## REPORT.

---

The Managers of the "Toronto House of Industry" beg to present the following Report to the subscribers and the public generally, of the operations of that Charity for the past year (1855). As the last Annual Report gave a very full history of the Institution from its Establishment in 1837, the Managers think it only necessary to say that during the past, as in former years, the affairs of the Charity have been conducted with the sole object of affording as much relief to the general poor of this city as the limited means at the command of the Managers will allow. The number of poor seeking relief from the Institution during the past year, both as out-door pensioners, as well as permanent inmates, has greatly increased over former years (the average number in the House, during the year 1855, being 100); and this, coupled with the fact, of which all must be aware, that within the last two years the prices of all the necessaries of life have been nearly if not fully doubled, has added very greatly to the expense of maintaining the Institution. While on this subject the Managers would beg to impress upon their successors for the ensuing year, the absolute necessity which now exists, as shewn by the present crowded state of the House, of increasing the size of the building, and enlarging the accommodation for the inmates. And in order to meet the increased expenditure consequent thereon, it is recom-

mended that an application be made to Government for a permanent increase of the yearly allowance already granted to the Institution.

In taking up the usual annual subscriptions during last fall, Committees were appointed from among the Managers for that purpose, with a view to increase if possible the amount usually collected in the city, and they have pleasure in stating that such has been the result, as will be seen by reference to the Treasurer's statement accompanying this. The Managers have also to report that during the past year they have paid off the balance due upon the mortgage made to the Toronto Building Society for £1000 cur'cy, which sum was borrowed by the Trustees in the year 1849, for the purpose of paying off a debt contracted in building the present House of Industry, of the annual payments therefore (of £123 15s. 0d.) on said mortgage—the funds of the Charity is now altogether relieved.

The sum left to the Institution by the late Dr. Burnside, and to which reference was made in our report of last year, has not yet been realised by the Trustees; so soon as it is received, they, of course, propose to invest it in some good security, in order to yield a permanent income towards the support of the Charity. This year, as last, it has been found necessary to raise a separate fund, specially for the purpose of buying fire-wood for gratuitous distribution to the poor, and the fuel committee have been enabled to purchase 200 cords for that purpose, which is now being distributed by the Weekly Committees of the House of Industry.

The Managers would refer to the Report of the Treasurer herunto attached, shewing the finan-

cial affairs of the Charity for the past year, and also to the report of the Superintendent, shewing the numbers relieved during the same period.

In conclusion, the Managers would earnestly call the attention of the citizens to the steadily increasing expenditure of this Institution, with an earnest hope that the Toronto House of Industry will not be allowed to languish for want of the means necessary to enable the Managers to increase and extend its usefulness.
