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## REPORT.

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SINCE the date of last report the Board has met with a severe loss by the death of its late chairman. At a meeting of the Board held on the 10th of November last the following resolution in relation thereto was placed on record:—

“The Board record their sense of the heavy loss they have sustained by the death of their late chairman Mr. WILLIAM DARLING who, from the time of his election as a member of the Board in 1867, had taken a deep interest in the prosperity of the Fund, and as a member of the Executive for a long period had brought great ability to bear upon its interests, devoting much time and thought to its management. The Board, appreciating the wisdom and prudence with which he presided over their deliberations as chairman for the last ten years, feel that they will greatly miss his judicious counsels, and they beg to tender their sincere sympathy to his widow and family in their sore bereavement.”

Mr. Andrew Allan of Montreal was unanimously elected chairman of the Board in room of the late Mr. Darling. The chairman, *ex officio*, with Rev. Robt. Campbell and Mr. Alexander Macpherson were appointed the Executive Committee of the Board.

Nomination papers having been sent to the Beneficiaries asking them to name a layman belonging to the Presbyterian Church in Canada to take the place of late Mr. Darling as a member of the Board, and also of one to act as auditor in place of Mr. Macpherson, who is now a member of the Board, the returns received by the Secretary were duly laid before the Executive Committee, and the same having been carefully examined by them, it was found that Mr. Edward Black Greenshields of Montreal received the largest number of votes for the first named vacancy, and Mr. Philip S. Ross, chartered accountant, of Montreal, for the second, and it was certified accordingly by the Executive.

The suit brought against the Board by Rev. Hugh Niven, claiming certain arrears of stipend and complaining against the

reduction of his annual allowance from the 'Temporalities' Fund has terminated in favour of the Board. The following extract from the judgement rendered by Judge Jetté in the Superior Court of the Province of Quebec may suffice to shew that the procedure of the Board in the matter of the payments to the Beneficiaries has been sustained :—

“ Considering that it results from the facts proven :

“ That the Plaintiff has been ordained a minister of the Presbyterian Church of Canada only in 1857, namely, after the resolutions of the Synod creating the privileged claims affecting the funds organised for the maintenance of the said Church, that henceforth the Plaintiff has no right to be classed in the first nor in the second class of beneficiaries mentioned in the resolutions but necessarily comes into the third class, that is to say in that subject to a reduction, in case of the insufficiency of the funds.

“ Whereas, the interpretation given by the Defendants to the Provincial Statute subsequently annulled, cannot create in favour of the Plaintiff, any right contrary to resolutions and the articles of the statute of and previous to (1858).

“ Whereas, the Federal Statute of 1882 (45 Vic. chap. 124) recognizes and creates in favour of Plaintiff, no such right as that which he claims ;

“ Whereas there results from the proof made on that point, that the fund entrusted to the Defendants is not sufficient to satisfy to the demand of Plaintiff, after the reserve made of the necessary sums to ensure to the privileged ministers, the payment of their annuities, and that in virtue of the articles of the statute of 1858, the Defendants, had a right under the circumstances to suspend and reduce as they did the sums payable to the Plaintiff ;

“ Considering in consequence, that the claim is unfounded ;

“ Maintains the exceptions and pleas of the Defendants, and dismisses and rejects the action of the Plaintiff, with costs *distraints* to Mtre. J. L. Morris, attorney for Defendants.”

INVESTMENTS.—Corporation Bonds for \$16,000 fell due on the first of May last, in addition to which \$9040 of returned loans were received during the year ; in all, \$25,040. Of that

amount \$20,800 were re-invested in mortgages at 6 %. The invested capital, cash in bank, and interest due to 1st May, amount to \$258,434.36, par value. That is \$6 861.90 less than at the same date last year. This sum representing the draft it was found necessary to make upon capital in order to meet the expenditure of the year. This draft, however, is less by \$2,977.84 than the draft upon the capital last year. The annual interest from investments is \$15,607.96, being only \$558 less than last year, while the annuities called for have decreased by deaths and removal \$1,550.

CHANGES IN THE ROLL.—Six names have been removed from the list of Beneficiaries during the year:—(1) Rev Hamilton Gibson, for some years minister of Bayfield, Ont., who died at Toronto on the 19th of October, 1885, in the 73rd year of his age. (2) Rev. John Brown of Newmarket, Ont., who died there 29th October, 1885, aged 79 years. Rev. William E. Mackay, of Orangeville, Ont., who died on the 3rd of June, 1885, aged 59. (4) Rev. James Bain, many years minister of Scarborough, Ont., who died at Markham Village, 9th December, 1885, in the 84th year of his age. (5) Rev. P. S. Livingston, of Broadview, N. W. T., who died at Brandon, on the 11th of November, 1885, in the 40th year of his age. (6) Rev. T. G. Smith, D.D., who resigned his charge of St. Andrew's Church, St. John, N. B., in January last, and is now settled at Wausau, Wis., United States.
