NEW COUNCIL SWORN IN. Mayor and Aldermen Take Oath—Committees Appointed. Mayor White Makes Comprehensive Review of Civic Affairs in His Inaugural Address.

The inaugural meeting of the new city council was held this morning in the council chamber, when the mayor and aldermen took the oath of office. All were present with the exception of Aldermen Christie and McMillin.

Chairman of the common council and deputy mayor, Ald. George H. Haman, was then sworn in. Treasurer—Ald. Robinson (chairman), Ald. Macrae, Holder, Daley, Frink, Bullock, McGoldrick, Macrae, Kings, John Bond, Dufferin; W. D. Morrow, Landowne; H. S. French, Stanley and Thee, Gibbons, official constables: E. V. Godfrey, Richard Rawlings, W. A. Bartlett, John Mullin, Frank McChrystal and Geo. Blair.

On motion of Ald. Robinson, the port wardens were then elected. The alderman explained that there were two vacancies caused by the death of James Brittain and the absence from the city of Neil McKeller. The old members were re-elected and Capt. Owens, S. Wilson and Geo. Holder were nominated for the two vacancies. Messrs. Wilson and Owens were elected.

The lumber surveyors were also re-elected upon their fulfilling the requirements of the law. This number can be added to at any time. Ald. Baxter in retiring spoke of the present defective system of election, which did not ensure that the voter should have an opportunity to pass upon principles of administration, or that he should have personal knowledge of the candidates.

His worship Mayor White then delivered his inaugural address, in which he reviewed the progress of the city, the erection of many new buildings, the freedom of the city from epidemics and its general prosperity.

ANOTHER ATTACK ON PORT ARTHUR REPULSED. Two Japanese Torpedo Boats Sunk—Channel Still Clear.

Russian Retreat from Yalu Battle Was a Rout—Two Russian Generals Wounded—Several Officers and Twenty Guns Captured.

ST. PETERSBURG, May 2-3-45 p. m.—It is reported that Admiral Togo made another desperate attempt to block the entrance of Port Arthur last night, but failed. Vice-roy Alexieff sent out a section of the fleet to meet the attack and sank eight fresh ships and two Japanese torpedo boats. The channel is reported to be clear.

SEoul, Korea, May 2, 1:30 p. m.—The Russian troops fled panic-stricken when routed at Chin Tien Chen, pursued by the Japanese cavalry and infantry over the hill country toward Pong Wang Chen from 1:30 p. m. until 9 o'clock at night. The Russian army engaged was composed of the Third division, the twenty-second and twenty-fourth regiments of the sixth division and General Mitchenko's cavalry brigade supported by forty field and light machine guns.

RUSSIANS ADMIT DEFEAT. ST. PETERSBURG, May 3, noon.—The emperor has received an official despatch from General Kuropatkin forwarding a despatch from the city of Zassulitch (commanding the Russian forces which have been engaged with the Japanese advance guard on the Yalu). It describes how he ordered the Russian forces at Antung and Kulu distance, to advance guard on the road toward Feng Huang Chang.

PARIS, May 3.—Having wound up the details of the big financial transaction connected with the Panama Canal, J. Pierpont Morgan left Paris at two o'clock this afternoon for Aix les Bains. Before departing he gave the correspondent an outline of his views on the Panama Canal Company.

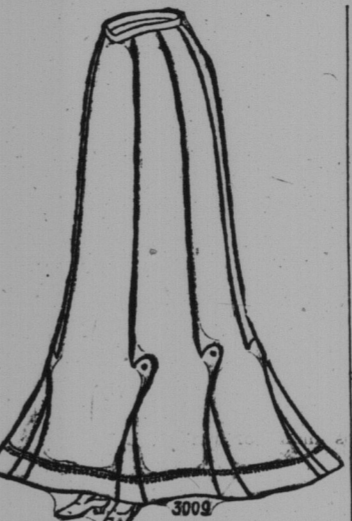
