WHAT SHE WAS THIS!
Another Marine Disaster Involving the Loss of Twenty Lives.

FUTILE EFFORTS TO RESCUE CREW.
The Vessel Went Ashore in a Heavy Sea on the Falkland Islands.

Rescuers Got Close Enough to Find That
Fourteen English-Speaking Sailors were in the Boat—When a Lifeline Had Been Brought Into Use the Ship had Broken Up—Not Enough of the Hull Left to Discover Her Name—The Pathetic Finding of a Young Girl's Body in the Wake.

Washington, Aug. 6.—The Falkland Islands, off the east coast of Patagonia, were the scene of a marine disaster involving the loss of nearly 20 American lives, which as yet remains wrapped in mystery, as but few details of the disaster have been received from the United States Consul at Port Stanley, the capital of the islands. Consul Miller reports that on the evening of May 15, news was brought to Port Stanley that a large ship, evidently of American build, had struck on the Billy Blower and was in danger of breaking up. The Falkland Islands Company's launch was immediately sent to service with a volunteer crew of about 100 men, including the captain, Mr. McPherson, the son-in-law of the consul, and a young girl named Mrs. McPherson, who was put back to port for a lifeboat, and returned immediately, but before she had reached the vessel she had broken up and quantities of her cargo were floating in all directions. The launch was unable to rescue any party stayed all night in hope of picking up some of the survivors, but after hours of searching the hope of saving life and returned to Port Stanley.

Late in May divers went down into
the vessel, but were unable to ascertain the name of the vessel. The only trace of humanity found on board was the body of a young woman about 18 years of age, but there was no other mark on the outside of the vessel, and the body was buried in the hold of the inside of one of the lifeboats, style M. 1895.

With him were Professor C. C. Fay of Tufts College, Cambridge; C. S. Thompson, of Chicago, and another friend, whose name is not known here.

The Object of the Excursionists was
to climb the mountains about Banff. They expected to make excursions from that point at intervals for a few weeks, and it was upon one of these perilous journeys that Mr. Abbott met his death. He was passionately fond of climbing, and that reason selected the mountains of Alberta, which, in point of rugged beauty, much resemble the Alps, the place in which to spend his vacation.

Were All the Deposits Made With the Wrong Officer at Osgoode Hall?

An Objection Based on the New Ontario

The eleven protests filed by the Liberals

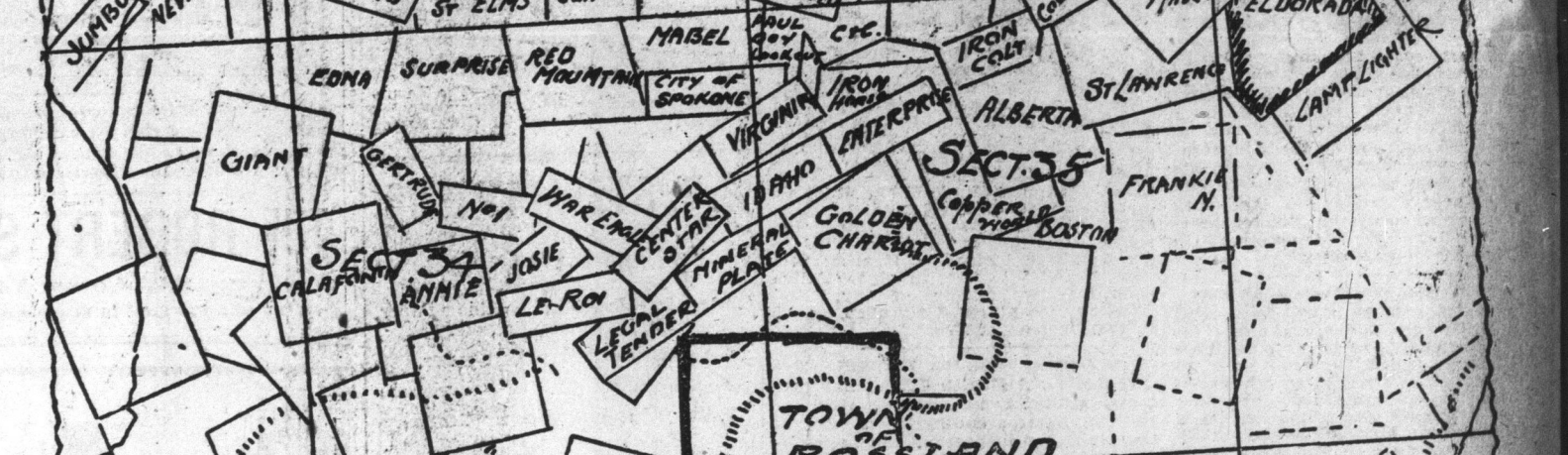
