We are pleased to report progress in all departments of the church's activity: 32 were added to the membership; 15 by profession, 17 by certificate. We are encouraged to see the young confessing Christ as they have done. The attendance at the Sabbath services has been highly encouraging. It is wonderful how this stimulates the pastor to better and more consecrated work. But we have a few whose attendance is not up to the mark. To such we say read Heb. 10.

W. F. M. S. Report.

The Women's Foreign Mission Society have contributed \$37. This amount is not up to the average of the past few years, no doubt owing to the fact that the "Talent System" was introduced so largely throughout the congregation. Notwithstanding this the amount brought in by the mite boxes from the country was almost equal to last year. We heartily thank the ladies who contribute in this way although not enrolled as members. The meetings were held regularly every month and the interest is still maintained; we extend a cordial invitation to all who would wish to unite with us in this work, to meet with us the first Friday in every month at 3 o'clock.
