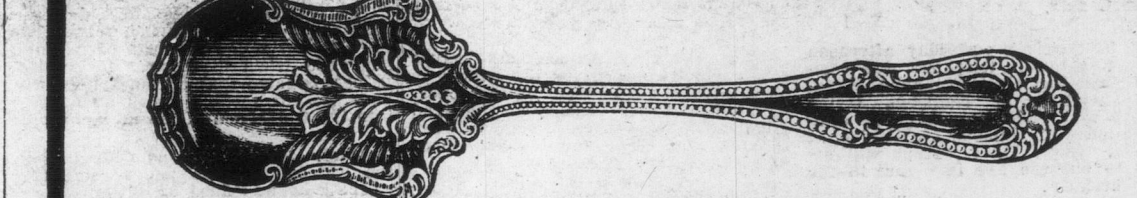

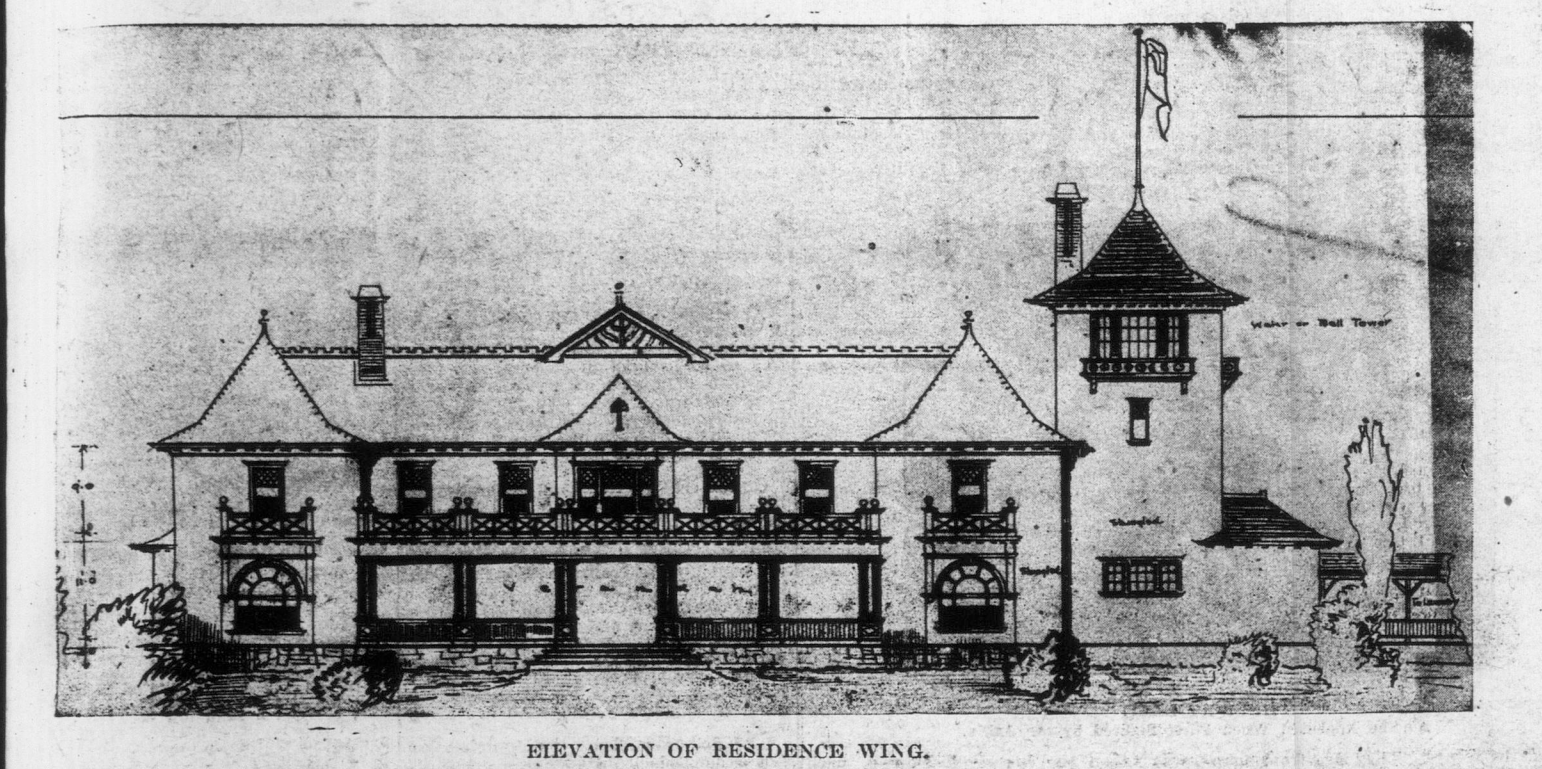

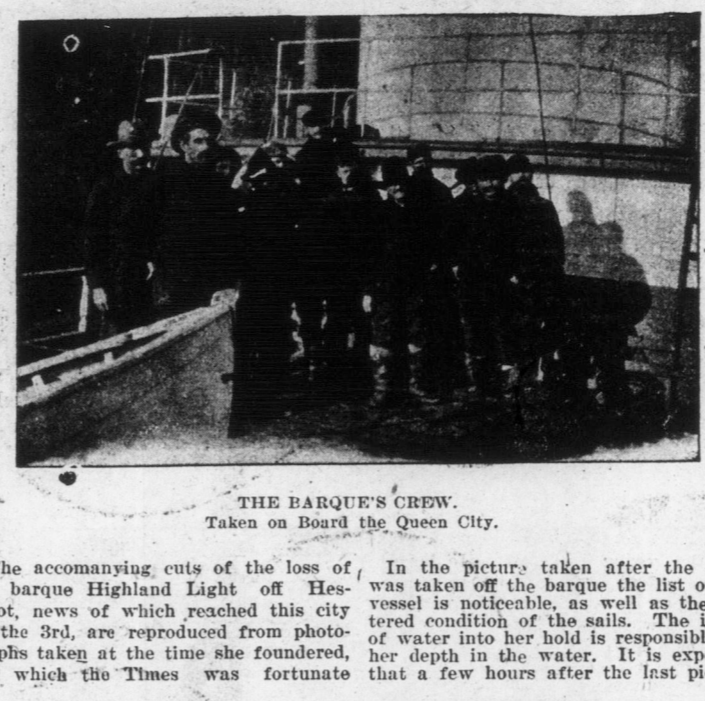

THE BARQUE'S CREW. Taken on Board the Queen City.

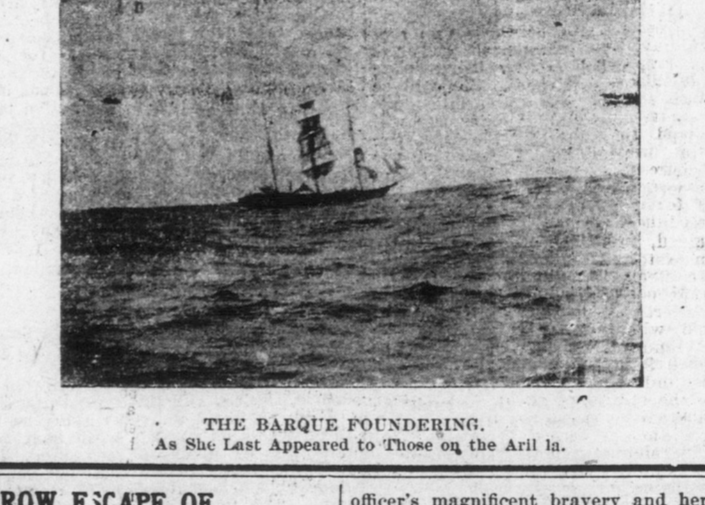

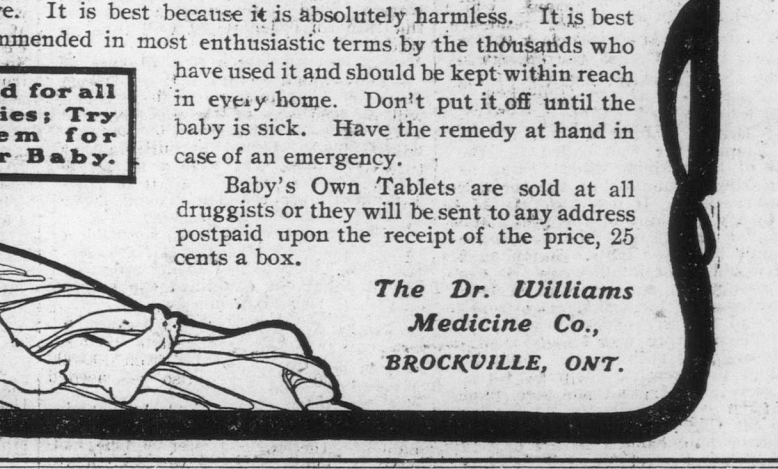
