VICTORIA PRICES CURRENT.
Victoria, V. I., August 7th, 1860.

The market has been freely supplied, and a fair business has been transacted during the past fortnight, the demand being sufficient to give regularity and steadiness to prices of most staples. More than an average attendance of traders from British Columbia have been in town, and though great caution has been displayed, the aggregate of purchases made, foots up handsomely, particularly when we consider that at least 300 tons of goods have been placed at New Westminster directly from San Francisco within three weeks, and that the Bark Vickery is also loading in San Francisco for the same port. Notwithstanding this diversion, no falling off in the trade with Victoria is observable; on the other hand an increase has obtained, and our merchants were never better satisfied than with their present prospects. A great many express surprise at the large amount of business done this season, compared with last year with the sister colony, for if we except the Chinese there has been a very light immigration into British Columbia this year, via the mouth of Fraser river. When however, the discoveries on Rock Creek and the Similkameen river and in that vicinity, are taken into account, their contiguity to the line, and accessibility from Oregon are considered, and the large number who have been attracted from that State to those points, then diverging through the entire upper country, we need no longer wonder at the augmented and steadily increasing demand for goods.

The news from every district in the mines is all that could be wished. A large amount of gold dust is now in town awaiting shipment; at least over half of which will go forward by private hands. The amount reported by us as shipped through Express, though correct enough in so far as the carriers are concerned, is far short of the amount that actually leaves this port by every steamer, and does not give anything like a correct estimate of the yield of gold in the mines. We observe that the Government Assay office is at last in operation at New Westminster, but from the limited amount of business the office is likely to have for a long time, and their adoption of the very moderate scale of charges in San Francisco, it will be a very remote period indeed, before this institution is self supporting.

Rice has become quite scarce, there is no strictly No. 1, except that held by China Houses, who are holding at 6 1/2 cash—China sugar, ex Sea Nymph, has changed hands on private terms. Sandwich Island sugars remain firm, although there is a large stock in the market. Sales of ordinary Oregon flour in large lots at \$5.00. Draught Porter and Ale scarce and in demand. Mr. J. A. McCrea, auctioneer, reports several lots of China sugar at 7 1/2—200 mats No. 1 China

rice at 6 1/2—500 mats Batavia rematted suitable for packing, 5 1/2, 30 days. The sale of Mr. C. T. Millard's stock on Monday 30th July was quite spirited, and the goods brought their full market value.
