CANADIAN ROUTE FROM EUROPE TO CHINA.—A new route from Great Britain to Australia has recently been proposed by Mr A. G. Dallas. Emigration from Great Britain.

The emigration last year from the United Kingdom was less than any year since 1862, being only 195,953, which was 8,929 less than the preceding year, and 15,882 less than the average of the four previous years. Of the 195,953, 55,494 were English, 88,622 Irish, 12,866 Scotch, and 31,193 foreigners. 159,275 went to the United States; the Irish being rather less than one half of the whole number, and nine-tenths of the whole number leaving Ireland. In fact, of the 159,275 emigrants who went to the United States from the United Kingdom, there were 79,571 Irish. The remainder of the Irish emigrants were divided pretty equally between British North America and Australia.
