→STATEMENT OF SESSION

The Session with pleasure call attention to the encouraging progress that has been made in the several departments of Christian activity during the year.

Through the adoption of the envelope system the Managers are able to present an exceedingly satisfactory financial statement.

The Young People's Mission Band also report a gratifying increase in the contributions to the schemes of the church.

Sabbath School work has been carried on with earnestness on the part of the Teachers and Officers, and, we trust, with blessings to the scholars.

During the year an Auxiliary of the Women's Foreign Missionary Society has been organized, and we have no doubt that, with the blessing of God, the Society will meet a long felt want, and accomplish great things in the future history of the congregation. We bid it God speed.

A number of families have removed from within the bounds of the congregation, but others have come forward to fill their places.

As can be seen by the Clerk's report, 65 members have been added to the communion roll—a very gratifying increase. It is to be regretted, however, that some names had to be removed from the roll for non-attendance at the means of grace.
