Queens County carried the Scott's Emulsion Act by a majority. Five and a half million dollars of the public debt of the United States was paid off in the month of December.

The census of the United States, just completed, shows the population to be a little over 51,000,000. An important movement is being inaugurated for raising a new line of steamships, between Montreal, Quebec, Halifax, Sydney, St. Pierre, etc., and Havre, France.

The revenue for 1880.—The gross revenue of the United Kingdom for 1880 was £83,290,000. The receipts from Customs decreased during the year £482,000, and from Excise duties, £507,000.

A ball at Schwarzenberg, Saxony, a young man entered, having what appeared to be a cigar in his mouth. He went to the chandelier as if to light it, and a terrible explosion ensued. The lights were extinguished, the walls partly gave way, some of the dancers were covered with blood, and the young man was blown to pieces.

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THE ENGLISH MILITIA.—The Government has determined to call out the militia to fill the posts made vacant by the troops sent to Ireland and the Cape. The present generation of militiamen are ignorant of military life and are not to be relied upon in any emergency.

The twentieth quarterly session of the Annapolis County Degree Lodge, I. O. G. T., met at Melvern Square on the 28th ult. Owing to the inclemency of the weather the attendance was not so large as might be desired.

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Alarming Land Subsidence

The alarming subsidence of land at Dunkirk, near Northwick, England, still continues. In some parts of Northwick comparatively new houses are cracked from basement to the roof, and houses, which a few years ago were three feet beneath the level of the roadway, at Winford, a few miles from the scene of the recent subsidence, are now gradually sinking, and land yielding and giving place to immense lakes. Not since 1838 has such a subsidence occurred in the Cheshire salt districts.

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APPLAS ABROAD—The London Gardener

In Covent Garden I hear a very good account of Canadian apples, and was surprised to learn they were leading the American produce out of the field. There seems some reason for this, as the Canadian apples are better packed; the American barrels are usually "topped up," in market parlance—a layer or two of good fruit at the top, and the fruit of poor quality below. On the other hand, the Canadian fruit is generally fairly good throughout, the barrels are well packed, and considerably larger than those of the Americans.
