MILITARY DISCIPLINE.

Commandant Methods of Keeping Order Differ Very Widely.

That the disciplinary methods of military commanders differ widely was shown by two British officers who died in the trenches of France. It was said by Sir Frederick Carrington, whose military prowess was famous, that when an alleged deserter was brought before him he would solemnly resolve himself into a court-martial, and then demand of the accused: "Did you do your duty?" As denials were proverbially usual, the answer was commonly, "Yes, sir." Then take the case of another officer, who was combined judge and executioner, and would rain blows upon him till convinced that a sufficient penalty had been inflicted.

Lord Wolsey, on the other hand, was rather scrupulous about the formal preliminaries, and always aimed to make the punishment fit the crime. One morning he delivered an address to his men on parade, warning them against carelessness of attire, especially in the view of the civilian public. The next day he was halted by three of his own men on guard who had failed to salute. He refused to let them pass out because he was wearing only one spur. He was so delighted at their literal application of his orders that he presented them on the spot with a sovereign apiece, warning them not to spend it on drink. Within a few hours the three were brought before him, under arrest for intoxication.

"If your hon'rs' didn't give us the money," said their spokesman, frankly, "we'd 'a' been all right." Wolsey pondered the situation a few minutes, and then answered: "You are right. I was a fool to expect anything else. You will now fight about and march in charge of this sergeant to the serving bank, where he will stand over you till you have deflected every penny in your pockets."

Perhaps the best of all the barrack-jock chatter about Wolsey's name has to do with an order he issued during the Egyptian occupation, when he posted a guard around the camp of a local potentate. A brother officer, strolling into an adjacent garden, was halted by a sentinel. "Hi, sir; you mustn't go there, sir!" "Don't you see who I am?" protested the officer. "I am Col. Blank of the 1st Buffs."

"Yes, sir, I know," interrupted the trooper, respectfully, "but they're laying live wire in that 'ouse, an' 'e orders 'im 'is 'Garn' is that 'e's not to be let in there 'less 'e's master 'ow 'ad 'e wants to."

A Bird Disciplinarian.

For an example of the wisest of all made creatures in dealing with the frivolous of the weaker sex, the hornbill, an ancient bird of Africa and India, is the most striking. The hornbill drives itself a hole into the hollow of some old tree when it is nesting time. There it builds a comfortable nest and in due course the eggs are deposited therein by its mate. When they are all in place and the necessity arises of sitting on them for the necessary weeks, the male hornbill drives its beak into the nest and proceeds to erect a partition of good material across the aperture to keep her there.

In this wall is left one small slit. It is just large enough for the female to put her bill out through it. The male bird does not forget his responsibility and fathers for his captive. This he brings to the female through the slit and the food is deposited therein. So does the master of the flock address himself that he is not to be allowed to get careless with his eggs and possibly allow the young birds in them to come to harm. The young ones are hatched the male tears out his masonry wall and the mother is liberated.

Mussars Once Freshwater.

Mussars were originally scarcely respectable enough to include a Prince of Wales among their numbers, for the word mussar is akin to cornish and the first mussars were simply freshwater fish.
