REPORT OF THE KIRK SESSION.

The time having come for presenting to the Congregation the Annual Reports of its Office-bearers, the Kirk Session, in submitting a statement concerning the matters entrusted to their oversight, find little that calls for special mention.

It is not easy to form an accurate estimate of the Christian life and work of a Congregation. The maintenance, from year to year, of the same membership and of the same contributions for Church purposes, may be an indication of indifference, or largely the result of habit, or the proof of faithful and well-sustained effort. In our own case, as compared with last year, there is no marked alteration in our numbers or in our finances.

Divine Service is well attended: the Sabbath Schools are in vigorous condition: the Bible Classes are pretty well sustained: and, in view of the large amount required for interest on our Church loan, the contributions of the Congregation towards the general work of the Church are encouraging, being somewhat in excess of those of last year. At the same time the Session have to regret that so large a proportion of the adult members of the Congregation are still non-communicants, and that many members are irregular in their attendance at Communion, the average during the past year having been only about 200, out of a Communion Roll of 369. They further regret that the Weekly Prayer-Meeting attracts so limited a number even of those within easy access of the Church, and that our contributions to the Missions of the Church are so small in proportion to the amount spent for purely Congregational purposes. In view of the signal blessing that God has bestowed upon the Foreign Missions of our Church, and of the urgent claims of our Home Missions, both in the destitute localities of our older Provinces and in the quickly increasing fields of our North-West Territories, the Session earnestly ask the Congregation to contribute to these objects according to the Apostolic standard,—“As God has prospered them.”

The number of families at present connected with the Congregation is 278, an increase of two upon the number reported last year. The number of Communicants is 369, being 14 less than the number in last Annual Report, the Roll having been carefully purged, 34 names having been removed, while only 20 have been added during the year.

14 Deaths and 32 Baptisms have been entered on the Church Registers during the year. There are upon the Roll of our Sabbath Schools, in all, of teachers and other office-bearers 45, of pupils 349, with an average attendance of 234. The pupils in Uppertown School number 220, in Lowertown School 65, and in Stewarton School 64. The total receipts of the Schools for various purposes, including \$40 for India orphanage, amounted to \$277.20. Towards the close of 1880 a Bible was offered to each pupil who would accurately repeat the answers to the questions of the Shorter Catechism: out of a large number of competitors twenty were successful.

A Bible Class for young women, conducted by Mr. Hamilton, meets every Sunday afternoon at 3 o'clock, in one of the Church Class-rooms: it has a membership of 26, and the attendance has been well sustained since last September. The Pastor's Bible Class for young men, which meets every Monday evening, has been maintained since September: it numbers 24, but the attendance, though gratifying during the first part of the season, has latterly fallen off.

The legacy of the late Rev. Dr. Spence for the benefit of the poor of the Congregation has been received. As the validity of some of his bequests was successfully disputed by the heirs of the late Mrs. Spence, this legacy was reduced from £100 stg. to \$210. Of this amount \$200 have been invested in 5 P.C. Dominion Stock, and the balance in the P. O. Savings' Bank. The annual interest will be expended in the purchase of fuel for the poor, in accordance with the terms of the bequest, which are as follows:—

“I further appoint that at the death of my wife, One Hundred Pounds sterling, free of Legacy duty, shall be paid to the Kirk-Session of St. Andrew's Church, Ottawa, Canada, of which I was formerly minister, to be invested by that Court in perpetuity, and the yearly interest of which shall be laid out in the purchase of fuel to be distributed at Christmas in each year among the most deserving poor of the Congregation.”

The work of poor-relief in the Congregation is chiefly performed by the Ladies' Aid Society: from their report it will be seen that \$311.41 have been expended for this purpose during the year.

The District Visitors continue to render their willing and valuable assistance, visiting their districts monthly, receiving the Congregational contributions to the Schemes of the Church, distributing copies of the "Presbyterian Record" to those that do not receive them in Church, also distributing tracts, and reporting to the Pastor cases of sickness, removal or distress that might otherwise be for months unknown to him.

Since last annual meeting a valued member of Session, Mr. James Henry, has left Ottawa for Quebec. The Session, deeply regretting Mr. Henry's removal, placed on record the following minute, in which they have no doubt the Congregation will concur:—

"The Session desire to record the loss which they have sustained by the departure of James Henry, Esq., to Quebec. They recall with much pleasure the intercourse which they enjoyed with him and the faithful service which he rendered as an Elder in St. Andrew's Church, and they deeply regret the removal of one whose counsels were so prudent, whose interest in the welfare of the Church was so constant, and whose attention to the duties of his office, especially to the work of visiting those residing in the district entrusted to his oversight, was so exemplary. They trust that Mr. Henry may long be spared to render similar service to the Church elsewhere, and they pray that the blessing of the Divine Master may rest very richly upon him and upon his household."

The Session deem it desirable that their number should be increased: they therefore expect, in the course of this year, to ask the Congregation to elect additional elders.

The contributions towards the Schemes of the Church, including \$181.60 from last year, amount to \$3,001.59. Of this sum \$1,516.25 have been apportioned, in accordance with the expressed desire of the donors, as follows:—

REPORT OF THE TEMPORAL COMMITTEE.

To the Congregation of St. Andrew's Church in General Meeting:

The Temporal Committee beg leave to present the usual annual report on the close of another year.

Treating first the figures presented in the accounts herewith, being for the period from the 15th February, 1880, to the corresponding date in 1881, it will be seen that the pew rents collected amount to \$4,094.98 against \$3,310.78 the previous year, being an increase of \$784.20 for this year. The Glebe rents collected amount to \$738.12 against \$505.70, being an increase of \$232.42, and the amount received from the Kirk Session for interest is \$1,564.35 against \$1,330, shewing an increase of \$234.35. The total increase from these three sources being \$1,250.97 in favor of the year 1880-81.

It will be interesting also to compare the figures of collections from and to the first Monday in March of each year, for the two years, as these are not exhibited in the accounts, thus :

Your Committee have been able to settle all current liabilities presented to date, and hold on hand the sum of \$501.27, which will be sufficient to meet all small floating debts owing by the congregation, including a note for \$200 now maturing.

It must be said with regret, that there are still too many defaulters, as will be seen by reference to the Pew Rent List herewith, which shows uncollected \$1,499.82, including rents for 1880-81 and arrears from previous years. The arrears of pew rents for the present year alone, amount to \$902.90.

Some may be satisfied with the fact that we have been able to meet the immediate demands upon the congregation, but it would be still more satisfactory if instead of this large amount being in arrears, it had been received by the Treasurer, and the congregation thus enabled to extend its contributions to general church purposes, or to form a nucleus of a sinking fund to meet the heavy mortgage burdens on our property.

REPORT OF THE LADIES' AID SOCIETY.

This Society has continued to hold weekly meetings during the winter months.

The proceeds of the Anniversary Entertainment were this year given to the Protestant Hospital, as that institution was specially in need of assistance. The receipts for poor relief having been insufficient, a donation of \$35 was given for that purpose from the funds of this Society.

In addition to the work performed by the Sewing Circle of the Society, proceeds of which are shewn in the Treasurer's statement, the relief of the poor has been conducted by a Committee of the Society.

During the past year 32 families have received assistance; some, throughout the whole year, others, for a shorter time, during sickness, or until employment could be procured. For a young orphan girl who died of consumption \$25 was paid for care and attention during the last few months of her life. In three cases, funeral expenses were paid in whole or in part, where the friends had not sufficient means to pay them. Seven families were helped to pay their rent and taxes. Several children have been clothed so that they might attend Sunday School, but, as usual, the chief item of expenditure has been for provisions, for which orders are given to different stores.

As in previous seasons, Mrs. Bronson and Mrs. Perley have, during the past winter, honored all orders sent to them for wood, and the Society has thus been spared a large amount. Thanks are given to a kind friend for a bale of flannel to provide clothing for poor children, as well as to those who have kindly sent parcels of clothing.
