LOW DEATH RATE IN JUNE.

NO DEATHS FROM TYPHOID OR SCARLET FEVER.

Diphtheria Only Carried On Seven Victims—There Were Five Drownings and Three Fatal Accidents. Two By the Trolley—Analysis of the Returns From the City Cemeteries.

The mortality returns for the past month conclusively prove the healthy state of the city. There were fewer deaths from contagious and infectious diseases than had been recorded during the past nine months.

AT THE CITY CEMETERIES. June 26. June 27. June 28. June 29. June 30.

These figures show a slight increase—8—over the deaths in June last year, and a decrease of 22 compared with the total for the month of May this year.

ANALYSIS OF THE RETURNS.

At Mount Pleasant there was a decrease of five interments compared with June last year, and a decrease of 19 in the figure for May last. Of the 50 interred in the past four weeks only seven were over 70 years of age; 19 were children. Amongst the certified cases of death were—pneumonia 4, heart disease 8, diphtheria 2, Bright's disease 2, and one each from apoplexy, gastric fever, phthisis, bronchitis and killed by trolley.
