It ments for the public service. It makes known to the House of Commons by its annual budget its necessities, and the House grants such acts or supplies as these necessities require. The crown demands money, the Commons grant it, and the Lords assent, and no money can be voted by Parliament for any purpose whatever except at the demand of the crown. No petition even for any sum of money relating to the public service can be received by Parliament unless recommended by the crown, On the other hand, no person can lend money to the crown, or to any department of state, without the sanction of Parliament, and all money transactions between without the sanction of Parliament, and all money transactions between the Bank of England and the Treasury are expressly forbidden. The Commons, of course, have the power of withholding supplies, but only once (in 1784) since the Revolution of 1688 has this power been exercised.
