TORONTO, 12th, 13th AND 14th OCTOBER, 1880.

AT TORONTO, and within the Deacons' Court Room of Knox Church there, on Tuesday, the 12th day of October, 1880, at 2 o'clock in the afternoon, the Home Mission Committee (Western Section) of the Presbyterian Church in Canada, met and was constituted with prayer. LAKE SUPERIOR.

THUNDER BAY.

A letter was read from Rev. D. McKerracher, to the effect that he had resolved to withdraw from this field in the end of October, and asking the Committee to appoint a missionary in his stead. A letter was laid on the table and read from one of the Elders and Managers of the Prince Arthur's Landing Congregation, stating that the field would not be able to contribute more than \$350 per annum towards a Minister's salary. It was agreed to appoint Rev. Jas. Herald to this field for the next six months, and to make a grant of \$125 toward his salary for the half year.

APPOINTMENT OF MISSIONARIES.

MANITAWANING, MANITOULIN ISLAND.

Mr. James Ferguson was appointed to this field for the next six months, and the Committee granted \$125 towards his salary for this term.

BRUCE MINES.

Mr. Fred. W. Johnston was appointed to the Bruce Mines for the winter half year.

INDIAN PENINSULA, LOWER FIELD.

The Committee sanctioned the appointment to this field for two years of Rev. D. C. Johnston, under the scheme for the continuous supply of Mission Stations, the grant from the Home Mission Fund not to exceed \$250 per annum.

OTHER APPOINTMENTS.

Messrs J. Geddes, C. B. Henning and S. Armstrong were appointed to the Barrie Presbytery, and Mr. H. T. Miller to the Kingston Presbytery for the next six months.

MANITOBA.

APPOINTMENT OF REV. WM. HODNETT.

The Convener reported that the Sub-Committee in July last appointed Rev. Wm. Hodnett, of Perrytown, to Manitoba for three years, on the usual terms, that Mr. Hodnett had accepted the appointment and had entered upon his work. The Report was received and the action of the Sub-Committee approved.

REV. C. B. PITBLADO.

The Convener reported that in July last the Sub-Committee, learning that Rev. C. B. Pitblado of Halifax was about to visit the North-West, had asked him to place his services at the disposal of the Presbytery of Manitoba for three months; that Mr. Pitblado had agreed to do so, and had already visited Prince Albert and other fields in the Presbytery. The action of the Sub-Committee was approved, and the Convener instructed to lay Mr. Pitblado's report before the next meeting of the Committee, and to defray any necessary expenses in connection with his visit.

The following resolution was adopted :---

"The Committee agree to re-appoint these labourers for six months only, and to give notice to these and other missionaries whose terms of engagement expire next April, that the whole matter of the terms on which their services and those of other labourers, whose engagements expire from time to time, should continue to be retained, has been remitted to a Sub-Committee of the Home Mission Committee with a view to a more efficient and economical working of this rapidly growing field—said Sub-Committee to consist of Mr. J. M. King, Convener, Dr. Cochrane, Messrs. R. H. Warden, Jas. Robertson, T. W. Taylor, and Prof. Bryce.

PRINCE ALBERT.

The Rev. Jas. Sieveright of Goderich was unanimously appointed to Prince Albert for three years at a salary of \$1200 per annum and travelling expenses to the field. Mr. Sieveright, being communicated with by telegram, accepted the appointment. It was agreed to pay Mr. Sieveright immediately \$250 on account of travelling expenses, and to ask the Manitoba Presbytery to report to the next meeting of the Committee what in their opinion is a reasonable amount to allow for travelling expenses to Prince Albert.
