds of the Society: 16th. The Executive Committee 'shall meet either at Fredericton or Saint John on the first Wednesday in January, on the day after the annual meeting,

on the first Wednesday in March, on the first Wednesday in June, and on the Wednesday after the first Tuesday in October: 17th. The Clergy are requested to preach annually two Sermons in their respective Churches, with a collection on each occasion for the general purposes of the Society: 18th. No article of the Constitution of this Society shall be rescinded, altered or amended, except with the concurrence of two thirds of the Members present at a General Meeting; and notice of any motion shall be given at the General Meeting previous to the one at which said motion is to be made:

'And whereas the said persons have contributed, or engaged to contribute considerable sums of money for the objects therein recited: And whereas it is considered necessary for the safety of the property of the Society, and would tend greatly to facilitate and promote the purposes of the said Society, that it should be incorporated;'

Be it therefore enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council and Assembly, as follows:—

1. The Right Reverend the Lord Bishop of Fredericton, the Venerable and Reverend George Coster, the Honorable Neville Parker, the Honorable Robert Parker, the Honorable George Frederick Street, the Honorable William Black, the Honorable William Crane, the Honorable John R. Partelow, the Honorable John Ambrose Street, the Honorable Robert Duncan Wilmot, the Honorable Edward B. Chandler, the Honorable Robert L. Hazen, the Honorable William F. W. Owen, the Honorable John S. Saunders, the Honorable A. Edwin Botsford, the Honorable Thomas H. Peters, the Honorable Charles Simonds, and Frederick A. Wiggins, Esquire, and such other persons as are now Members of the said Society according to the Constitution, Bye Laws, Rules and Regulations thereof, and such other persons as shall from time to time hereafter become Members of the Society, shall be and are hereby declared to be a Body Corporate and Politic in name and in deed by the name of The Diocesan Church Society of New Brunswick, and by the said name the said Society shall have all the general powers and privileges made incident to a Corporation by Act of Assembly in this Province.

2. The Constitution, Bye Laws, Rules and Regulations hereinbefore recited, shall and the same are hereby declared to be the Constitution, Bye Laws, Rules and Regulations of the said Corporation, and shall and may from time to time, as occasion may require, be rescinded, abrogated, repealed, al-

tered, extended or amended in the manner therein and thereby directed; provided the same be not repugnant to the Laws

and Statutes of the Province.

3. The property, both real and personal, moneys, funds, securities and assets of every description of the said Society, whether in possession, remainder, reversion or expectancy, shall from and after the passing of this Act be and the same are hereby declared to be absolutely vested in the said Corporation by the name aforesaid, for the like objects and purposes, and no other, for which the same were held by the said Society, and by the said Corporation shall be appropriated and applied in like manner as the same were required to be appropriated and applied by the said Society; and shall and may from time to time be sued for and recovered by all lawful ways and means to and for the uses aforesaid; and all the liabilities of the said Society, both in law and equity, shall in like manner, from and after the passing of this Act, devolve upon the said Corporation by the name aforesaid, to the same extent as the said Society would have been held liable for, had this Act not been passed.

4. This Act shall not take effect unless and until it is accepted by a majority of Members present at any Meeting of the Society to be called for that purpose at Fredericton, by the Lord Bishop of the Diocese, after two months notice to be given by advertisement in the Royal Gazette, and unless it receive the sanction of the Lord Bishop, to be given at or

before such Meeting.

At a Special General Meeting, held at Fredericton, on the 23d day of June, 1853, the sanction of the Lord Bishop of Fredericton was given to the above Act of Incorporation, which was likewise, at the same time, unanimously accepted by the Society.

While, therefore, we are bound to give humble and hearty thanks for the many blessings vouchsafed to the Society since our last Anniversary, we should also be unfeignedly thankful for having been suffered to co-operate in this blessed work.

Since we last met together, an Act has passed the Legislature to incorporate this Society. This boon, granted during the last Session, without the least infringement of our Constitution, was unanimously accepted at a Special Meeting of the Society in June last, and received, at the same time the approval of the Lord Bishop. While this measure will greatly facilitate the operations of the Society, and afford it the protection of the Law, it will aid in giving permanence to the Institution and invite increasing confidence and support.

It must be felt as a matter of deep thankfulness that a larger amount than heretofore is this year placed at the disposal of the Society. This increase, small indeed compared with what it might be, especially considering the general prosperity which exists, and the wants which the Society is anxious to relieve, yet encourages the hope that the Most High will be pleased year by year to make it more effective in carrying out his gracious will. It is cheering also to find that the Members of the Church are more alive to a sense of their duty to give with "a willing mind," and also to unite in counsel and action for the general good. In this respect, the cooperation of the Laity becomes of the utmost importance, and infuses healthy and vigorous action into the whole body. And while the Church is thus benefitted by the talent and experience of her Members, it cannot but be good for themselves to have their attention drawn for a little to objects of more importance than the every day business of the world. Among the many which this Society brings together, it may happen that some diversity of opinion exists, as to the best mode of carrying out its various objects; but yet on the whole our proceedings have been marked by unanimity, good feeling, and mutual confidence. This is one of the many advantages peculiar to this Society, and surely not the least ground of thankfulness to the "Author of Peace and Lover of Concord."

Among the events of interest to the Society and the Church in general during the past year, is the consecration of the Cathedral, which took place on the 31st of August last, and has since been regularly open for Divine Worship. This work, brought to completio by the energy and untiring zeal of the Lord Bishop, all must hope, will be productive of that benefit to the Church which its founder has anticipated.

The Churches at Moncton, Queensbury, and Black River, all assisted largely by the Society, have been consecrated since our last Meeting, and several others are in process of

erection.

Although no new Missions have been opened, those already supported by the Society have been kept up, and during the past year the Rev. W. H. Shore was employed as a Travelling Missionary to visit the County of Restigouche, of which an account is given in the succeeding Report. It is carnestly to be hoped that this most important portion of the Diocese will ere long be supplied with the regular ministrations of the Church.

The grants of Books to the various Local Committees have been mostly supplied by the Depositories, and Bibles, Prayer Books, and various Religious Works have been sold for cash,

to the amount of more than £150.

From the following abstract of the Returns of the Local Committees the Society will find much reason for encouragement.

ST. MARK'S.—Rev. G. M. Armstrong reports contributions from this Parish, as follows: Schools, 5s.; general purposes, £60 15 6; 1st Collection, £4; 2d do. £14 12 7; Total, £79 13 1.

ST. Andrews.—Rev. Dr. Alley in forwarding the returns from this Mission, (which are as follows: Contributions, £18 7 6; 1st Collection, £3 10; 2d do. £3 8 6; Total, £25 6;) again expresses much regret that he is prevented by the inclement season of the year from attending the meetings of the Society, and he trusts an alteration will this year be made so as to enable many to attend at much less expense and personal risk.

KINGSCLEAR.—Rev. J. Black reports, Contributions, £10 12; 1st Collection, £1 11; 2d do. £1 13 9; Total, £13 16 9.

Speingfield.—Rev. C. P. Bliss in enclosing the returns from this Mission, (which are: Contributions, £11 10; 2d Collection, £2; Total, £13 10;) writes that the Committee at their meeting on the 29th Docember, passed the following Resolution:

"That the thanks of this Committee are justly due to the Diocesan Church Society for the grants given for several years past in aid of this Mission, and

A return from this Mission for the past year, was forwarded by the Rev. R. D. Palmer, which reached the Secretary too late for the Report, as follows: £1 15; 1st Collection, £1; 2d do. £1 3 2; Collection, Irish Settlement, 9s.; do. English Settlement, 12s. 6d.; Total, £4 19 8.

Westmonlann.—Rev. Donald M. Bliss reports, Contributions, £11 7 6; 1st Collection, £1 10; 2d do, £1; Sale of Books, 7s 6d; Total, general purposes, £14 5.

CHATHAM.—Rev. Samuel Bacon is happy in being able to remit an increased amount of contributions this year, which are as follows:—Contributions, £15; 1st Collection, £2 11; 2d do. £5 5 4; Total, £22 16 4; Sale of Books, £2.

The Annual Meeting of this Committee was held in St. Mary's Chapel on

the Festival of St. Andrew, when the following Resolutions were passed.

- 1. That this Committee view with inexpressible satisfaction the increased and increasing prosperity of the Diocesan Church Society, and are more than ever convinced of the paramount importance of the institution for the promotion of the various benevolent objects it embraces.
- 2. That this Committee return thanks for the last grant of books, and trust they may receive an equal share in the next appropriation.
- 3. That this Committee strongly recommend to the favourable consideration of the Society, Mr. John Smith, Teacher of the Madras School, in consequence of his having for many years superintended a Sunday School under the auspices of the Rector, for which this Committee deem him justly entitled to

Moncron.-Rev. W. N. Boyer reports, £5 13 2 as the amount of contributions for general purposes, and reports that he can make no returns of Semi-Annual Collections, owing to increased expenses necessarily incurred in the Church. "The progress of the Church," he writes, "is in every sense onward; the communicants are on the increase. My own position, as Pastor, is made comfortable; the people of their substance, which is not always large, giving cheerfully and kindly."

GREENWICH and PETERSVILLE .- Rev. J. Bartholomew writes thus: This Local Committee desire to express their deep sense of obligation to the Society for its continued aid to their Mission, and earnestly pray, that it may long continue a blessing to this and other portlons of the Diocese which are recipients of its bounty.

They regret that they cannot report the completion of the Church at Douglas Valley, but they trust as their funds have lately been increased by an appeal to New York Churchmen, to finish the edifice early in the summer. They need not say how much their gratitude would be increased by a further grant to this object, if not contrary to the custom of the Society.

The contributions are a little in advance of those of last year, which though small compared with the extent of the Mission, give good evidence of continued attachment to the Church; especially when regarded in connection with the general payment of the free will offerings and the other dues of the Clergyman.

the nks Early in June last, he began his visits as Missionary to the labourers on the St. Andrews and Quebec Railroad, to whom he has since devoted one half of his time. He states that he was most kindly received by the labourers as well as the residents on the line; and met with much encouragement from the Rev. Dr. Alley, the Board of Directors, and the Superintendents of the Works. He found about four hundred men employed on the line, many with large families, and for the most part members of the Church of England. Many more are expected early in the spring. He earnestly solicits a grant of Prayer Books and Tracts for distribution. The distance from the Howard Settlement to the place on the Railroad where Divine Service is performed is about one hundred miles.

GLENELO, NELSON, and the Settlements on the South West Branch of the Miramiehi.—Rev. J. Hudson reports that a protracted sickness and a succession of severe snow storms prevented him and his people from holding their Local Meeting at the usual season. These causes, and the duties he had to discharge to the other widely scattered Settlements in this still extensive Mission, obliged him to defer that Meeting until the 30th ult., when a Resolution was passed "expressive of the people's sense of the great importance of the objects provided for in the Society's Constitution, and their determination to use their best endeavours to promote the same in this Parish." A similar Resolution was also carried at a Meeting of Churchmen in the Nelson Settlement, on the 13th ult.; but the day appointed was unfavourable and not many were present. It is, however, pleasant to add that the offerings to the Society from this Parish alone amount to £7 10 8.

Although the prospects of the Church in this District have not materially changed during the past year, still the Mission is by no means in such a condition as the writer could wish, and as he thinks it might be, if there were employed in it other and more earnest minded labourers; men of the right stamp; men, who for a while would be contented with food and raiment, and who would count not their lives dear unto themselves for the sake of Christ and the Church. May such labourers soon be sent forth into this portion of the Lord's Vineyard! But notwithstanding all his difficulties and discouragements the Missionary is not yet cast down; he intends to take courage and go on, and concludes his report with an expression of his grateful acknowledgements for the uniform kindness, sympathy and support which he has hitherto received from the Diocesan Church Society; and humbly asks the prayers of all its Members, that he may be enabled to fulfil the duties of his office to the glory of God, the honour of the Church, and the good of his fellow men.

Travelling Missionary.—The Rev. W. H. Shore has given the following account of his Mission to the County of Restigouche: "I was desired by the Bishop to remain four Sundays in the District assigned to me; but on rriving at Bathurst, I was requested to remain there a Sunday, in consequence of the absence of the Rector. Mr. Distrow's Station being the most northerly in this portion of the Diocese, there remains a large District without a resident Clergyman of the Church of England, comprising the whole County of Restigouche.

From Bathurst to Unsalvated, the firstless repair to which I travelled, the

From Bathurst to Upsalquitch, (the farthest point to which I travelled), the distance is about ninety six miles, and the whole Country along this line of road, besides many Settlements which lie off the main line, is without any clerical supervision in connection with the Church of England, except that of an occasional visit like my own, or from Mr. Disbrow or the Rural Dean.

I performed Divine Service twice or thrice on Sundays, and on Wednesdays and Fridays at the following Stations: Dalhousie, Ecl River, Campbleton, and at the School House near Flatlands, and found the attendance good, and every where a desire evinced for a resident Clergyman. It would not perhaps be possible to compute the number of Churchmen in the different localities; but if the attendance at the Services I held is any indication of their number, there is even now work enough for more than one Missionary. In a District so neglected, it will not be a matter of surprise that the state of moral and religious feeling should be very low; this fact I learned as well from some of the more serious persons there, as from my own experience. To show that the desire for a resident Clergyman is more than in word only, I may mention that previous to leaving Dalhousic, a Meeting was held for the purpose of considering the propriety of building a Church in that place, and that upwards of £130 was subscribed for the purpose. I have therefore procured a model of a simple Church in the early English style to accommodate one hundred and fifty persons, and have obtained a few subscriptions, I regret very few—to aid in carrying out this desirable object. The County of Restigouche is a thriving and beautiful portion of the Diocese, and will not, I trust, be long without the advantages of a resident Clergyman.

It may not be out of place to say that I was most hospitably entertained during my stay, by A. Barbarie, Esquire, and received in every part of the District, most kind and cordial hospitality.

From the foregoing returns, it appears that the following sums have been contributed to the various objects of the Society for the current year, viz.:-

Missionary Visits, £1; Schools, 5s.; Books and Tracts, £1 10; Aged Clergy Fund, £2 15; Widows and Orphans' Fund, £29 5; General Purposes, £1131 14  $5\frac{1}{2}$ ; Total, £1166 9  $5\frac{1}{2}$ .

It is often remarked as a matter of regret that more missionary intelligence is not furnished to the Society. In the field of labour which it assists in occupying, there must often occur much that would render the Annual Report more useful and interesting, and either encourage the members of the Society to more activity and zeal, or enlist their sympathies in cases of spiritual destitution which ought to be relieved. But whether reported to us or not, the work goes on. Word of God is preached. The Sacraments are administered. This is done in many places where but for this Society, the sound of the blessed gospel would be unheard. Some, we may hope, are now with Christ, others becoming fitted for his Heavenly Kingdom who, else might have perished forever.

The Committee appointed last evening to Report upon the present available funds of the Society, state that they consider the sum of £1250 may be granted this year; from which, deducting the sum of £765 appropriated last evening, the sum £485 remains at the disposal of this Committee.

On motion of the Hon. Mr. Justice Street—Resolved, That the following sums be placed at the disposal of the Executive Committee—viz.: £30 to pay the travelling expenses of the Rev. J. Hudson, and £50 to defray the contingent expenses of the Society.

On motion of the Ven. the Archdeacon—Resolved, That the sum of £25 be granted to Mrs. Stirling, Widow of the late Rev. J. M. Stirling, to be paid out of the interest of the Aged Clergy and Widows and Orphans' Fund. (Old 7th object).

And further Resolved, That the sum of £50, including limitations to that object, be added to the Widows and Orphans' Fund. (8th obect.)

On motion of Mr. W. Wright—Resolved, That the sum of £25 be paid to the Secretary of the Society for his past services, and that the salary attached to that office for the coming year be £25. commencing from the 1st of January last.

On motion of the Hon. Mr. Justice Street, That the sum of £15 be granted to the Rev. J. Hudson to assist him in the purchase of a horse to replace one which he had lately lost. This motion on being put to the Committee was decided in the negative.

Moved by the Hon. J. H. Gray—Resolved, That the sum of £100 be appropriated to building and enlarging Churches and Chapels; which sum was subsequently divided as follows:—

The Church at Douglas £20; the Church at Saint David £15; the Church at Maugerville £20. Payable upon a certificate that the land on which the Church is built, is held in fee simple by and for the use of the Church, and the building finished externally.

The Church at Harvey £10. Payable when it is certified that the Church is completely finished, and will thereby be made free from debt.

The Church at Douglas Valley £10. Payable when it is certified that the building is completely finished internally and externally.

The Church at Queensbury £10. Upon a certificate that the Church is thereby made free from debt.

The Church at Black River £15. Upon condition that no further application be made for said Church.

On motion of Mr. E. J. Jacob—Resolved, That the sum of £20 be granted in aid of finishing and rendering habitable the Parsonage at Woodstock, payable upon a certificate that the building has been completed.

On motion of Mr. B. Botsford—Resolved, That the grant of £25 formerly made in aid of a Parsonage at Moncton, be re-appropriated to that object, payable upon condition that the title to the land is completed and the external walls of the building finished.

On motion of Mr. W. Wright—Resolved, That a further sum of £20 be granted to the Parsonage at Norton, payable when it is certified that the house is completed.

On motion of Mr. W. Carman—Resolved, That the grant of 1851 to the Church at Londonderry of £20 be renewed.

On motion of the Hon R. L. Hazen—Resolved, That the grant of 1852 to the Church at Hopewell of £15 be paid in the present state of the building.

On motion of Mr. W. Wright—Resolved, That the sum of £150, including the limitations to that object, be granted to the Depository Committees of Saint John and Fredericton for the importation of Books, to be equally divided between the said Committees.

And further Resolved, That Books to the amount of £150 be granted to the Local Committees, the same to be distributed by the Executive Committee; and that the further sum of £20 be granted to the Lord Bishop for distribution among the labourers on the Railroads.

On motion of Mr. Dibblee—Resolved, That a sum sufficient to purchase a Bill of Exchange for £30 sterling be placed at the disposal of the Executive Committee for the purpose of importing Hymn Books for the use of the Church in this Diocese.

On motion of the Rev. G. M. Armstrong—Resolved, That in future no application for grants shall be considered, which are not made on the first day of the meeting of the General Committee, or previously.

On motion of Mr. W. Carman, the Lord Bishop left the Chair, and the Ven. the Archdeacon took the same.

Whereupon on motion of Mr. W. Wright—Resolved, That the thanks of this Committee be given to his Lordship for his patient and able conduct in the Chair.

On motion of Mr. W. Wright—Resolved, That the Honorable Charles Simonds be elected Vice President of the Society.

The Secretary reported that the returns of Churches, &c., moved for last year by His Honor the Master of the Rolls, had been in part received.

The Hon. Mr. Justice Parker moved the following as an additional article to the Constitution, "That in future no part of the Funds of the Society shall be appropriated to the building, repairing or enlarging any Church or Chapel, except some Parish Church, or some Chapel belonging thereto," which motion on being put to the Meeting was decided in the negative.

Mr. G. D. Robinson moved that the following change be made in Rule XII.—" That the future Anniversary Meetings of

the Society be held on the Second Thursday in July," which motion on being put from the Chair was decided in the negative.

Mr. George D. Robinson gives notice that he will at the next Anniversary Meeting move the following alterations in the Bye Laws of the Diocesan Church Society, viz.:—
