Explanation of the Articles of the Calendar.

These pages are calculated for Toronto, Quebec, Fredericton and Halifax, and for ordinary purposes will serve with sufficient accuracy for every city in the Dominion of Canada.

MOON'S PHASES.—This Table gives the times for the four meridians when the moon passes the geocentric longitudes of 0°, 90°, 180° and 270° east of the sun. It gives also the times of her greatest and least distance from the earth.

TWILIGHT.—In this table are given the times at which twilight begins in the morning and ends in the evening, i. e., the times when the sun's centre is 18° below the horizon.

GREATEST ELONGATION OF THE POLE STAR.—This column gives the greatest azimuth of the Pole Star east or west from the meridian as observed at a place in latitude 45°. When the greatest elongation corresponding to any other latitude is required, the number given in the column should be corrected by means of the following table.

The 1st correction for the degrees of latitude is to be subtracted from the greatest elongation given in the calendar, or added to it, according as the degrees of latitude are less or greater than 45°.

The 2nd correction, which is always additive, is found by multiplying the number given in the third line of the table by the number of minutes in the latitude.

THE PLANETS.—The times of rising and setting of the five chief planets are calculated for Toronto, and are corrected for refraction. The times of culmination, although computed for the meridian of Toronto, will serve approximately for the whole of Canada. The meridian zenith distances, being designed merely to aid in finding the planets, have been given only to the nearest tenth of a degree, as seen from the latitude of Toronto.

When the planetary day is shorter than the mean solar day, and commences soon after the midnight of the preceding day, the planet will sometimes arrive a second time on the meridian before the expiration of the actual civil day. From analogous causes a planet will sometimes rise twice or set twice in the same civil day. When two culminations occur in the same day, or two risings or settings, the times of both are registered.

The times of the SUN'S RISING AND SETTING are given for the upper limb, and are corrected for refraction for Toronto, Quebec, Fredericton and Halifax.

The civil times both for the rising and setting of the Moon's centre are given for every day for Toronto, Quebec, Fredericton and Halifax.

The MOON'S MERIDIAN ZENITH DISTANCES are given to the nearest tenth of a degree for Toronto. They are not corrected for parallax or refraction.

The column SUN ON MERIDIAN gives the time that a watch should shew when the shadow of a sun dial is on the noon mark.

MOON'S AGE.—This column shews to the nearest tenth of a day the Moon's age at Toronto Noon.

The column, MOON ON THE MERIDIAN, gives the mean time at which the moon's centre passes the meridian of Toronto, when in the column headed Moon's rising or setting or Moon on meridian the letters A.M. occur, unaccompanied by any number, they denote that the numbers given for the succeeding days relate to the morning, and those for the preceding days to the afternoon, but that the Moon does not rise or set or cross the meridian (as the case may be) on that day.

The column, UPPER TRANSIT OF POLE STAR shews for every day the mean time at which the Pole Star makes its upper transit across the meridian of Toronto. It passes in the morning from April 9 to October 9, and in the afternoon for the rest of the year. On October 9 there will be a second transit, occurring at 11h. 58m. 21a. p.m.

The five last columns, although computed for Toronto, will serve with sufficient accuracy for the whole of Canada.

The time at which the lower transit of the Pole Star occurs may be found by adding 11 h. 58 m. 2 s. to the time of its preceding upper transit.

From the time of the upper transit of the pole star may be found the time of its greatest western or eastern elongation, by adding or subtracting the constants given in the annexed Table.

Star Table.

From the times of the upper transit of the Pole Star may be derived, with the aid of the following table, the times of culmination, and of the rising and setting of the principal fixed stars, as seen from the parallel of 46° north latitude.

To ascertain when any star found in the following table will be on the meridian, add the number in the left-hand column of figures to the preceding meridian transit of the pole star given in the calendar. To find the time of rising of a star, subtract the number opposite to it in the right-hand column of figures from the time of its meridian passage. For the setting of a star, add the same number to the time of its meridian passage. Those stars marked (.....) revolve in a circle of perpetual apparition, and do not rise or set at places in and to the north of latitude 46°.

Eclipses.

In the year 1868 there will be two Eclipses of the Sun, and a Transit of Mercury over the Sun's disc.

I.—An annular eclipse of the Sun, February 22-23, 1868, invisible in Canada.

II.—A total eclipse of the Sun, August 17, 1868, invisible in Canada.

A transit of Mercury over the Sun's disc, November 4, 1868.

As viewed from the centre of the earth ;

The external contact at Ingress occurs November 4, 17h. 23m. 39s. }
 Least distance of centres 12' 15" 19h. 13m. 51s. } Greenwich mean time.
 External contact at egress 21h. 2m. 57s. }

At the times of ingress and egress respectively, the Sun will be in the zenith at the places whose positions are,

Longitude, $91^{\circ} 46'$ } East of Greenwich. Latitude $15^{\circ} 53'$
 $40^{\circ} 12'$ } $16^{\circ} 56'$

Both the ingress and the egress will occur between midnight and sunrise on the morning of November 5, and will consequently be invisible in Canada.

The Provincial Observatory is now attached to the University of Toronto, and is in the charge of Prof. Kingston, and three Assistants.

THE YEAR.

The length of the year is strictly expressed by the space of time required for the revolution of the earth round the sun—namely, 365 days, 5 hours, 48 minutes, 49 seconds, and 7 tenths of a second, for to such a nicety has this time been ascertained. But for convenience in reckoning, it has been found necessary to make the year terminate with a day instead of a fraction of one, lumping the fractions together so as to make up a day among themselves. About forty-five years before Christ, Julius Cæsar, having, by the help of Sosigenes, an Alexandrian philosopher, come to a tolerably clear understanding of the length of the year, decreed that every fourth year should be held to consist of 366 days, for the purpose of absorbing the odd hours. The arrangement he dictated was a rather clumsy one. A day in February, the sixth before the calends of March (*sextilis*), was to be repeated in that fourth year; and each fourth year was thus to be *bissextile*. It was as if we were to reckon the 23rd of February twice over. Seeing that, in reality, a day every fourth year is too much by 11 minutes, 10 seconds, and 3 tenths of a second, it inevitably followed that the beginning of the year moved onward ahead of the point at which it was in the days of Cæsar; in other words, the natural time fell behind the reckoning. From the time of the Council of Nice, in 325, when the vernal equinox fell correctly on the 21st of March, Pope Gregory found in 1582 that there had been an over-reckoning to the extent of ten days, and

now the vernal equinox fell on the 11th of March. To correct the past error, he decreed that the 5th of October that year should be reckoned as the 15th, and to keep the year right in future, the overplus being 18 hours, 37 minutes, and 10 seconds in a century, he ordered that every centesimal year that could not be divided by 4 (1700, 1800, 1900, 2100, 2200, &c.) should *not* be bissextile, as it otherwise would be; thus, in short, dropping the extra day three times every four hundred years. The Gregorian style, as it was called, readily obtained sway in Catholic, but not in Protestant countries. It was not adopted in Britain till the year 1752, by which time the discrepancy between the Julian and Gregorian periods amounted to eleven days. An act of parliament was passed, dictating that the 3rd of September that year should be reckoned the 14th, and that three of every four of the centesimal years should, as in Pope Gregory's arrangement, not be bissextile or leap-years. It has consequently arisen—1800 not having been a leap year—that the new and old styles now differ by twelve days, our first of January being equivalent to the 13th old style. In Russia alone, of all Christian countries, is the old style still retained; wherefore it becomes necessary for one writing in that country to any foreign correspondent, to set down his date thus: 24th March, or 25th September; 7th October; or, it may be, 25th December, 1860; 9th January, 1861.

HER MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY (ALEXANDRINA) VICTORIA.— By the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland Queen, Defender of the Faith Her Majesty, the only daughter and heir of the late Prince Edward, Duke of Kent, fourth son of King George III., and of Victoria-Maria Louisa (Princess Dowager of Saxe-Coburg and Gotha, and sister of the King of the Belgians) Her Majesty was born at Kensington Palace, on the 24th of May, 1819; baptised on the 24th of June, 1819, succeeded the throne on the demise of her uncle King William IV., 20th June, 1837; and was crowned at Westminster, on the 28th June, 1838. LETTER RATES

Letters posted in Canada addressed to any place within the Province pass, if prepaid, for 5 cents per ½ oz., but if posted unpaid such letters are charged 7 cents per ½ oz.

On Letters to Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, and Prince Edward's Island, the rate is 5 cents per ½ oz., with optional prepayment.

The rate on letters to the United Kingdom is, by Canadian Packet,
 Exceeding ½ oz. - - - - - 12½ cents.
 Exceeding " and not exceeding 1 oz. - - - 25 "

and so on, increasing one rate of postage for each additional half ounce.

And by Cunard Packet, 17 cents per ½ oz., &c.

Letters for the United Kingdom must be prepaid, or they will be charged a fine of 6d. sterling on delivery.

Letters for British Colonies and Possessions beyond Sea, and Foreign Countries, via England, must be prepaid. The rate on letters for the U. States, is 10 cents per ½ oz. " to Cuba - - - - - 20 cents per ½ oz.

There is a further charge on delivery of letters addressed to British Columbia.

Letters - - - - - 10 cents per ½ oz.
 Newspapers - - - - - 2 cents each.

MAILS FOR CANADA FROM ENGLAND.

Two Ocean Steamers carrying mails for Canada leave Liverpool in each week, viz.: a Canadian Packet on every Thursday, via Derry on Friday, sailing to Quebec in summer and Portland in Winter, by which the Postage rate is 6d. stg. per ½ oz.; and a Cunard Packet every Saturday, via Cork on Sunday, bringing Mails for Canada, alternately to Boston and New York, by which the Postage rate to Canada is 8d. stg. per ½ oz.

The British Post Office forwards letters to Canada by the first packet sailing after the letter is posted, unless the letters bear a special direction—"By Canadian Packet" or "By British Packet"—and in that case they are kept over for the Packet designated. "By Canadian Mail" is not a distinctive superscription; for any Mail for Canada is a "Canadian Mail," by whatever Packet forwarded.

REGISTRATION OF LETTERS.

Persons posting Letters containing value, should be careful to require them to be registered, and to obtain from the Post Master a Certificate of receipt for Registration.

The charge for Registration, in addition to the Postage, is as follows, viz.:

On Letters to any other place in Canada, or British North America - - - - - 2 cents.
 On Letters for the United States - - - - - 5 "
 On Letters for the United Kingdom - - - - - 8 "
 On Letters for British Colonies or Possessions, sent via England - - - - - 25 "

On Letters for France and other Foreign Countries, via France an amount equal to the postage rate.

Both the postage charge and registration fee must in all cases be prepaid.

Registration is not an absolute guarantee against the miscarriage or loss of a Letter; but a Registered Letter

can be traced when an Unregistered Letter cannot, and the posting and delivery or non-delivery can be proven. A Registered Letter is thus secured against many of the casualties which, from incorrect address, forgetfulness of the receiver, or other error, may affect an Unregistered Letter.

MISCELLANEOUS CHARGES.

The charge on Parcels by the Parcel Post, which is limited to places within the Dominion, is 25 cts. per lb. (with 3 cts. additional if Registered).

One cent per oz. payable in advance by Postage stamp, is the rate on Printed Circulars (Printed Circulars, if sent in envelopes, whether sealed or unsealed, are liable to letter postage). Prices Current, Hand Bills and other Printed Matter of a like character, and on Books, bound or unbound, when posted at a Canadian Post office addressed to any place in Canada, British North America generally, or the United States.

The postage upon Prices Current addressed to the United Kingdom is two cents each, which must be prepaid by postage stamps, or they will be sent to the Dead Letter Office to be returned to the sender.

These rates must invariably be prepaid on transmission from Canada. Photographs, provided they are not upon glass or in cases containing glass, may be forwarded to Great Britain, &c., at the Book rate of postage. Book Packets addressed to the United Kingdom may be registered on payment of the ordinary registration fee, viz., 5 cents in addition to the postage.

All book packets must be open at both ends or both sides to allow of the inspection of the contents.

NEWSPAPERS AND PERIODICALS.

Newspapers published in Canada may be sent by Post from the office of publication, addressed to any place in Canada, at the following rates, if paid quarterly in advance by either the publisher at the post office where the papers are posted, or by the subscriber at the delivering post office:

When the above rates are not paid in advance by either publisher or subscriber, such Papers are charged one cent each on delivery.

TRANSIENT NEWSPAPERS.

Transient Newspapers—that is to say, Canadian Newspapers posted otherwise than from the office of publication, and American or British papers posted or re-posted in Canada, must be prepaid 1 cent each, by postage stamp, or they cannot be forwarded—except only British Newspapers distributed to regular subscribers by Canadian Booksellers or News Agents—such papers pass free as they would do if received in the Canadian Packet Mails.

NEWSPAPERS BY MAIL FROM ENGLAND OR UNITED STATES.

Newspapers received from England by the Canadian Packet Mails are delivered free.

Newspapers from England by the Cunard Packet Mails are charged 2 cents each on delivery. (This is the American transit charge.)

United States Newspapers, brought by mail into Canada, are charged one cent each on delivery.

PERIODICAL PUBLICATIONS.

There are on all Periodicals, other than Newspapers, passing by mail in Canada, save such as may be addressed to or received from the United Kingdom, and such as are exempted from postage by Statute, will hereafter be one cent per 1 oz. weight of package containing periodical matter, whether the package contain one or more numbers.

Any fraction of 4 oz. to be charged as a full rate.

On Periodicals posted from the office of publication or by News Agents or Booksellers, to regular subscribers within the Province, this rate may remain to be collected on delivery, and must in such cases be marked upon the packages and charged in the Letter Bills, but when mailed to go out of the Province such Periodical matter must be prepaid by Postage Stamp. British and United States Periodicals may be posted in Canada by News Agents and Booksellers to regular subscribers in the Province under this regulation.

Transient Periodical matter posted in Canada must in all cases be prepaid by Postage Stamp.

The above rate will be payable on delivery on all Periodical matter received from the United States, except that Canadian Editors may receive Exchange Periodicals from the United States free of Canadian Postage.

Periodicals, printed and published in Canada, may be posted addressed to any place in the United Kingdom by Canadian Packet, on prepayment by Postage Stamp of two cents each number.

This rate will be applicable to all classes of Canadian Periodicals posted as above for the United Kingdom, the exemptions to which certain classes of Canadian Periodicals are entitled, extending to such numbers only, as are addressed from the Office of publication to places within the Province.

No package of periodicals can be sent through the Post if it exceed 45 oz. in weight.

POSTAGE RATES ON MISCELLANEOUS MATTER.

Patterns or samples of merchandise and goods for sale may be posted in Canada to be forwarded to any place within the Province, on prepayment by postage stamp of a rate of one cent, per ounce, under the following regulations:

Patterns or samples must be sent in covers open at the ends, so as to be easy of examination. Samples however of seeds, drugs, and so forth, which cannot be sent in open covers, may be enclosed in bags of linen or other material, fastened in such a manner that they may be readily opened; or in bags entirely closed, provided that they be transparent, so that the officers of the Post Office may be able to satisfy themselves as to the nature of the contents.

The Packet may bear on the outside the address of the sender, in addition to the address of the person for whom it may be intended; also a trade mark and numbers, and the price of the article enclosed; inside, there must be no enclosure but the samples or patterns themselves; the particulars however of the trade marks, numbers and price, may be marked on the articles themselves, instead of on the outside of the Packet, at the option of the sender.

Any sample or pattern Packet containing a letter, or otherwise violating the conditions of the preceding rules, will be rated and treated as a letter.

The rate of one cent, per ounce is to be pre paid by postage stamp, and, if such rate be not fully pre-paid by the stamps affixed, the Packet is to be rated with the deficient postage and a fine of five cents in addition.

Packets of samples and patterns may be registered on prepayment by postage stamp of a registration fee of 5 cents in addition to the postage rate, and provided such Packets be duly handed in to the post office for registration.

No Packet of samples or patterns must exceed one pound in weight.

These regulations apply only to the transmission of Packets of samples and patterns within the Province of Canada, and will not in any manner interfere with the regulations governing the exchange of samples and patterns with the United Kingdom, or with the foreign countries to which the same advantage extends, namely, France, Belgium, Italy, German States, and Denmark.

No provision as yet exists for the exchange of such matter with the other British Provinces or Colonies, with the United States or with other foreign countries than those above named.

Book manuscript, and printers' proof-sheets (whether corrected or not), maps, prints, drawings, engravings, photographs when not on glass or in cases containing glass, and sheet music (whether printed or written), may pass in covers open at the ends or sides, and provided that no letter, or other communication intended to serve the purpose of a letter, be enclosed therein, on pre-payment, when posted in Canada, by postage stamp of the ordinary printed matter rate of one cent, per ounce; or upon payment of that rate on delivery of such matter when received in the mails from the United States.

POSTAGE OF BOOKS, PATTERNS AND SAMPLES.

Patterns of merchandise, and samples, may be forwarded between Canada and the United Kingdom, France, Italy, and the German States, by the Canadian Packet mails, at book post rates, and subject to the following conditions:

There must be no writing or printing other than the address of the person for whom the packet is intended, the manufacturer's or trade mark and number, and price of the article.

Any infringement of the above regulations will render the packet liable to be treated and charged as a letter.

Samples of seeds, drugs, and similar articles intended for delivery within the United Kingdom, are now allowed to be sent in bags entirely closed, provided such bags be transparent, so that the officers of the Post Office may be able to satisfy themselves of the contents.

The rule which prohibited the transmission through the Post, as patterns, of articles of cutlery, &c., has been rescinded; and scissors, knives, razors, forks, steel pens, nails, keys, watch machinery, metal tubing, pieces of metal or ore, and such like articles, are now allowed to be forwarded by the Post as samples, provided they be packed and guarded in so secure a manner as to afford complete protection to the contents of the mail bags, and to the persons of the officers of the Post Office. Such articles, however, must be so packed that they may be easily examined; and it is made a rule that any packet containing such articles, which may be found to be insufficiently guarded, shall not be forwarded through the Post.

None of the articles named in the next preceding paragraph may be sent as patterns or samples to any place abroad, except Germany, Belgium, and the British Colonies, and not to these places when addressed *via* France.

A packet of patterns or samples sent to France, must not exceed 16 inches in length, width or depth; a packet to any other place abroad must not exceed 24 inches in length or 12 inches in breadth or depth.

A packet of patterns or samples sent to Germany or Belgium must not exceed 8 oz. in weight.

No Packet of patterns or samples must exceed 24 oz. in weight.

Bags entirely closed, even though they may be transparent, must not be used for the transmission of seeds to foreign parts.

No prints or printed matter will be allowed to pass by book post between the United Kingdom and Canada, unless printed on paper, parchment or vellum.

All the Money Order Post Offices in Canada are authorized to draw Money Orders on each other for any sum up to \$100, and for as many Orders of \$100 each as the Applicant may require, upon the following terms, viz:—

MONEY ORDERS ON THE LOWER PROVINCES.

The Canadian Money Order Offices draw also upon all Money Order Offices in Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, Prince Edward Island and Newfoundland. The Orders, like those of the United Kingdom, are made payable in sterling money, and for sums up to £10 sterling. The terms are:—

For Orders up to £5 - - - - - 25 cents.
over £5, and up to £10 - - - - - 50 cents.

The Money Order Post Offices are furnished with Lists of all the Money Order Offices in Canada, the United Kingdom, Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, Prince Edward Island and Newfoundland; and the Postmasters are instructed to afford every information in their power, in respect of the places upon which they draw, together with any other information relating to such issues as the intending Remitters may desire.

POSTAGE STAMPS.

Postage Stamps are provided for sale of the respective values of 1 cent for Newspapers; 2 cents for Prices Current and Periodicals for the United Kingdom; 5 cents for ordinary Provincial Letters; 10 cents for United States rate; 1 1/2 cents for Canadian Packet; and 17 cents for Canada Packet.

PENAL CLAUSES.

The Post Office Act contains the following penal clauses:

1. If any person uses or attempts to use in pre-payment of postage on any letter or mailable thing posted in this Province any postage stamp which has been before used for a like purpose, such person shall be subject to a penalty of not less than ten and not exceeding forty dollars for every such offence, and the letter or other mailable thing on which such stamp has been so improperly used may be detained, or, in the discretion of the Postmaster General, forwarded to its destination, charged with double the postage to which it would have been liable if posted unpaid.

2. To enclose a letter or letters, or any writing intended to serve the purpose of a letter, in a parcel posted for the Parcel Post, or in a packet of samples or patterns posted to pass at the rate of postage applicable to samples and patterns, or to inclose a letter or any writing to serve the purpose of a letter, or to inclose any other thing, in a newspaper posted to pass as a newspaper at the rate of postage applicable to newspapers (except in the case of the accounts and receipts of newspaper publishers, which are permitted to pass folded within the newspapers sent by them to their subscribers) shall in each case be an offence punishable by a penalty of not less than ten and not exceeding forty dollars in each case.

GENERAL POST OFFICE, NEW BRUNSWICK.

LETTER RATES.

The postage on letters mailed in New Brunswick, addressed to any place within the Province, is 5 cents per half ounce, if pre-paid; if not pre-paid, it is 7 cents. On letters to all parts of the United States, the postage is 10 cents per half ounce.

Letters to and from England, per Cunard packets via Halifax, are charged 6d. sterling, or 12½ cents currency, per half ounce; and via New York, 8d. sterling, or 17 cents currency, per half ounce, if pre-paid. If mailed unpaid, they are charged 6d. sterling additional on delivery.

Letters to and from England, per Canadian packets via Quebec, are charged 6d. sterling, or 12½ cents currency, per half ounce; and via Portland, 8d. sterling, or 17 cents currency, per half ounce, if pre-paid. If mailed unpaid, they are charged 6d. sterling additional on delivery.

REGISTRATION.

The system of registration is applicable to all description of letters, without distinction, whether they contain articles of value or not. It also applies to parcels. The charge, in addition to postage, is 5 cents, when pre-paid; and 10 cents in addition to postage, when unpaid. The charge for registration of letters for the United Kingdom is 8 cents.

PARCELS.

Parcels closed at the ends and sides can be sent by mail throughout the Province, at a rate of 25 cents per lb. The weight of each parcel is not to exceed 3 lbs., nor the size to exceed 1 foot in length or breadth, or 6 inches in thickness. The parcel must not contain any glass, liquid, nor any substance liable to do injury to the mail, under the penalty of a forfeiture of the parcel if discovered. The parcel is not to contain any writing. Registration fee 5 cents. Parcels must be pre-paid by stamps. The sender, by writing his name on the outside, can have the parcel returned in case of failure to reach the person addressed.

NEWSPAPERS AND PERIODICALS.

Newspapers published in the Province, as well as transient papers, are forwarded through the Province, and to England (via Halifax), free of postage. If sent to England by way of the United States, the postage (2 cents) is collected at their destination.

NEWSPAPERS TO OR FROM ENGLAND.

If by way of Halifax per Cunard steamers, free. By way of the United States, 2 cents each on delivery, being the American transit charge.

BOOKS, PERIODICALS, PRINTED MATTER, &c.

The above pass through the Post Office free, if under 2 ounces in weight; if 2 ounces or upwards, at the rate of 2 cents for every 4 ounces.

All Printed Books, Magazines, Reviews, Pamphlets, or Packets of Patterns, Newspapers, or other matter, intended for transmission by Post between New Brunswick and the United Kingdom, must be restricted to two feet ¼ length and one foot in width and depth.

Printed Circulars, in unsealed envelopes, not exceeding half an ounce, are charged 1 cent each, and must be pre-paid. Circulars from other countries are liable to a tax of 1 cent each, which is collected on delivery.

POSTAGE STAMPS.

Postage Stamps are provided at the respective value of 1 cent for circulars; 2 cents for drop letters; 5 cents for ordinary Provincial letters; 10 cents for United States rate; 12½ cents per Cunard Steamer, via Halifax; 17 cents, via United States, for England.

MONEY ORDERS.

All Money Order Post Offices are authorized to issue and pay Provincial Money Orders (under direction of the Postmaster General) for any sum not exceeding in any one order \$100.

When Money Orders exceeding \$100 in aggregate amount are issued in one day and to the same person, by one or more offices upon another office, the Postmaster of the office drawn upon (if necessary) may delay the payment of such orders for six days.

All Money Orders shall be drawn upon printed forms supplied by the Post Office Department; and no order will be valid or payable unless given upon the regular printed forms.

Persons applying for Money Orders will be required to state the particulars upon a form of application provided for that purpose. Parties procuring Money Orders should examine them carefully, to see that they are properly filled up and stamped. This caution will appear sufficiently important when it is understood that an order defective in any important respect will throw difficulties in the way of its payment.

Postmasters will not pay an order to a second person without the written endorsement of the payee, thus:

Pay to the order of ——— (the name of the second person to fill the blank) for value received.

The commission charged for Money Orders, drawn and payable in New Brunswick, is as follows:

On orders not exceeding \$10, 5 cents; exceeding \$10, and not exceeding \$20, 10 cents; exceeding \$20, and not exceeding \$30, 15 cents; exceeding \$30, and not exceeding \$40, 20 cents; exceeding \$40, and not exceeding \$50, 25 cents; exceeding \$50, and not exceeding \$60, 30 cents; exceeding \$60, and not exceeding \$70, 35 cents; exceeding \$70, and not exceeding \$80, 40 cents; exceeding \$80, and not exceeding \$90, 45 cents; exceeding \$90, and not exceeding \$100, 50 cents.

When the mail arrives before 9 p.m. it will be delivered the same night, when after that hour at 7 the following morning.

Office hours from 1:30 a.m. to 9:30 p.m., except on the Thursday night on which the English mail is made up, when it is closed at 6, and reopened at 9 for the delivery of the Boston and inland mails.

Mails for the United Kingdom are closed finally, every alternate Thursday at 6 p.m. (commencing Jan. 2, 1868). Letters, &c., received after that hour will not be forwarded until next mail. Letters and telegrams are received on board the steamer by the mail office. Letters 12½ cents. Newspapers free. Unpaid letters are taxed double postage. Letters to the Imperial public departments are exempt from pre-payment.

Mails for the United Kingdom via the United States are made up to meet the steamers leaving New York for Liverpool. Letters to be especially addressed "via New York." Letters 20 cents, Newspapers 2 cents. Must be pre-paid.

Mails for Newfoundland are made up once a month in December, January, February and March; and fortnightly in the other months (including Cape Breton), closing finally on the Thursday evening of the week the steamer is due from Boston. Letters 10 cents; if posted in the interior, 13½ cents. Newspapers 2 cents. Must be pre-paid. Mails for St. Pierre and Miquelon are forwarded via Newfoundland. Letters 8½ cents; if posted in the interior, 13½ cents. Newspapers 2 cents. Must be pre-paid.

Mails for Bermuda and the British West India Islands are made up once a month every alternate Thursday evening (commencing January 2, 1868), at 6 p.m. Letters 10 cents; if posted in the interior, 13½ cents. Newspapers 2 cents. Must be pre-paid. Mails made up at the same time for Cuba, South America, the Foreign West India Islands, Chagres, Panama, and the Western Coast of America.

Mails for the United States by steamers are made up every alternate Tuesday evening (commencing December 31, 1867). Supplementary mails made up until arrival of steamer from England. Should the steamer arrive previous to Tuesday evening, the mails close then immediately. Letters 10 cents; if posted in the interior, 13½ cents. Letters weighing more than 1 oz., but under 1½ oz., will be charged three rates; exceeding 2 oz., but under 2½ oz., five rates; and so on, adding one rate for every additional ½ oz. Newspapers 2 cents. Must be pre-paid.

A mail for Quebec and Ontario is made up and forwarded at the same time. Letters to be addressed "Closed mail for Canada." Postage 12½ cents. Pre-payment optional.

A mail for Quebec and Ontario via Portland, by steamer "Carlotta," is made up every Tuesday at 3 p.m. Letters 12½ cents. Must be pre-paid. A mail is also made up every Wednesday, and forwarded by Phelan's steamers ("Commerce" and "Alhambra"), on arrival from Prince Edward Island.

LAND MAILS.

Letters posted in Nova Scotia, for any place within the Province, if pre-paid, 5 cents; if not pre-paid, 7 cents. Letters mailed for delivery within the county, 2 cents; if not pre-paid, 7 cents. Letters pre-paid may be sent from one way-office to another; if unpaid they will be sent to the nearest post office, and taxed 7 cents.

Letters to Quebec, Ontario and New Brunswick, 5 cents. Pre-payment optional. Letters to Prince Edward Island, 5 cents; must be pre-paid; if wholly or in part unpaid, they will be forwarded and taxed 5 cents in addition to the postage. Letters for the United States (except Oregon and California), 10 cents; to Oregon and California, 15 cents. Must be pre-paid.

Official letters addressed to the provincial and military departments, are exempt from pre-payment.

Registered letters for the provincial public departments and the military departments, addressed to Halifax, can be sent without pre-payment of postage or registry fee.

REGISTRATION.

Letters for registry must be posted half an hour previous to the closing of the mail by which they are to be sent. The postage as well as the registration fee must be pre-paid. The registration of a letter to any place in Nova Scotia, British North America, or the United States, is 10 cents; to the United Kingdom, 8½ cents; to Australia and all other places, when passing through the United Kingdom, 25 cents.

Letters posted in any city or town in the Province, for delivery in the same city or town, are charged 2 cents; if unpaid, they are taxed 4 cents.

Letters prepaid by stamp dropped into the box during the night and up to 4:30 a.m. will be forwarded by the mails despatched the same morning.

Semi-daily mail to and from Dartmouth, postage 2 cents. If unpaid, 4 cents.

All letters are charged by weight, irrespective of distance, and a uniform rate of postage of 5 cents per ½ oz. has been established throughout British North America. The rates of postage mentioned all refer to a single letter. If it exceeds the ½ oz. it is charged double, and so on according to weight. Ship letters 5 cents. Letters for consignees free.

Stamps to be affixed to letters or pamphlets on the upper right hand corner. Postmasters to stamp the name of the office and date distinctly on every letter.

Printed Books transmitted through the Province are charged 1 cent per oz. up to 48 oz. Printed Books, Magazines, Reviews or Pamphlets, binding rollers for prints or maps not exceeding two feet in length, markers and every thing appertaining to such publications, are sent between Nova Scotia and the United Kingdom, and also between Nova Scotia, Bermuda, Newfoundland, and the British West Indies, at the following rates: For a single volume, not exceeding 4 oz. 3d. sterling; above 4 oz. and not exceeding 8 oz. 6d. sterling; above 8 oz. and not exceeding 1 lb., 1s. sterling; and so on, adding 1s. for every additional pound or fraction of a pound. Must be pre-paid.

Periodicals, British or Foreign, posted within the Province for delivery within or without the Province, 2 cents each number must be pre-paid. Those published in the Province, and all Agricultural Reports, whether published in the Province or elsewhere, pass free.

British and Colonial Newspapers, and small Religious Periodicals, British or Foreign, posted within or without the Province, pass free. All other Newspapers are charged 1 cent each if mailed within the Province; if mailed without, for delivery within the Province, the postage is collected on delivery. An exchange copy of any Newspaper, addressed to a publisher in Nova Scotia, passes free.

British reprints of Copyright Works from the United States by steamer, are taxed letter postage.

Handbills, Lithographed Letters, Circulars, and other printed matter of like description, posted within the Province for any place within or without the same, 1 cent per oz. Must be pre-paid.

All papers printed by order of the Imperial Parliament, or by her Majesty's command, or by the Provincial Houses

of Parliament, are transmitted by post, within the Province, free.

No printed paper, whether Newspaper, Book, Pamphlet, or other paper, will be sent, either free or at a reduced rate of postage, unless it is sent—1. Without a cover, or in a cover open at the ends. 2. No words or communication printed on the paper after its publication, or upon the cover, nor any writing or marks upon it, or upon the cover, except the name and address of the sender and the party to whom sent. 3. No paper or thing to be enclosed with it. Where these conditions are not fulfilled, the whole will be charged letter postage.

Masters of vessels are entitled to receive for each letter they may deliver, when inwards bound, 2½ cents.

PARCEL POST.

The charge on Parcels, limited to places within the Province, is, if under 8 oz., 12½ cents; above 8 oz. and under 1 lb., 25 cents; above 1 lb. and not 2 lbs., 50 cents; above 2 lbs. but not 3 lbs., 75 cents; beyond this weight no parcel can be sent, and must not exceed one foot in length or breadth and six inches in thickness. Must be prepaid. The charge on parcels to New Brunswick or Canada is, for a parcel under 8 oz., 25 cents; if more than 1 lb. and not exceeding 2 lbs., 50 cents; if more than 2 lbs. and not exceeding 3 lbs., 75 cents; beyond this weight no parcel can be sent. Size same as above. Must be prepaid.

PATTERN POST.

Patterns of Merchandise can be sent by post between Nova Scotia and Great Britain at the following rates: For a packet not exceeding 4 oz., 7 cents; under ½ lb., 12½ cents; not exceeding 1 lb., 25 cents; above 1 lb. and not 1½ lbs., 37½ cents; above 1½ lbs. and not 2 lbs., 50 cents; every additional ½ lb., 12½ cents. No parcel to exceed two feet in length, breadth, or depth. Must be prepaid.

TABLE OF STAMP DUTIES.

On every promissory note, draft, or bill of exchange, for \$25 and under, 1 cent; over \$25 to \$50, 2 cents; over \$50 to \$100, 3 cents.

On every promissory note, draft, or bill of exchange, executed singly, for the first \$100, 3 cents; for every additional \$100, or fraction of a \$100, 3 cents.

On every draft or bill of exchange executed in duplicate, for the first \$100, 2 cents; for every additional \$100, or fraction thereof, 2 cents.

On every draft or bill of exchange executed in more than two parts, for each part for the first \$100, 1 cent; for every additional \$100, or fraction thereof, 1 cent.

The duties to be paid by stamps affixed to each Promissory Note, Draft, or Bill of Exchange: but the person affixing such stamp shall, at the time of affixing the same, write or stamp thereon the date at which it is affixed, and each stamp shall be held prima facie to have been affixed at the date stamped or written thereon, and, if no date be so stamped or written thereon, such adhesive stamp shall be of no avail.

Penalty for neglecting to affix stamps, or for willfully writing or stamping a false date thereon, \$100.

The Governor in Council may direct stamped paper to be prepared for the purposes of this Act.

COURT OF QUEEN'S BENCH.—The jurisdiction of this Court extends to all manner of actions, causes and suits, criminal and civil, real, personal and mixed, within Upper Canada, and it may proceed in such, by such process and course as are provided by law, and as shall tend with justice and despatch to determine the same; and may hear and determine all issues of law, and also with the inquest of twelve good and lawful men (except in cases otherwise provided

for) try all issues of fact, and give judgment, and award execution, the same, and also in matters which relate to the Queen's Revenue (including the condemnation of contraband or smuggled goods) as may be done by Her Majesty's Superior Courts of Law in England. COURT OF CHANCERY.—This Court has the like jurisdiction as the Court of Chancery in England, in cases of fraud, accident, trusts, executors, administrators, co-partnerships, account, mortgages, awards, dower, infants, idiots, lunatics and their estates, waste, specific performance, discovery, and to prevent multiplicity of suits, staying proceedings at law prosecuted against equity and good conscience, and may decree the issue, repeal or avoidance of letters patent, and generally the like powers which the Court of Chancery in England possesses to administer justice in all cases in which there is no adequate remedy at law. PRACTICE COURT AND CHAMBERS.—One of the Common Law Judges holds a Court during each Term, called the "Practice Court," for hearing matters relating to the adding or justifying bail, discharging insolvent debtors, administering oaths, hearing and determining matters on motion, and making rules and orders in causes and businesses depending in either of said law courts. Chambers are held each day in Common Law and Chancery by one of the judges of the said courts, for such business relating to suits therein as may be transacted by a single judge out of court. Routine business in Chancery Chambers, by a recent order, is also taken before T. W. Taylor, the Judges' Secretary. Clerk, Common Law Chambers—W. B. Howard. HEIR AND DEVISEE COURT.—Commissioners, the Judges of the Superior Courts, and such other persons as may be appointed by commission under the Great Seal. Their duties are to determine claims to lands in Upper Canada, for which no patent has issued from the Crown in favour of the proper claimants, whether as heirs, devisees or assignees. Sittings at Toronto, first Monday in January and July in each year. Clerk of Commissioners, W. B. Howard.

COUNTY COURTS.—Presided over by a resident Judge in each county. Their jurisdiction extends to all personal actions where the debt or damages claimed do not exceed £50; and to all suits relating to debt, covenant or contract, where the amount is ascertained by the acts of the parties or signature of the defendant, to £100; and to all bill bonds and recognizances of Bail given in the County Court, to any amount; but not to cases involving the title to lands, validity of wills, or actions for libel, slander, crim. con., or seduction. An appeal lies together of the Superior Courts of Law. These Courts also possess equity powers, to the amount of £50, subject to an appeal to Chancery.

SUBROGATE COURTS.—The jurisdiction of these Courts relates to all testamentary matters and causes, and to the granting or revoking of probate of wills, and letters of administration of the effects of deceased persons having estate or effects in Upper Canada, and all matters arising out of or connected with the grant or revocation of probate or administration, subject to an appeal to the Court of Chancery. The County Judges are also Judges of the Subrogate Courts. *Surrogate Clerk*, Sir J. M. Robinson, Bart.

COURTS OF QUARTER SESSIONS.—Chairman, the County Judge in each county, who, with no or more Justices of the Peace, holds a Court of Quarter Sessions in his county four times a year. Trials by jury in cases of felony and misdemeanor, both treason and capital felonies are excepted from their jurisdiction.

RECORDERS' COURTS.—In the Cities of Toronto, Hamilton, London, Kingston, and Ottawa, the Recorders' Court takes the place of the County Sessions, the Justices for Counties having no jurisdiction in the Cities—the care of which is confided to the Recorder, Mayor, Aldermen and Police Magistrate of each. Sessions held first Monday in March, June and September, and third Monday in December. *Recorders*—George Duggan, Toronto; James O'Reilly, Kingston; John E. Start, Hamilton; William Morton, London; J. B. Lewis, Ottawa.

INSOLVENT DEBTORS' COURTS.—By the Insolvent Acts of 1864 and 1865, 27 & 28 Victoria, cap. 57, and 29 Vic. cap. 18, provision is made "for the settlement of the estates of insolvent debtors, for giving effect to arrangements between them and their creditors, and for the punishment of fraud." In Lower Canada, this enactment applies to traders only. In Upper Canada, it applies to both traders and non-traders. In these courts, the county court judge in each county presides—the only appointments made in pursuance of this statute being those of "official assignees," who are to be nominated "by the Board of Trade at any place, or the council thereof, within the county or district in which such Board of Trade exists, or in any county or district adjacent thereto in which there is no Board of Trade." This important statute is proving a great boon to the community, in enabling parties who from unavoidable circumstances find themselves paralyzed by hopeless liability to obtain relief, and reconnoitre business.

DIVISION COURTS.—For the summary disposal of cases by a Judge; but a jury of five persons may be demanded in certain cases. Their jurisdiction extends to actions of debt or contract amounting to £25; injuries or torts to personal effects amounting to £10; and personal actions to that amount, if not excepted from their jurisdiction; but not to actions for gambling debts, liquors drunk in a tavern, or notes of hand given therefor, ejectment, title to land, &c., or any toll, custom or franchise, will or settlement, malicious prosecution, libel, slander, crim. con., seduction or breach of promise, or actions against a J. P. for anything done by him in the execution of his office, if he objects to it. Each judicial district is divided into court divisions, and courts are held once in two months in each division, or oftener, at the discretion of the Judge. The Divisions are established by the Courts of Quarter Sessions.

Terms of the Courts.

APPEAL TERMS commence on the second Thursday next after Hilary, Easter and Michaelmas Terms.

LAW TERMS.—Hilary begins first Monday in February, and ends Saturday of the ensuing week; Easter begins first Monday in May, and ends Saturday of the second week thereafter; Michaelmas begins third Monday in November and ends Saturday of the second week thereafter. By the act 21 & 30 Vic. cap. 40, Trinity Term, hitherto continuing on the Monday after the 21st August, is abolished; but the same statute gives power to the Court of Queen's Bench and Common Pleas, at their discretion, to hold sittings in banc in time of vacation (except long vacation), by virtue of a rule or order of the court, respectively to be made in or out of term, for the hearing of such special cases or rules for new trials as shall be named in a list to be attached to any such rule or order, and for giving of judgments in cases previously argued, and for disposing of such other business as the court in its discretion shall see fit. Notice of such rules to be given in Form and manner prescribed by the act, six clear days before the day appointed. Long vacation extends from 1st July to 21st August.

CHANCERY TERMS.—*Examination Terms.*—From 1st Tuesday of February to the Saturday after 2nd Tuesday of April; and from 1st Tuesday of September to the Saturday after 1st Tuesday of November. *Hearing Terms.*—From 1st Monday in April until Saturday of the following week; and from 3rd Monday in November until Saturday of the following week. The Court also sits every Tuesday (except during the regular vacations) throughout the year, for hearing motions for Decrees, motions for or to dissolve special injunctions, and appeals from the reports of the Master or Deputy Masters. Long vacation from the 1st July to 21st August.

COUNTY COURT TERMS commence on the first Monday in Jan., April, July and Oct., and end the following Saturday.

Circuits of the Courts.

LAW CIRCUITS.—Courts of Assize and Nisi Prius and of Oyer and Terminer and General Gaol Delivery shall be held twice a year in each County or union of Counties, in the vacation between Hilary and Easter Terms, and between that period of the vacation after the 21st of August and Michaelmas Term, except in the County of the City of Toronto and the County of York, in each of which counties there shall be a third such Court in every year, in the vacation between Michaelmas and Hilary Terms. There are six Circuits, as follows, viz:—

The *Eastern*: Brackville, Cornwall, Kingston, Original, Ottawa, Pembroke, Perth. *Middle*: Belleville, Cobourg, Lindsay, Napanee, Peterboro', Picton, Whitby. *Western*: Barrie, Hamilton, Milton, Owen Sound, St. Catharines, Welland. *Ontario*: Berlin, Brantford, Cayuga, Guelph, Simcoe, Stratford, Woodstock. *Western*: Chatham, Goderich, London, Sandwich, Sarnia, St. Thomas, Walkerton. *Home*: Brampton, City of Toronto, County of York at Toronto.

The Courts in each Circuit shall be presided over by one of the Chief Justices or Judges of the Superior Courts, or, in their absence, by some one Judge of a County Court, or some one of Her Majesty's Counsel learned in the law, requested by any one of the Chief Justices or Judges of the Superior Courts to act in that behalf.

CHANCERY CIRCUITS.—For the Examination of Witnesses and Hearing Causes are held in the Spring and Fall of each year as follows:—

MEDICAL COUNCIL.—The act under which the Upper Canada Medical Board was constituted was repealed, in 1865, by the Medical Act of Upper Canada. The governing body of the medical profession in Upper Canada is now styled the General Council of Medical Education and Registration of Upper Canada. This Council is at present composed of twenty members; eight represent universities and medical schools, and twelve represent medical electoral divisions, and are elected by the registered medical men, every three years, residing within the limits of these divisions. The same act which established the Medical Council authorized the publication of a list of the persons who were entitled legally to practice medicine in the Province of Ontario. This list is called the Medical Register for Ontario; and no person, whose name does not appear in that Register, is entitled to charge for any advice, or for any medicine which he shall have both prescribed and supplied. No one can collect fees in court for advice in either medicine, surgery, or midwifery, unless he be registered according to law, and his name be in the "list" of the current year. Nor can any unregistered person be appointed as medical officer, physician or surgeon in any branch of the public service, militia or otherwise, or to any hospital or other charitable institution not supported wholly by voluntary contributions; neither can any unregistered person give evidence (of a professional nature) before any coroner's or other court; nor is a certificate of lunacy valid from an unregistered person, nor any other certificate which the law requires from a physician or surgeon. 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cities, the Trustees are all appointed by the City Council, except where there is only one School in the county. The head master must be a graduate of a British or Colonial University, unless certificated and appointed before 18th September, 1865. Besides fees, local rates or contributions to the extent of half the government grant must be raised for the master's salary. The grant is payable to those

schools only which attain a certain standard, and is based on the average attendance of pupils in the prescribed studies. An extra grant is provided for masters taking certain Meteorological observations and giving military instruction. Pupils attending these Schools are prepared for matriculation in the Universities. There were 104 Gram-
mar Schools, with 5,179 pupils, in Upper Canada, in 1865.

COMMON SCHOOLS.—Each Township is divided into School Sections of a suitable extent for one School; and in each of these Sections three Trustees are elected to manage its School affairs. In cities, towns, and villages, the schools are managed by a Board of School Trustees, elected for the Municipality. There were 4,379 Common Schools, with 390,895 pupils, in Upper Canada, in 1866.

PUBLIC SCHOOL LIBRARIES.—Each School and Municipal Corporation, desirous of establishing Free Public Libraries, is aided by the Educational Department granting 100 per cent on local appropriations, and supplying books from the Depository in connexion with the Department. Up to the end of Dec. 1866, about 993 Libraries had been thus established, with 215,611 volumes.

EDUCATIONAL MUSEUM.—Connected with the Educational Department is a Museum, containing specimens of School apparatus and furniture; a valuable collection of Italian, Dutch and Flemish Oil Paintings and Statuary casts and busts. The Museum is freely open to the public.

THE TOTAL NUMBER OF EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS of all kinds reported by the Educational Department as in operation in the Province of Ontario during 1866, was 4,800, attended by 405,207 pupils, and expending \$2,050,125 in their support.
