PROCEEDINGS

OF THE MINISTERIAL SESSION OF THE LONDON ANNUAL CONFERENCE OF THE METHODIST CHURCH, JUNE, 1896.

The MINISTERIAL SESSION of the LONDON CONFERENCE of the Methodist Church began in the Central Methodist Church, Stratford, on Wednesday, June 3rd.

The morning session opened at 9 o'clock, the Rev. Wm. WILLIAMS, D.D., President of the Conference, in the chair.

OBITUARIES.

JOSEPH HIRAM ROBINSON.

This great and good man was born at Mossley, Lancashire, England, December 20th, 1807. His godly mother brought him up "in the nurture and admonition of the Lord." At a very early age he was the subject of serious impressions, and when about fourteen he was led by the Holy Spirit to Christ. His simple earnest faith soon brought him peace, and he at once became a member of the Methodist New Connexion. In his anxiety to be useful to others he became a Sunday School teacher and prayer leader, and at the age of eighteen he was licensed as a local preacher. So far as his circumstances permitted he was even then a diligent student and an extensive reader, and his studious habits were maintained throughout his active life.

In his twenty-second year he was appointed to his first circuit, and after surmounting the discouragements and difficulties usually incidental to the commencement of such a career he became known as an able and promising young man. Even as a probationer he was placed on important fields of labor, such as Thorne, Alnwick, Doncaster, Manchester and Hanley, and after his ordination he filled with great acceptance and ability such prominent charges as Macclesfield, Newcastle, Halifax, Liverpool, Chester and Sheffield. Shortly after he became a minister he married Miss Scholey, who during fifty-seven years was his faithful and affectionate wife, and whose many qualifications for the position she held made her a valuable helper to him in his life-work. She passed away in her eighty-sixth year. "Her children arise up and call her blessed."

By the English Conference of 1851, the Rev. J. H. Robinson was appointed General Superintendent of the Methodist New Connexion Missions in Canada, succeeding the late Rev. Henry B. Crofts, D.D., in that important position. He filled that office during fifteen years with rare ability and success. The confidence which his brethren reposed in him was manifested in many ways, but specially by his election to the Presidency of the Conference four times during that period. In 1854, he established the *Evangelical Witness*, of which he remained editor till June, 1870, when he was appointed by the English Conference Editor of the Methodist New Connexion *Magazine* and manager of their publishing interests in London, England. During his residence in Canada he was also Treasurer, Financial Manager and Book Steward. In the course of his second stay in England, he was in 1872 elected President of the English Conference. In 1874, he was again sent to this country to co-operate with the Rev. John Medlicraft, who was their Superintendent of Missions, in such measures as they might think best to adopt in relation

to the impending union. That movement was, however, adopted by a vote so nearly unanimous that both the brethren thought it inexpedient to oppose it any longer, and with the consent of the English authorities the union became an accomplished fact. As so many members of the Robinson family were settled in this country, and his long residence in Canada had endeared his brethren here to him, he decided not to return to England. He became a member of the London Conference, in which relation he remained until his lamented death.

Bro. Robinson's piety was deep, true and abiding. His religion was shaped by the personality of the man. The merely emotional part of his experience was hidden in the depths of his own heart, but his unwavering integrity, his thorough truthfulness, his sanctified manliness were things that could not be hid. No man who knew him could believe him ever guilty of a deliberate deflection from duty. Morally he was as true and strong as steel. He hated subterfuge and scorned a sham. The man who was led by considerations of policy could be no friend of his. His severest sentences were those that were spoken against double dealing. His religion was that of sacred principle.

As an editor he was rich in resource, racy in composition and comprehensive in scope. His pen was as sharp as a sword and bright as it was keen. With him there was no sameness, no monotony. His purpose was a high one. His aim was to be a Christ-like man and do a Christ-like work. His ideal was divine; he drew almost as near to it as the human could. As a preacher he had few superiors. The quaintness of his style, the beauty of his imagery, the aptness and sometimes the homeliness of his illustrations, his sanctified sagacity, the simple garb in which some of his most subtle thoughts were clothed, and above all the honesty of his purpose combined to make him one of those preachers whom the common people hear gladly. Christ was his constant and yet ever-varied theme, and the blessedness of gospel grace filled his soul and beamed from his eye. As an administrator he was careful, wise and faithful. His insight was seldom at fault. Combined with a directness that was almost severe, was a kindness that disarmed resentment.

His death was a beautiful one. Blind to the light of day for six years before he saw the King in His beauty, he had learned the blessed art of godly introspection. There was more of thought than speech in his last hours. The light of the sunbeam is silent, so the light was silently shining there. But the few whispered words that made the silence more striking were words of hope, and faith, and love.

The funeral services were held in the Dundas Street Centre Methodist Church, London, of which the deceased had been an active and prominent member for years prior to his removal to Ottawa. A large congregation was present to pay their respects to one who was deemed good and great by those who knew him well. The pastor of the church, the Rev. E. B. Lanceley, presided. Exceedingly appropriate addresses were given by the Rev. Dr. Williams, President of the Conference; Rev. A. L. Russell, M.A., B.D., Chairman of London District, and Rev. Geo. Richardson, of Mount Forest, an intimate friend of the family. A large number of ministerial brethren joined in the funeral procession which conveyed the remains to Mount Pleasant cemetery, where with those of his sainted partner they await the "resurrection of the just."

THOMAS CULLEN.

Rev. Thomas Cullen, son of Stephen and Sarah Cullen, was born at Ederny, in the County of Fermanagh, Ireland, in the year 1836. At the age of ten years he emigrated with his father's family to Canada, and settled near Flesherton, in the County of Grey.

In early life he was converted to God under the ministry of the Rev. Joseph Hill. He was received as a probationer for the ministry in the Wesleyan Methodist Church in 1861, and after three years spent on the Kincardine, Howick and Wawanosh circuits, and two years at Victoria College, he was ordained in Montreal in 1866. In September, 1866, he was married to Miss Mary Greene, daughter of the late Rev. Thomas Greene, of the Bible Christian Church.

His subsequent fields of toil were Bridgewater, Demorestville, Sidney, Bleeker Street (Belleville), Colborne, Brighton, Richmond Street (Toronto), Wesley Church (Toronto), Sarnia and Aylmer. His last charge was Askin Street, London, where after a lingering illness of typhoid fever, he died on the 6th of December, 1895, in the sixtieth year of his age and thirty-fifth of his ministry.

During his illness Bro. Cullen was always hopeful of recovery, and expressed his desire to live and work for his Master. When, however, he was told that his end was near, the message was received without any manifestation of excitement or fear, and after the sad farewells had been spoken by the members of his family, his spirit passed to the home beyond. "He was not, for God had taken him." He was buried at Mount Pleasant cemetery, on Monday, December 9th. A funeral service was held in the Askin Street church, conducted by Rev. A. L. Russell, Chairman of the District, assisted by Rev. Dr. Williams, President of the Conference, and other ministers. The large number of the ministers and laity of the several churches attending his funeral was ample testimony to the esteem in which he was held.

The data at our disposal furnish no material for further reference to the life and experience of our brother, prior to his entrance upon his ministerial career. The following tribute to his memory, from the pen of Dr. Potts, one of his most intimate friends, may be fittingly transcribed :

"The ministerial career of our departed brother, was one of great fidelity, and was more than ordinarily useful and successful. As a preacher, Mr. Cullen was a careful expositor of the Scriptures, and true to the theology of our Church. His sermons were helpful to the people, having in them the elements of sympathy and instruction. As a pastor, he was the friend of the families of his congregation, and always took an especial interest in the young people. As a friend, he was esteemed and beloved by all who knew him. Thomas Cullen was a man of the highest type of character, and was regarded by his brethren in the ministry as a brother beloved. As a husband and father, it was evident to those of us who were favored with the hospitality and friendship of the family, that he was all that wife and children could desire. Those who knew Thomas Cullen in the ranks of the laity and ministry of the Methodist Church, as they think of his life and death, may well say, 'Let me die the death of the righteous, and let my last end be like his.'"

JAMES WHITING.

James Whiting was born at Cardinam, Cornwall, England, January 23rd, 1831, and died at Forest, Canada, December 19th, 1895. He was next to the youngest of a family of eleven children, of whom Rev. Richard Whiting, of Kingston, an honored member of the Montreal Conference, is now the only survivor. He was converted at the age of twelve, and became a member of the Wesleyan Methodist Church. Mrs. Harris, his first teacher, predicted that both he and his brother Richard would be missionaries, a prediction fulfilled in long years of most successful work by both in the Methodism of Canada. After his conversion he spent some time in Lostwithel, then went to London, studied in Westminster College, and subsequently took charge of the Wesleyan schools in Calverley, Yorkshire.

On June 10th, 1855, he was married in London, England, to Miss Jane Woolcock; in 1859 he came to Canada a widower with one child. Joining the Wesleyan Conference, he was stationed one year at Millbrook with his brother Richard as Superintendent; and then at Welland, Grimsby, Smithville and Roxboro'. Since ordination in 1864, he has travelled the following circuits: Teeswater, Dungannon, Arkona, Parkhill, Dunnville, St. Williams, Port Stanley, Wardsville, Dresden, Chatham, St. Thomas (Central), Essex and Forest.

He was married a second time to Mary Frances, daughter of the late W. F. Collard, of Smithville, Ont., on June 16th, 1864. On Wednesday, the day before his death, Mr. Whiting was up town, going from place to place as business or pleasure called him in the lively and energetic manner that was always characteristic of his movements on the street, with a wave of the hand and a hearty salutation for the many acquaintances whom he chanced to meet. On the morning of his death he arose as usual, and was attending to the chores about the house. While fixing the coal stove he remarked to Mrs. Whiting that he felt a smothering sensation in the chest, sat down and closed his eyes in death. In a twinkling a scene of joy and health was changed to one of mourning and death.

The funeral took place on Monday, December 23rd, at the Methodist Church, Forest. The services were conducted by Rev. G. W. Henderson, Chairman of Sarnia District. Addresses were given by Revs. R. J. Treleven, J. Stansfield, of the First Methodist Episcopal Church, Port Huron, and Dr. Williams, President London Conference. All were tender expressions of regard for the memory of the departed, and of warm appreciation of his high character as citizen, friend, fellow-worker and Christian minister. A very large congregation paid the silent tribute of affection's tears in sympathy with tributes spoken by these ministerial brethren.

The career of the departed was an ideal one; early conversion, steady growth of the religious nature, and the mellowing piety of later days. Always a good man, those who knew him best discerned the deepening tenderness of more recent years. He loved all men, and was beloved by all. He was devoted to his family, and they responded with sincerest love. He was intensely earnest in his work, and under his loving ministry an almost unceasing revival influence prevailed wherever he labored.

Many hundreds owe their conversion to the faithfulness of this devoted preacher. The gospel of love was with him the great theme, and he had unbounded confidence in the message he was commissioned to deliver. Kindness beamed forth in every act and made radiant his pulpit.

The devoted spirit and tender sympathy of the man, and his ardent longing for the salvation of souls is beautifully shown in some of his latest letters. In writing to Dr. Forbes, of Duluth, last October, he said, "I prize the respect and love from my brethren, but I tell you, Bro. Forbes, there is a Friend that sticketh closer than a brother. I want to bind my soul to Him in solemn and everlasting allegiance; for whilst others come and go, He abides. I find my most solid satisfaction in living in close communion with Christ and hearty work for God. It has been my highest ambition to win souls for the Master. Oh, that as preachers of the everlasting Gospel we may be more and more impressed with the thought, 'I have nothing to do but to save souls.' The sere and yellow leaf tells me winter is at hand, but we are looking forward to the great unseen. My hope is cast as an anchor 'within the veil,' and though eventide has come all so quick, there is light." Three days before his death he wrote to Rev. R. I. Warner, M.A., of Alma College: "How sad the stricken family of dear Bro. Cullen; and how sad and sudden the call of Dr. John Shaw. Do you recall that Sunday he was with us at the Central Church missionary anniversary? It was a grand day, many souls were saved." Death was sudden; it was a translation; but it is a question whether to *him* it was a surprise. His son, Rev. R. Whiting, found in his study his unfinished work, his books open to their places, and the one last consulted, an expository commentary, open to the text, "Now, Lord, lettest thou thy servant depart in peace, for mine eyes have seen thy salvation." In a letter to Rev. G. W. Henderson, written the evening after Bro. Thomas Cullen's death, he wrote these original lines:

"One by one the brethren rise
And meet in peace beyond the skies,
And sing the Lamb forever.
We'll journey on, it won't be long
Till we raise the anthem loud and strong
On the banks beyond the river."

In the above statements, which cover the period since the last General Conference, you will notice the expenses have amounted to \$490.88, which is unusually large, arising, mostly, out of the action of the General Conference changing the Treasurer against the recommendation of the Embarrassed Trusts' Committee, who had all the facts and data before them; and the inability of the Committee appointed to find any one who would undertake to perform the duties, and do the work for

nothing. Several special meetings of the Committee were held, and at last the former Treasurer was prevailed upon to undertake the task. This he has endeavored to do under increasing difficulty.

The General Conference of 1894 urged upon the Committee the relief of the St. Lawrence Central Camp-ground Association, which has been done and the Trust wound up, at an outlay, on the part of the Fund, of \$5,916.47, and the payment or cancellation of about an equal amount on the part of those more immediately concerned.

You will also notice the collections for 1895 were much below the average, amounting to only \$3,976. This, all will admit, is miserably small for so large a membership, and ought to be doubled at least.

Your Treasurer acknowledges with thanks the efficient aid of many members of the Committee during the last year in arranging and settling many difficult matters that required adjustment in connection with the settlement of the various trusts involved.

And now that we have got to the bottom of the last "Trust" that can legitimately come on this Fund, let us make more strenuous efforts than ever "to close it out" by largely increasing the collections, keeping down expenses and interest, and bringing everything to bear on a speedy extinguishment of all the liabilities, so that we may turn our attention from dead to living issues, and find something more pleasant, if not more necessary.

REPORTS OF COLLEGES.

VICTORIA UNIVERSITY.

The Board of Regents have much pleasure in presenting to the Annual Conferences, and through them to the Church over which they preside, a brief report of the important work which has been committed to their care. The interest of this work centres, of course, in its financial and educational aspects, both of which have been the subject of careful consideration and no little anxiety.

The estimates of income and expenditure made last year had anticipated a deficiency of \$8,000 on the year's work, the income being estimated at over \$24,000, and expenditure at over \$32,000. The treasurers, Geo. A. Cox, Esq., and Rev. Dr. Potts, were able to report that this had been reduced below \$6,000, partly by increase in fees due to a larger attendance of students and partly by a special Income Fund contributed by friends at the solicitation of Dr. Potts, intended to cover the annual deficiency for the next five years. Every item of working expenses had been carefully guarded during the year, and in this way the accounts were kept \$500 below the estimates. The annual deficiency is due entirely to the fact that the necessary endowment has not yet been reached. The original estimate for the endowment was \$400,000, producing \$24,000 a year. The productive endowment is about \$260,000, yielding less than \$14,000 annual income. The munificent bequest of the late Mr. Massey will go far to meet the difficulty thus far experienced. The total expenditure for the year is reported at \$33,023.82. The income has reached \$27,112.62.

The report of the educational work of the year should give encouragement to all the friends of the Institution. The attendance of students has again advanced, the net registration for the year being 253, divided as follows: Arts, 227; theology, 128; less registered in both faculties, 102; net total, 253. The strength of the staff has not been changed, numbering eleven professors and lecturers in arts, and six in theology, three taking work in both faculties.

The students of Victoria have secured very creditable results in the examinations of the year, obtaining their full share of the honors, scholarships and other prizes of the University. The largest prize in the gift of the University, the Exhibition Scholarship of \$750 a year for two years after graduation, to be used in study in Europe, has been won this year by a Victoria man, Mr. A. M. Scott.

A special feature of the work of the year has been increased attention to the subjects of the curriculum which give a Christian character to our higher education. This important matter is attracting the attention of our most thoughtful Christian men, and the question is anxiously asked, How shall we make our education truly Christian while yet unsectarian? The provisions of the Federation Act secure the following

elements of religious knowledge as a part of the curriculum in Arts: The Evidences of Natural and Revealed Religion, Biblical Literature, Church History, the Greek Testament, and Christian Ethics. The department of Biblical Literature includes the English Bible, Biblical History and Introduction. The work is placed in the third and fourth years of the course. Of the sixty-eight Victoria students enrolled in those years, sixty are taking these subjects as part of their curriculum.

The report of the Faculty of Theology shows a remarkable advance in the educational status of our rising ministry. Of twenty-nine students of Victoria this year presented for ordination, no less than nineteen are graduates in Arts, three being also graduates in Divinity. This is a result probably not surpassed in the religious and educational history of the Continent.

We commend to your loyal support and prayerful interest this important work of the Church, believing that the highest Christian intelligence is more than ever necessary to the upbuilding of the kingdom of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.

WESLEYAN THEOLOGICAL COLLEGE, MONTREAL.

To the Annual Conferences of the Methodist Church.

The undersigned respectfully submit the following brief report of the last year's work and of the present position of the Institution.

Number of students in Arts, full course, 8 (others as partial students take more or less work in the University); in Divinity leading to the Licentiate's Degree, 24; for the Degree of B.D., 21; for the Conference Course, 18. Total enrolled, 71.

Rev. Principal Shaw, D.D., LL.D., lectures in Systematic Theology, Greek Testament and Church Polity; Rev. J. C. Antliff, M.A. (Edin.), D.D., in Apologetics, Hebrew and Homiletics; Rev. Prof. Richardson,

B.A., B.D., Acting Registrar, in Greek and Latin, and Rev. Prof. Harris, M.A., B.D., Bursar, in Church History and English. Rev. Prof. Patton, B.D., is still pursuing a Post-Graduate Course in Oriental Literature, in Leiden, Holland.

The College is prepared to afford students facilities for meeting the Conference requirements, in the new course for probationers, or for pursuing the three years' course leading to licentiate's standing, or the University Course in Arts in McGill, or the higher course in Divinity leading to the Degree of B.D. Copies of calendar containing full information as to curricula, etc., may be obtained from the Acting Registrar.

The Endowment Fund is now \$75,000, current expenditure about \$6,500, total debt on current account (only liability) is \$4,000. The Boarding Department covers its need with the income of about \$4,000. The need is urgent for enlargement of buildings for increased accommodation in dormitories, lecture rooms and convocation hall. It is probable that this need will be met from the generous bequest of the late H. A. Massey, Esq., of Toronto, for the "Douglas Memorial Hall."

The effort of the Rev. Prof. Harris, M.A., Bursar, to further increase the Endowment Fund, is being continued, and all its proceeds are sacredly placed in new investments. In the meantime the Institution is conducted with rigid economy in finances, and with regard to thoroughness and efficiency in educational work.

ALBERT COLLEGE.

To the Members of the London Conference of the Methodist Church.

DEAR BRETHREN,—We are able, under the blessing of a kind Providence, to report another year of prosperity at Albert College. Over 200 students have been enrolled. The year may be fairly said to mark a new epoch, a decided advance, in the history and work of the Institution. The improvements of the former building, which were begun in the summer of 1895, are now fully completed, and are the great delight of every friend of the College. The most modern and improved baths have been placed throughout the former building, and it has been devoted entirely to residence, thereby considerably increasing the accommodation. "Massey Hall," named after the late H. A. Massey, Esq., whose gift of \$10,000 made its erection possible, is a beautiful building of brick and Ohio sandstone. It provides a chapel seating over 500, seven class-rooms and a museum. It is finished in natural wood, ash and oak, with bronze hardware and cathedral glass. The equipments throughout are of the most substantial kind.

The gymnasium is a large two-story brick building, with gallery, and is provided with shower-baths, lavatory and every convenience. The expense of fitting it up with apparatus, costing several hundred

Albert College, with its splendid buildings and its large staff of honor graduates and specialists, can now fully claim a first place among collegiate and similar institutions in the Province. The College has always been highly successful in the preparation of candidates for university and departmental examinations, but the record of successful candidates of 1895 surpassed that of any previous year. Out of eleven candidates for Senior Matriculation, ten were successful; out of three candidates for Senior Leaving Teachers' Certificates, all were successful. This is a magnificent record, and at once reflects the highest credit upon the teaching staff, and stamps the work done as unsurpassed. A special matriculation examination is held in May of each year for all candidates for the Methodist ministry. The examination is held just previous to the annual District Meeting.

The departments of Music, Elocution and Fine Arts have maintained their efficiency and have been largely patronized.

The Business School has been greatly improved. The chapel of the former building, a room 50 x 50, has been fitted up with banking offices, merchants' emporiums; and lectures upon Commercial Law and other subjects have been appointed, and the College is now able to offer attractive courses in this department. (a) Book-keeping; (b) Shorthand and Type writing; (c) Practical English. All graduates of the Business School receive the regular diploma from the Senate of the College.

During the year Dr. F. J. Livingstone, the chosen representative of the Missionary Society in the foreign field, has entered upon his work in Africa.

The Missionary societies, the Y.M.C.A. and Y.W.C.A., have been most active in their operations.

We desire to thank the ministry and laity of the Methodist Church for their hearty co-operation with us in the work of the College, and we rejoice greatly that the present year has been one of such marked success. We hope to ever merit your confidence and support.

ALMA LADIES' COLLEGE, ST. THOMAS, ONT.

To the London Conference of the Methodist Church.

DEAR FATHERS AND BRETHREN,—The school year now drawing to a close has brought us peculiar experiences of sorrow and of joy. For the first time since our College opening, nearly fifteen years ago, death has invaded the circle of our college family, taking from our midst our venerable and erudite Professor of German, the Rev. John Schulte, Ph.D., D.D., one of the ripest scholars and noblest characters of our country. The vacancy in the staff occasioned by his decease has been filled by the appointment of Miss E. A. Hill, B.A., of Toronto University.

The year has brought us a fine class of earnest, intellectual and devoted students, of whom about one hundred have been boarders in the Institu-

tion. The Methodist students constitute about one-half of our enrolment. The other half is made up from the various Christian churches, including several Roman Catholics. Twenty-five students from the United States have been enrolled. Our graduating class will number eighteen, as follows: In the Literary course, 7; Music, 3; Fine Art, 2; Eloquence, 5; Commercial, 1. The health of the students has been very good, and the discipline of the school satisfactory, whilst the various religious services give evidence of an encouraging degree of religious interest.

The Faculty is full and thoroughly efficient, and the various departments were never in better condition for effective work. The donation of the late Dr. Gould, of Colborne, Ont., and the liberal bequest of \$10,000 by the late Hart A. Massey, Esq., of Toronto, give great encouragement and cheer to the Board of Management.

The agency for the Relief Fund under the vigorous efforts of Rev. J. P. Rice is showing good results, and the returns, while not as large as could be desired, are still encouraging. One thing essential to larger success in this agency is, that at least some of the territory adjoining the London Conference should be opened by confederal action to our representative, so that he may at all times have a sufficient number of uncanvassed fields before him to keep him constantly employed without any interference with any local interest that may be, for the time, of paramount importance to the circuit and minister.

The special needs of the school are (1) a speedy relief from the financial burdens resting upon it, (2) a heartier co-operative and more active sympathy on the part of Methodist ministers and people in making its great advantages and moderate rates better known to the people.

THE WESLEYAN LADIES' COLLEGE, HAMILTON.

To the President and Members of the Conference.

DEAR FATHERS AND BRETHREN,—One of the most striking sentences in Tertullian's Apology reads, "We are but of yesterday and by to-day are grown up, and overspread your empire; your cities, forts, towns, camps, palace, senate, all swarm with Christians." It is with something of the same pardonable pride that we recall the fact that our Church, one of the youngest, has given to this country the first university, the first ladies' college, the first religious journal, and the first publishing house. These facts are the more noticeable when put side by side with the notion hardly yet abandoned, that Methodism is more likely to emphasize the emotional than the intellectual. Buckle, in his "History of Civilization in England," wrote in 1857: "Since the death of their great leaders, they have not produced one man of original genius, and since the time of Adam Clarke they have not had among them even a single scholar who has enjoyed a European reputation." Buckle would hardly write that to-day. But if he did, we would modestly suggest that the chief function of the

Church is not to produce men of original genius, but rather to sanctify and ennoble all genius. Neither would the possession of men of European reputation be a satisfactory guaranty that we were in the true succession. Church organizations have had men of original genius and world-wide reputation, and still have been utterly powerless to melt and mould society into diviner forms.

Nevertheless we freely and promptly admit that a system that awakes not the dormant intellect and secures not more rational conceptions of God and His relations to us could hardly claim the stamp divine. Here we have no apology to offer for our Church. She needs none. Illiteracy is almost unknown among us. No Church on this continent has done more to advance higher education on a Christian basis than the Methodist. Canadian Methodism has an enviable record on this score. Victoria leads in the university line, and the Wesleyan Ladies' College of Hamilton was the first chartered ladies' college in Canada.

The first record on our register is dated July 6th, 1860. The ministerial members of the Board were Drs. Ryerson, Rice, Wood, Douglas, Nelles, Stinson, Rose, and Richard Jones. All in their prime then; all in the necrology of the Church to-day. No more historic names can be furnished by any Church in the Dominion. Among the lay members of the Board were Edward Jackson, Dennis Moore, Edward Gurney, Dr. J. W. Rosebrugh, Joseph Lister, and George Roach. Dr. Rosebrugh and George Roach are the only surviving members of the original Board, and they are active members of the Board still.

We are pleased to be able to report a good year's work. Every department of the regular course is in charge of university graduates, and kept fully abreast of the times in efficiency. In music and art the names of Fairclough and Martin stand in the very front rank. Professor Baumann and Mrs. Martin-Murphy have more than a provincial reputation in violin and vocal culture. Elocution, physical culture, commercial studies and all other subjects taught in colleges will be found here, and in charge of thoroughly competent instructors. The year has been marked by great harmony; our students give us no trouble. We are also thankful to be able to say that serious sickness is unknown among us.

We need hardly refer to finances, as this Institution has never either solicited or received aid from the Church in any form. It has not merely been self-sustaining; its first President, Edward Jackson, endowed the first chair endowed in Victoria College, and his successor, Dennis Moore, supported a chair in that Institution for several years till his death. Victoria and others of our colleges owe not a little to the Wesleyan. But while costing the Church nothing, we cheerfully offer to your daughters every advantage that any other institution can give, and on terms equally favorable.

This college is strictly non-sectarian, but positively Christian, and we think that its influence in the homes of our country has been in the highest degree healthful. No lady can secure our diploma without giving at least one bell each day for a year to the historic study of the Bible, and an equal time to Moral Science and Christian Evidences. Whatever else graduation might imply, it seems strange that colleges in Christian lands, and under Christian control, should ignore the subjects that lie at the

basis of Christian civilization. We are satisfied that no part of our curriculum will tell more on the future of our students than the subjects referred to. We are proud of the work done in the Wesleyan, and proud of the record of our students. We never felt more hopeful or cheerful in our work than at present, and we pledge you our heartiest co-operation in the glorious work of making this world brighter and better.

ONTARIO LADIES' COLLEGE.

To the Annual Conferences of the Methodist Church.

Never since the foundation of the Ontario Ladies' College twenty-two years ago, have the Directors been able to present a report which is so gratifying as the present one. This Institution was founded in the faith that it would grow and develop and meet the ever-increasing need of the higher education of the young women of this country. And this faith has been fulfilled. At the outset the buildings and grounds were admirably adapted for the purpose required. But in order to meet the ever-increasing demand, and the better accommodation necessary for the health and comfort of the large number of pupils in attendance, we have been able to keep abreast of the times, and we have now fully completed the most magnificent pile of buildings in this country devoted to the higher education of young ladies. We have erected an extensive addition known as Frances Hall, containing a spacious, well-ventilated dining-room, a beautiful music hall, with science hall, bedrooms, kitchen, laundry, baths, and all the modern sanitary improvements, the whole range of buildings being comfortably heated with steam and lighted by electricity supplied by our own plant. You look at it by day and are greatly pleased. But you behold it by night and you are charmed. Imagine you see four hundred incandescent lights suspended on artistic fixings shining through scores of windows and filling corridors and parlors and dormitories and lavatories with their softened beams, and you have a delightful vision.

There is a bright future before this College. It has great blessings in store for the young women of this country. And the purpose of the directors is to continue to supply it with all the equipment necessary to meet the highest ideal of education for young ladies. No branch of instruction will be overlooked. The steady aim of the Institution will ever be to send forth from its classes cultured and Christian women.

The various subjects of study, such as English, modern languages, mathematics, classics, music, painting, elocution, etc., receive careful attention. The course of study begins in primary work, and extends all the way up to the end of the second year in the provincial University.

The teachers all have a high standing of efficiency in their several departments, and the examinations of the pupils have been most creditable to the quality of their instruction. This year, as last year, four of the pupils have taken the first and second year's examinations in the provincial University, while every medallist of the College during the last four years has had a two years' standing in this highest school of learning among us.

An instructive course of lectures has been continued once a week through the year, when the leading professors of Toronto and of Victoria universities have given papers on subjects of great interest.

For the last session, the attendance has been larger than ever before, while the increased room for accommodating pupils, together with so many home comforts in the shape of heating, lighting, plumbing, etc., encourages the hope that next year will surpass all previous records in point of attendance.

We call upon the friends of the higher education of young women to forward the cause of religion and of culture by giving the Ontario Ladies' College their earnest support, and to communicate freely with the Principal, Rev. J. J. Hare, Ph.D., whose untiring industry and enthusiastic devotion has given to this College the present proud position among the colleges of the Dominion.

REPORTS OF COMMITTEES.

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF EXAMINERS.

The annual meeting of the Board of Examiners of the London Conference was held in the Methodist Church, St. Mary's, April 15th and 16th, 1896.

All the members of the Board were present. Twenty-eight probationers were present, and wrote on the various papers of the first, second and third year's courses of study prescribed for probationers on circuits. Two candidates presented certificates of matriculation from the University of Toronto, and wrote on the Theological subjects of the preliminary course. One received a first and the other a second-class certificate. Of the probationers, only one in the second year and four in the first year took Greek and all the other subjects of their respective years. A first-class certificate was granted to the probationer of the second year; two second-class and two third-class certificates were granted to those who completed the work of the first year. To those who omitted Greek, or other subjects, records of standing were given, averaging on the subjects taken; in the third year, one first and two second-class; in the second year, three second and five third-class; in the first year, one first, four second, and three third-class certificates.

A public meeting was held on Wednesday evening, the President of the Conference in the chair. Appropriate addresses were delivered by Revs. W. J. Ford, LL.B., and N. R. Willoughby, D.D., and the result of the examinations were made known.

The Board begs to recommend that the President of the Conference be *ex-officio* Chairman of the Board.

The Board recommends that the examination for 1897 be held in the town of Petrolia, commencing at 9 a.m. on the third Tuesday of April.

We also recommend that the Conference give permission to the Theological Faculties of Victoria University, Toronto, and the Wesleyan Theological College, Montreal, to grant supplemental examinations on all subjects of the first, second and third year's course of study to all probationers of this Conference who may desire them.

The attention of parties concerned is called to the fact that all candidates for the ministry are required to present a certificate of matriculation from some Canadian or other British university, or certificate equivalent to matriculation from one of our own colleges, as the standard of their literary qualifications, before being permitted to take the Theological subjects of the prescribed course of study.

The ministers of the Conference who are pursuing extra-mural courses, are requested to act in accordance with the provisions of the Discipline, par. 148, sec. 3, in regard to the recognition of their degrees in Conference records.

REPORT OF CHURCH PROPERTY COMMITTEE.

The Committee recommend that the request of the trustees of the parsonage in Wallace Circuit, to dispose of parsonage property at Carthage, and devote proceeds to purchase or erection of parsonage in a more central position, be granted.

The Committee also recommend that the request of the trustees of the parsonage property at Monkton, that they be permitted to sell the same and apply the proceeds to the liquidation of the debt on the same, the balance to be applied to payment on the new parsonage property, be also granted.

The trustees of the Whitechurch parsonage asked that they be permitted to sell a part of the land, the proceeds to be used on indebtedness on the new parsonage. The Committee recommend that the trustees be permitted to sell a strip of not more than two rods wide on the west side of the lot, said strip not to exceed one-fifth of an acre.

Resolved, that we grant the request of the trustees of the parsonage at Aylmer, to sell forty (40) feet north and south, by fifty-six and a quarter ($56\frac{1}{4}$) feet east and west, on the north-west corner of the parsonage lot, reserving the privilege of removing the building now upon the lot, proceeds to be applied to the building of a new barn upon the parsonage lot.

The recommendation in regard to the request of the trustees of the Vienna parsonage, asking permission to sell lot 21 west, on Elm Street, and lot 21 east, on Oak Street, in the village of Vienna, proceeds to be applied in liquidation of debt on parsonage, is that the request be not granted.

It was resolved that this Committee recommend that the Vienna parsonage trustees be permitted to sell the rear or west lot, but not to sell the lot adjacent to parsonage.

The trustees of the Underwood church, Tiverton mission, ask permission to sell the lot at Baie de Dore, on the Tiverton mission, proceeds to be applied on parsonage improvement, balance on the church and shed at Underwood. The Committee recommend that the request be granted.

The Committee recommend that the trustees of the Everett church, Thamesville Circuit, have permission to sell the same, the proceeds to be applied on the debt on the parsonage in Thamesville.

In regard to the request of the trustees of the Woodward church property, Adelaide Circuit, to sell the said church property, the Committee recommend that action be deferred for one year:

REPORT OF SUNDAY SCHOOL COMMITTEE.

Your Committee beg to report as follows: The number of schools in the Conference is 469, with 5,667 officers and teachers, 5,209 of these being members of the Church. The number of scholars is: 12,378 in the Primary Department, 18,407 in the Intermediate Department, 1,376 in the Adult Department, and 343 in the Home Department, with a total of 44,904 scholars, being an increase of 75 over the previous year. During the year 2,361 scholars have united with the Church, being an increase of 174; 12,557 are members of the Church; 2,445 are learning the catechism, a decrease of 508; 8,435 have taken the total abstinence pledge, a decrease of 2,111. There are 48,326 volumes in library, an increase of 1,627. There are 6,669 copies of *Onward* taken, an increase of 239 over last year; 9,200 copies of *Pleasant Hours* are taken, an increase of 89; 5,939 copies of *Happy Days* are taken, an increase of 806; 6,463 copies of *Sunbeam* are taken, an increase of 22; 15,300 copies of *Berean Leaf* and *Quarterly* are taken, a decrease of 1,551 over previous year; 2,657 copies of the *Banner* are taken, a decrease of 104. The amount raised by the schools for missions was \$2,791.01, being an increase of \$183.53; for Educational Society, \$197.67, an increase of \$129.71; for the Superannuation Fund, \$25.87, an increase of \$2.76; for Sunday School Aid and Extension Fund, \$408.68, an increase of \$4,802.00; for general Sunday School purposes, \$20,395.39; for all purposes, \$23,818.62, an increase of \$29.24.

Your Committee desire to make the following recommendations :

1. We strongly recommend to our people, for quality and cheapness, the periodicals of our own Publishing House and their superiority, over those of American establishments.

2. That we adopt, wherever possible, the Home Department in connection with our Sunday School work.

3. We would impress the necessity and importance of the attendance of the children upon the regular preaching services of the church, and urge upon Sunday School superintendents the advisability of assisting in this by frequently asking the school how many of them were present at the church service, and to encourage the children's attendance, that the pastor feed them when they come.

4. Your Committee, in harmony with the request of the Conference, recommend that the district schedules be published in full in the Minutes.

5. We recommend the appointment of Rev. J. E. Holmes as Secretary-Treasurer for this year.

1. It is with pleasure we observe the increasing interest our young people take in church matters, and the work of the Master generally.

2. The amount raised by the Districts for the General Fund is \$248.46. We regret, however, the fact that a large number of the societies have not responded to the appeal for financial support in connection with the general office in Toronto.

3. We notice that many of the Leagues have not enrolled themselves at the office of the General Secretary, and we urge the importance of enrolment for connexional reasons.

4. Your Committee would recommend the organization of an Epworth League at every appointment in our work, believing that the work of the League is very important in connection with the young life of Methodism.

5. We would commend to our young people the General Secretary, Rev. A. C. Crews, and we desire to place on record our hearty approval of the appointment of Mr. Crews to such an important office.

6. Too much importance cannot be attached to attendance upon the prayer and class meetings of the Church, and we encourage all our young people in this matter, believing it to be of infinite importance to the growth of grace in the soul.

7. Permit us to direct the attention of our Leagues to the value of a reading course, and we highly approve of the organization of a reading circle in each Epworth League.

8. It is with great pleasure we express our delight with the wide-spread and increasing interest taken in the study of God's Word by our young people.

11. We strongly recommend that an annual Epworth League day be held in each society on May 16, 1897.

12. The statistics are as follows: Epworth Leagues, 119; increase, 26. Junior Leagues, 40; increase 11. Members in Senior Leagues, 3,083; increase, 465. Members in Junior Leagues, 1,528; increase, 616. Associate members, 1,857; increase, 152. Total Senior Leagues, 4,871; increase, 548. Grand total, 15,112; increase, 1,380. Money raised, \$9,436.88; increase, \$1,581.42.

COMMITTEE ON THE STATE OF THE WORK.

Your Committee is laid under renewed obligations of devout thankfulness to Almighty God for the rich spiritual blessings which have crowned the efforts of our ministers and people. During the year 6,433 members have been received into the Church, 5,160 have removed, leaving a net increase of 1,273.

We notice that evangelistic help from an outside quarter has not been employed as much as heretofore, and we are persuaded that the increased attention to personal religious experience, the faithful attendance on the class-meeting, the prayer-meeting, as well as the more public means of grace, the hearty co-operation of ministers and people with an entire dependence upon the Holy Spirit for all guidance and blessing, will result in still richer ingatherings of immortal souls. The spiritual condition of our Sabbath Schools is very encouraging, the scholars numbering 44,904, of which 12,557 are in membership, 2,361 being converted during the year.

Our young people's societies, we rejoice to know, are in a very healthy, vigorous condition. With 160 Epworth Leagues, we have a membership

of 6,468, contributing to the Epworth League General Fund about \$250. We would very respectfully urge upon our young people to support this Fund to the best of their ability, and that our ministers urge this matter upon our young people. In this connection we are highly pleased with the Students' Volunteer missionary movement, and commend it to the sympathetic co-operation of our Leagues and young people's societies.

We would very affectionately recommend a hearty reciprocity between the older and the younger people of our Church; our older people frequenting the meetings of our young people, helping to enrich with their godly experience, and our young people flocking to the prayer-meeting, and with happy hearts and cheerful voices helping in song and prayer.

Our people have given nobly to the different connexional funds, but we regret to notice a small decrease.

We bespeak for our Zion everywhere showers of blessings during the year, remembering the Master's promise, "And lo I am with you alway, even unto the end of the world."

Your Committee respectfully suggest that this report be read to our people in connection with the pastoral address.

SABBATH OBSERVANCE COMMITTEE.

Your Committee on Sabbath Observance report as follows:

Whereas, the Sabbath is a divine institution for man's special benefit, affecting both his present welfare and eternal destiny, we regard it to be the duty of the State to secure for each of her citizens the privilege of observing this sacred heritage, believing that righteousness alone can exalt a nation, and the transgression of this holy command is not only a reproach to any people, but also brings that nation under the curse of a broken law which will cause the wrath of God to abide upon her people.

The apostle Paul declares that the powers that be are ordained of God. Therefore we believe that God will hold those in authority responsible for legislating and enforcing laws in strict harmony with His commands.

God says, "Thou shalt not steal;" therefore we strongly denounce the practice of stealing the hours of God's holy day by social visiting, delivering milk, running trains, conducting funerals (except cases of real necessity), etc., and especially the growing evil of bicycle riding for pleasure, or any kind of labor excepting that of mercy and necessity.

While we would not discourage the practice of fraternal societies marching quietly to the house of God for worship on the Lord's Day at the regular hours of service, we very strongly disapprove of societies parading with bands on that day.

We regret to note that the Seventh Battalion of London, in order to honor our Gracious Sovereign on her last birthday, greatly dishonored the King of kings and Lord of lords by parading the streets and going on an excursion to Hamilton on the Lord's Day.

But we most heartily approve of the efforts put forth by the Ministerial Association of London and the various benevolent societies of that city and surrounding country to secure a better observance of the Lord's Day, and trust that during the coming year a still further advance may be secured toward a complete and scriptural observance of the sacred day of rest.

We also commend the cheesemakers of our country in the steps that are being taken to put in butter plants for the manufacture of Saturday night's milk into butter instead of cheese, thus avoiding the desecration of the Lord's Day.

Your Committee would draw attention to the fact that an heretical sect known as the Seventh Day Adventists are disseminating their erroneous doctrines concerning the Sabbath in certain parts of this Conference, and under their influence some people are regularly working on the Lord's Day, ignoring the day that represents the redemption of the world by Jesus Christ. They profess to keep the Jewish Sabbath, claiming that to be the only divinely authenticated day under the present dispensation as well as under the old.

Your Committee is in sympathy with those who have endeavored to maintain the sanctity of the Lord's Day by appealing to the civil law, and we gratefully acknowledge the fact that the Legislature of Ontario at its last session did so amend the Lord's Day Act as to make it now unlawful for anyone to do ordinary work on that day. We would recommend that our ministers during the year preach a sermon on the change of the Sabbath from the seventh to the first day of the week, and thus educate our people on this important point of doctrine.

MEMORIAL COMMITTEE.

Your Committee report :

1. With reference to the communication from the Secretary of the Prisoners' Aid Association, we disapprove of the proposal of the Dominion Government to locate a reformatory for young men at Alexander, in Gengarry, and hope it will be placed more centrally and near some large town or city. We also hope that the proposal to separate young criminals from old ones by building a new establishment for them may be carried out.

2. Regarding Dr. Sutherland's communication, stating that efforts are being made over circuits in our Conference to collect missionary moneys for undenominational purposes, and in undisciplinatory ways; we recommend the ministers of our Conference to carefully guard our connexional interests in this direction, and secure the contributions of our people for our own missionary enterprises.

3. *Re* Walpole-Island communication, asking that Methodism be not abandoned on the Island; we recommend Conference to assure our Indian brethren there that there is no intention of withdrawing from them the services of our Church.

4. We most heartily endorse the memorial from the Windsor District; and hope most sincerely the Dominion Government will so change the Criminal Code as to make lotteries and raffles for church and charitable purposes unlawful; and to make law the proposed amendments relating to horse-racing and gambling as speedily as possible.

5. We recommend, in accordance with memorial, that the names of all the ministers and probationers who have paid their personal subscription to the Superannuation Fund be published in the Minutes of Conference.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON TEMPERANCE.

Your Committee beg to report as follows:

1. Since the report of your Committee a year ago the highest court in the Empire has decided that the power of absolute prohibition of the liquor traffic inheres only in the Dominion Government, although a certain measure of local prohibition seems to lie within the power of the separate provinces. We therefore recommend

(1) That this Conference memorialize the Ontario Government to introduce at its next session such prohibitory legislation as may lie within its power, and thus redeem its solemn pledge to the people of Ontario.

(2) As an election campaign is now in progress and candidates for the Dominion Parliament are asking for the suffrages of our citizens, we strongly advise that the following pledge be presented for signature to every candidate, and that our ministers announce from the pulpit the stand each candidate in that riding has taken:

PLEDGE.

Question: (a) Are you in favor of the prohibition of the traffic in intoxicating beverages?

(b) If elected to the House of Commons, will you do all in your power irrespective of party ties to support a resolution against the continuation of the liquor traffic, or a bill founded on the same for its suppression?

2. We would heartily commend to our people such candidates as may be already in the field as avowed prohibitionists.

3. We beg to call the attention of Conference to the existence of the bar in the House of Parliament at Ottawa, and we recommend Conference to memorialize the Dominion Parliament for the abolition of this disgrace to our legislative halls.

4. Your Committee are convinced that lack of organization has been a fatal weakness in our temperance work in the past, and recognizing well that we stand opposed to a traffic that is wealthy, unscrupulous, well organized, and fighting for its life, we recommend as our only hope of success the prompt and efficient organization of the temperance workers in connection with every Church, for active participation in municipal, provincial and Dominion elections, and that Conference appoint a com-

mittee to consist of six laymen and six ministers to frame a constitution for such an organization, and report at next Conference.

5. The Conference last year called the attention of the Ontario Government to the fact that after the Cabinet had pledged itself to grant all the prohibition in its power, its representatives, the License Commissioners in London, violated this pledge by extending the hours of sale of intoxicating liquor from 10 p.m. to 11 p.m., and the Conference requested the Government to remedy the evil. We would call the attention of Conference to the fact that its request has been completely ignored, and the same commissioners have been reappointed. The hours of sale continue the same and threats of lengthening them have been made. We recommend that a second memorial be addressed to the Government by this Conference, setting forth the facts as stated above, and praying that the Government remove the cause of complaint, and the Secretary of this Conference be instructed to forward said memorial to the Secretary of State for Ontario.

6. We would lay stress also upon the importance of enlisting the youth of our land in the prohibition army, by means of Gospel Temperance Bands, Bands of Hope, etc., and particularly by instruction in the Sabbath School. We advise the submission of the pledge once a quarter in each school. The statistical report for this year reports 8,435 out of 44,904 scholars as having signed the pledge. We think this must be incorrect, and to secure a more correct return, we would suggest that another column be provided in the Sabbath School schedule for those who have signed the pledge during the year, leaving the present column for total in our schools who are pledged abstainers.

7. We desire to record our high appreciation of the zeal and unceasing efforts of our noble sisters of the Women's Christian Temperance Union, and we beg to assure them of our hearty sympathy, and we pledge them our cordial co-operation.

8. In regard to the communication from the Dominion Alliance we recommend that it be duly acknowledged by the Secretary of Conference, and that Conference appoint four of its number to act as members of the Council. We submit the following as the nominees of the Committee: Revs. W. McDonagh and I. B. Aylesworth, and Messrs. William Bowman and Robert Holmes.

9. Your Committee desire also to express its regret at the widespread prevalence of the tobacco habit, especially amongst the youth of our land, and we recommend that the poisonous effect of this narcotic be brought more frequently and more fully before our people, both from the pulpit and in the meetings of our young people's societies. At the same time we would express our deep conviction that this evil finds one of its strongest bulwarks in the example of those who are found in the ranks of our ministry and of our official members indulging in this habit, and we would humbly present to the Conference, that the time has come when every loyal minister and layman in our Church, the young men and the venerable fathers in Israel alike, should lay aside forever this badge of bondage to the flesh.

REPORT OF CONFERENCE SPECIAL COMMITTEE, 1895-96.

The Conference Special Committee for the year 1895-96 met at the call of the President, in the Colborne Street Church, London, October 22nd, 1895, the Rev. Dr. Williams, President of Conference, in the chair. All the members of the Committee were present excepting Rev. W. W. Shepherd and J. R. Gundy.

In the case of T. A. Patterson, a probationer from Ridgeway District, permitted to attend college without aid, it was resolved, on motion of Rev. J. Learoyd, seconded by Rev. R. C. Parsons, that the Treasurer be instructed to make arrangements with Rev. Dr. Potts for the payment of Bro. Patterson's college requirements. In the case of A. I. Brown asking permission to remain out of college on account of illness, no action was taken.

On motion of Rev. Dr. Willoughby, the President, Rev. Dr. Williams, was requested to preach the ordination sermon next Conference.

On motion of Rev. A. Cunningham, seconded by Rev. Dr. Hannon, the Secretary was instructed, on behalf of the Conference Special and Missionary Committees, to forward to Bro. J. R. Gundy, the following letter of condolence:

"That whereas it has pleased Almighty God in His wise and inscrutable providence, to sorely afflict the Rev. J. R. Gundy, an honored and beloved member of this Conference, and to remove to the home of the blood-washed, first his gifted son Joseph, and then his youngest daughter Lillie in the morning of her early womanhood; therefore be it

Resolved,—That we desire to express our profound and heartfelt sympathy with our Bro. Gundy and his esteemed wife, and earnestly and unitedly pray that the consolations of divine grace may abound toward them in this hour of their great sorrow and trial, and that the now afflicted members of the family may be speedily restored."

MANITOBA SCHOOL SYSTEM.

 Whereas, the Dominion Government seems determined to force the so-called Remedial Measure establishing Separate Schools on the young Province of Manitoba, notwithstanding the protests of its people expressed so forcibly by the Legislature of the Province; and whereas, the purpose of the Dominion Government by this course at the dictation of the Romish hierarchy has brought this Separate School question to an acute and dangerous point in the political life of our country; and whereas, it becomes the duty of every Protestant lover of civil and religious liberty, irrespective of his party political affinities, to withstand the encroachment of the Romish Church in its demands for special educational and sectarian privileges; and whereas, the hierarchy has shown by its late mandement that they seek to control the electorate of the Dominion for the educational and political purposes of Romanism; therefore, be it
Resolved,—That the London Conference of the Methodist Church now assembled in the city of Stratford, desires to enter its emphatic protest against any interference in the educational affairs of the Province of Manitoba by the establishment therein of Separate Schools at the dictation of the hierarchy of the Romish Church.

SOME RESOLUTIONS OF BAY OF QUINTE CONFERENCE.

On motion of Rev. Dr. Antliff, seconded by Rev. John Learoyd, the subjoined resolutions from the Bay of Quinte Conference were adopted:
 Moved by Rev. F. B. Stratton, and seconded by Rev. W. J. Crothers, D.D., that whereas, notice of application has been given by Messrs. Wyld & Bradly, Barristers, Ottawa, to incorporate a religious body to be

known as the Wesleyan Methodist Connexion of Canada; and whereas, "The Methodist Church," by Act of Parliament, has been incorporated by the union, first of the Wesleyan Methodist Church and the New Connexion Methodist Church, under the name of the Methodist Church of Canada, and subsequently by the union of this Church with the Methodist Episcopal Church, the Bible Christian Church, and the Primitive Methodist Church; and whereas, R. C. Horner, formerly a member of the Methodist Church, now seeks, through his counsel, an Act to incorporate a religious body, adopting the name of one of the bodies now by Act of Parliament composing the Methodist Church; therefore,

Resolved.—1. That we, the members of the Bay of Quinte Conference of the Methodist Church in Conference assembled, while admitting the right of any man or any body of men to seek such favors from Parliament as he or they may desire, would most vigorously protest against the action now proposed, asking Parliament to give its sanction to the organization of a religious body holding the name of one of the former bodies, which by their Act has been incorporated in this united Church. 2. That a copy of this resolution be sent at once to the Conferences now in session, and later to any other Conferences yet to meet, asking their action thereon. 3. That a copy of said resolution be forwarded to Rev. Dr. Carman, General Superintendent of the Methodist Church, with the request that he take such action as he may deem advisable under Discipline, page 46, par. 101.

WOODWARD'S CHURCH PROPERTY.

ANNUAL ADDRESS

OF THE LONDON CONFERENCE OF THE METHODIST
CHURCH TO THE SOCIETIES UNDER ITS CARE.

DEARLY BELOVED BRETHREN,—We, the ministers of your Conference, who are over you in the Lord, and who earnestly watch for your souls, as those who must give account, send you as usual from our Annual Conference Assembly, words of affectionate greeting; also of exhortation to everything that is good and useful in the service of our common Lord.

We give thanks unto God, and the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, praying always for you, and desiring that ye might be filled with the knowledge of His will in all wisdom and spiritual understanding, and that ye might walk worthy of the Lord unto all pleasing, being fruitful in every good work, and increasing in the knowledge of God. The records of success and failure are before us, and from errors of judgment, mistakes, shortcomings, and imperfect service rendered we may learn to be cautious, and not overestimate the value of agencies or methods; but the remembrance of successes, spiritual victories evidenced in aggressive work, should inspire us with enthusiasm and hope for the prosecution of the great mission of the Church, the spread of "Scriptural holiness throughout the land." Methods, modes of operation, largely controlled by local circumstances, may change, but principles never, specially those essential to truth and duty, and our obligation to God and man; they are always the same. The sand-hill may shift and scatter, easily affected by wind or wave, and the pool may dry up in the heat of summer, but the mountain retains its place and form from one generation to another, and the river runs in the same channel from century to century, and so it is with that which affects the life, character and eternal destiny of our race. Surface things, the things of earth around us, change and fade away, but the conditions of our proper relations to God, and the duties belonging to that relationship, remain the same with the lapse of every passing year. We would urge upon you a loving remembrance and unwavering attachment to our *connexional system*. It is our boast as a Church that we are *connexional* rather than congregational. We see in this one of the most effective of the natural elements of our power and success. There *need* not be, there *must* not be, any conflict between local and *connexional* interests. Let loyalty and fidelity to your own local prosperity abide with you as a perpetual virtue, but let it be in subservience to the interests of the *Connexion* as a whole. We cannot but regard the success of our Zion in the places most remote from you, as your own success, and regard her sufferings, no matter where they may be, as your own sufferings, and let the reserve forces of your life flow out toward them for the removal of their causes.

We would remind you that the most important factor in our connexionalism is the *itinerancy*, and ask for it your consideration and hearty support. In order to its greater efficiency it is necessary that mutual love and confidence, as the gifts of heaven, should ever remain between you as the servants of God, and us as your servants in the Lord. If we are suspected of ruling in the household of God with severity, and if there be a disposition anywhere to ignore the action and resist the findings of those who are administering the affairs of the Church according to its recognized constitution, nothing but disaster can be the result. And nothing perhaps, at present, is so threatening to our prosperity as the difficulty of harmonizing the privilege accorded to the circuits with the exercise of the legitimate functions and responsibilities of the stationing authority of our Church.

If moderate procedure on our part is not met with moderate demand on yours, and with submission betimes to things that may not be quite in accordance with your wishes, but which are done for the best interests of the work at large and for the glory of God, there will be room for dissatisfaction and distrust, and the work of the Lord must suffer in consequence. Self-denial, without which you cannot be His disciples, nor be worthy of the name or place of a minister of the Gospel, is a virtue just as needful in the life of the membership, and that shines among them with as bright a lustre wherever it exists; while the want of it brings the individual or the congregation into public disrepute. Those who most strenuously contend for the accomplishment of their purposes are not usually regarded as amongst the holiest or strongest of men.

While extending our hearty thanks for the generous support you have hitherto given to all our connexional funds, we venture to ask for the enlargement of your liberality, and the steadfastness of your endeavor in that direction, especially on behalf of our Missionary Society, our educational institutions and our Superannuation Fund.

We do not desire to minimize your liberality for the extension of the Kingdom of Christ along the lines of missionary effort, yet we feel constrained to say that in the light of the sacrifices of the Cross, and of the Master's claim upon us and our ability to respond to those claims, what has been done is only the merest fraction of what *might* have been done and what *should* have been done, and we cannot consistently ask for the Lord's acceptance of the imperfect sacrifices of the past without expressing the purpose of a fuller consecration for the future. If the world is ever to be converted to Christ, the Christian Church, and we as a part of it, must look and labor for a great revival, and seek to be baptized with the spirit of increased liberality.

For the same reason we invoke your liberal aid on behalf of our institutions of learning. While Christianity never was and never can be dependent on intellectual culture, she requires and should receive the best we can possibly place upon her altar, and the consecration to her service of the highest and best furnished intellectual endowments.

That Church which has the best and most thoroughly equipped educational facilities will command the greatest respect, and, provided it is evangelical, will wield the greatest influence for good. As a Church we are happy to say we have the facilities, and that we have no fear about

their maintenance, since the larger part of their endowment consists in the ability of our people to contribute annually to their support.

The recent changes in the legislation of the Church on the Superannuation Fund, placing a heavier tax on the ministers, and thereby proportionately relieving the circuits, must commend itself to your approval and hearty support, and we hope that no circuit will fail to meet its obligations and thereby relieve the minister in charge from suffering the penalty of such delinquency. Especially when you consider that when a great many of our ministers who have spent their strength in your service come to the weakness of age, their claim on this Fund is their only safety from positive want.

Moreover, brethren, we pray you to consider your duty as citizens and your power as the largest Protestant Church in the Dominion, in relation to the social and moral questions that come within the sphere of legislation. Your franchise is one of your most sacred trusts, and should be used with the utmost thoughtfulness and care, and according to the dictates of a sanctified conscience. You have it largely in your power to affect the legislation of your country in this way on behalf of Temperance, Sabbath observance, and the just regulation of the country's educational interests. If you do this according to the measure of your responsibility and power, you must regard measures before party, principle before policy or expediency, and truth and righteousness before the interests of any political party. Methodism recognizes no uniformity of political creed. As a Church it abides by its proper work of saving men and refuses collective political action. The law of peace requires each individual, while voting for the representative whom he may judge most worthy, to leave others in the spirit of true freedom to act in like manner. There is a supreme obligation to guard against the bitterness of party spirit, and to shun the manifold temptations incident to political strife. A policy truly Christian, subordinating the schemes of mere party to the great principles on which our national welfare depends, is one of the most urgent necessities of the times. It is the duty of the Christian elector to do his utmost to introduce into the Legislature representatives who, believing in the God of nations, and in the relations of the Gospel to national affairs, may be trusted with that Protestantism to which under Divine Providence the British Empire owes her greatness. We accord to all our fellow-subjects the rights of a patriotic citizenship, but we have not ceased to regard popery as the foe of freedom, of the Gospel, and of the rights of nations, and history will not allow us to forget how it has shed "the blood of the martyrs," and how it degrades the people subject to its sway. Present events disclose its unaltered policy in our great Dominion to advance by stealthy steps to an ascendancy which would subvert the Protestant foundations of the British Constitution, and eclipse the light of gospel truth and liberty. While shaking your "hands from holding of bribes," exemplify in your individual action as citizens "whatsoever things are true," "honest," "just," "pure," "lovely," "and of good report."

Permit us affectionately to warn you, brethren beloved, against the worldiness of the present age. Self-indulgence, luxury, the love of money, are the bane of our civilization and the peril of our Christianity.

A style of living, the very reverse of Gospel self-denial, leads vast numbers to "many foolish and hurtful lusts"—the tendency to abandon self to carnal indulgence when the hours of business are over, never arousing itself to the work of Christ, and leaving the week-evening worshippers in God's house but a small minority of a multitude who yet profess the hope of worshipping God forever.

Remember that Christianity is primarily concerned with this world, and its mission is to bring to pass here a kingdom of righteousness and to rescue from the evil one and redeem all our social relations, and there can be no peace with the world only on its unconditional surrender to Christ, and we do not hesitate to say if there is no surrender there must be no alliance. We must guard well our attitude and relation to the world and make no compromise with sin. The remedy for this worldliness and passion for questionable amusement is not more law but more life, not an improved discipline but submission to what we have. Get the power of life into the souls on our registers and the power of death has no place. Against malaria, it is said, the best resistance is higher vitality. Against worldliness we need more than legislation, there must be inspiration. Instead of making fences to keep out the cold we must build larger fires.

We hail with no small degree of satisfaction and gratitude the better organization of the young people of the Church, both in Sunday School and Epworth League and kindred affiliated societies, and their consecration in the Master's service, and never cease to pray that to them, and through them, the baptism of the Holy Ghost may be largely given as the essential qualification for aggressive work in the salvation of our youth.

You will rejoice with us that the returns for the year show a net increase in the membership of the Church of (1,272) over twelve hundred and seventy, and yet considering the vastness of the field and the number of church organizations we must feel humbled that the increase is so small. Our connexional funds report a decrease of over one thousand and eighty dollars.

Suffer the word of exhortation as we urge to fuller consecration to the service of Him who took upon him the form of a servant. For the cultivation of your personal piety and the working out of your resting to eternal life we beseech of you to cling fast to the doctrines and usages of the Methodist Church, our class-meetings, prayer-meetings, the public services of the Sabbath, the sacrament of the Lord's Supper in remembrance of our redemption. And now unto Him who is able to keep you from falling and to present you faultless before the presence of His glory with exceeding joy, to the only wise God our Saviour, be glory and honor, dominion and power, both now and ever. Amen."
