SERG. FOWLER ARRESTED

ON A CHARGE OF PERJURY

NIAGARA FALLS, N. Y., March 16—Sergeant Robert J. Fowler, 44 years old, of the New York Central railroad special police, was arrested late yesterday afternoon on a warrant issued by Police Judge Piper, charging perjury. Solomon Mokhiber is the complainant.

Last June Mokhiber and Herman Geese, who were employed by the New York Central, were arrested on charges of petit larceny. Fowler testified that they were connected with a theft of underwear from freight cars in the north end yards. They were discharged by Police Judge Piper, but lost their positions with the railroad and were unable to get back.

An organization of railroadmen took up the cudgels in behalf of the two men in an effort to have them reinstated. A week ago William Stroh, a former detective under Fowler, and

Herman Geese, a special policeman, testified at a John Doe proceeding before Judge Piper that Fowler had framed Mokhiber and Shear. Judge Piper reserved decision in the case and in the meantime, Mokhiber obtained a warrant for Fowler's arrest.

Fowler was admitted to bail last evening by Justice Alonzo G. Hinkley at Buffalo on application of John Maloney, the Central's police chief, and Inspector Smith of Albany. He was released and ordered to appear for a hearing in police court here this morning.

Following a protracted illness, Mr. William Banks, Sr. died at the Wellesly Hospital, Toronto, at noon yesterday. Recently gangrene poisoning set in in the right leg and on Saturday he was removed from his home, 70 Dewson street, to the hospital, where this limb was amputated at the knee. In his weakened condition he never rallied, and passed peacefully away about the noon hour. He had been connected with Toronto newspapers for many years.

INFRINGING ON RIGHTS TO PASS EIGHT HOUR DAY LAW

OTTAWA, March 16—The Dominion Parliament, generally speaking, has no right to enact an eight-hour day law, in the opinion of Minister of Justice Hon. C. J. Doherty. He gave this as his personal opinion when the subject was under discussion in the house last night as the result of a resolution brought in by J. H. Burnham, (Peterboro). However, the British North America Act, he believed that if Canada entered into some treaty under which it was bound to enact some particular legislation Parliament would have power to legislate for the purpose of giving effect to such an obligation.

Hon. Mr. Doherty said that on the question of legislative jurisdiction there were some very strong opinions held by those who speak for some of the provinces adverse to that which he had expressed. In view of that condition of affairs, he said it might become necessary to have the question authoritatively passed upon.

Explain Treaty Provisions

Both Hon. Mr. Doherty and Hon. Newton W. Rowell, President of the Privy Council, were careful to explain where responsibility of Parliament on the question of the eight-hour day began, and where it ended. "The provisions of the Peace Treaty," Mr. Doherty said, "do not impose upon the nations an obligation to treat jointly law the particular conventions adopted. The obligation, as set forth is that the respective governments will bring before the competent authorities a convention for the enactment of legislation or other action."

It goes no further than that. The convention goes on to point out that if that competent authority does not adopt legislation, or does not act there is no further obligation upon the country."

Thus when the convention entered into officially reaches the Government it will fulfill its obligation if it refers the matter to the Provincial Legislatures; that is providing it still finds that it has no jurisdiction. If the province takes no action the Federal authorities have no further responsibility. However, should the Dominion Government fail to carry out its obligation by submitting the convention to the proper authorities, an economic boycott could be declared against the country, it was explained by M. Rowell.

A joint meeting of the Merriton and Thorold councils was held in the Merriton council chamber to discuss the advisability of making representations to the Minister of Highways in an endeavor to have the Provincial Highway to Niagara Falls pass through Merriton and Thorold. The discussion on this important question was brief and to the point, the meeting decided upon the appointment of a deputation to wait upon the Minister and Deputy-Minister of Highways urging that the Provincial Highway be brought from the Queenston and Grimsby road along Hartzel road through Merriton and Thorold and on to Niagara Falls, providing the government pay the same proportion of construction and maintenance costs as to rural municipalities.

He announced he was to meet Sam Langford of Boston and Harry Wills of New Orleans, and also made the statement, which sporting men here refused to take seriously, that Jack Dempsey had agreed to box him in Tia Juana.

N. S. & T. MAY BE TAKEN OVER BY THE HYDRO

LONDON, ONT., March 16—Though he sees no reason why construction should not be undertaken as soon as possible to carry out the expressed wishes of the people for Hydro Radial on the Toronto and Eastern, Toronto Hamilton and Niagara, and Guelph, Galt, Hamilton, Niagara lines, Sir Adam Beck last night said an attitude of high-handedness on the part of the Hydro Electric Power Commission has not been and shall not be assumed.

Sir Adam referred to a statement attributed to him concerning his plans for immediate Hydro-Radial construction.

"That statement would indicate high-handedness, and that is not the impression that I wished to convey," Sir Adam said. "It is the wish of the Hydro Electric Power Commission to work in friendly co-operation with the Federal Government and to avoid unnecessary duplication by acquiring lines which Dominion Cabinet Ministers have said will be made available to the Hydro through amicable negotiations."

Little however, can be done in this connection until the railways are taken over. Sir Adam hears that this may occur on April 1. In respect to the Provincial Government, Sir Adam stated that many preliminary arrangements must be made and the full sanction of the government secured before such work as he believes should be proceeded with can be actually undertaken.

Votes Yet To Be Taken

On the Guelph line, votes have yet to be taken in two or three municipalities, while in all cases municipal authorities must sign the contracts with the Hydro Electric Power Commission and issue their debentures as collateral. The authority of the government to take the next step must then be secured and the Government's decision to guarantee the Hydro Radial bonds is a pre requisite. Then before any actual work can be done the Hydro Electric Power Commission must arrange for financing the projects.

It is possible that some time will be consumed if an odd municipality should fail to carry its by-law. This occurred in the recent Windsor and Essex radial acquisition, and the other corporations concerned had to arrange to assume such shares pro rata. On the Toronto and Eastern line the scheme has the approval of the people in each of the municipalities, but negotiations with the Government for exercising a verbal option to sell to the Hydro Electric Power Commission must be undertaken. On the Toronto-Niagara line there will also be negotiations with the Federal Government to avoid duplication by acquiring the St. Catharines railway. Conference With Government

After votes have been taken in the municipalities on the Guelph-Galt line referred to by Sir Adam there must be a conference with the Dominion Government before construction can begin. It is proposed to avoid duplication by acquiring Grand Trunk branch lines and Sir Adam stated that Dominion ministers have indicated their readiness to co-operate to his end. Little however can be done until the Government actually assumes definite control of the G. T. R. systems.

The projects which have advanced

to a stage to warrant early action are given by Sir Adam as the Toronto and Eastern. The Toronto-Hamilton Niagara and Guelph lines. The people he said, have voted for them. They are anxious for them, and steps must be taken to facilitate action on their wishes.

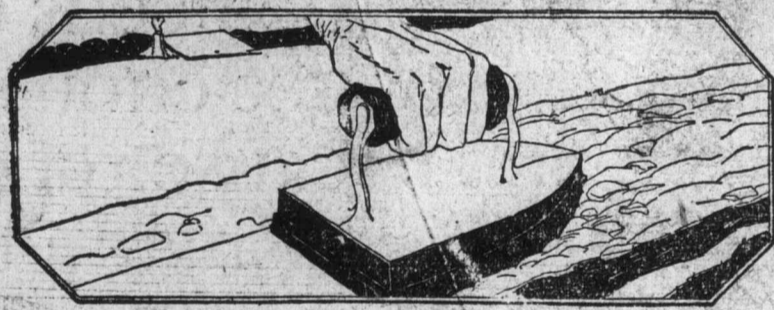

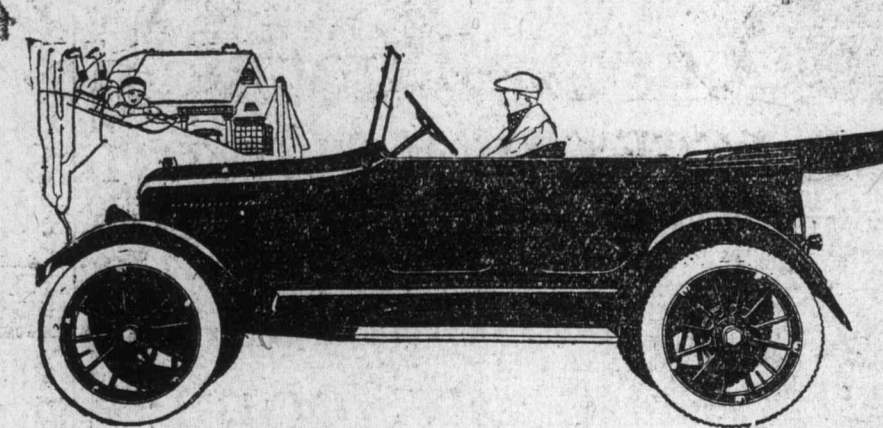
