THE COLONIAL AND INDIAN EXHIBITION

is to be held in LONDON, England, commencing

May 1st, 1886, and continuing until the 31st of

October, 1886. Having for object to mark an epoch in

the history of the world, and to show the progress of

civilization, the Exhibition is divided into two parts, the

first being devoted to the products of the soil, and the

second to the products of the arts and manufactures.

The very large space of 5000 square feet has been

allotted to the Dominion of Canada by the Imperial

Government. His Royal Highness, the Prince of Wales, has

been appointed President of the Exhibition. The

Exhibition is to be purely colonial and Indian, and

nothing but the products of the soil and the arts and

manufactures of the colonies will be admitted. The

it would have been his proudest

duty to serve his country. But to

serve as a slave, as he was, he

never could; nor honor his
