

THE NORTHWEST INDIANS.

Lieut. Governor Dewdney received a despatch 1st August stating that eight whites had been butchered by marauding Indians, 33 miles south of Maple Creek in the Cypress Hills. It is believed that the Indians came on the victims by stealth, and when a favourable opportunity presented itself, pounced upon them. Some of those attacked escaped by swimming and wading across the narrow lake and barricading themselves in Sande lumber mill. Thirty-eight police left Winnipeg by train, for the scene of the butchery, and a like number from Medicine Hat. Great excitement is said to exist among the settlers around Maple Creek. If the Indians begin a guerilla warfare it will be worse than the rebellion.

Correspondence.

Boatman's Advocate. Having a desire to visit your beautiful river eastward from Chatham, I postponed my journey to take advantage of the steamer "Miramichi" on Monday, August 4th. The boat was full, and I was glad to see the boat. The morning was delightful, with a light breeze from the eastward. We reached Brockton in a short time, but unfortunately occurred here before us—a defect in the machinery was discovered, which had to be repaired before we could proceed further. While there, a number of the passengers left the boat. I did not know that danger was apprehended that they proceeded on their journey by land to Bay du Vin. It was well they did so, as the boat was all there on the way down, thus greatly disappointing a number of passengers including ladies, who were going thither. After the machinery had been repaired, we proceeded, the boat taking a different route than usual calling at Brockton and Negus, landing at the latter place. The boat was crowded, and the passengers were all well. The boat was anchored at what is called the Horse Point, and the boat suddenly started, and gradually stopped. On examination it was found that a broken pulley on the main shaft, which was the propeller, had broken, and the propeller was forced to stop. A volunteer had to go to the boat, while the crew were on the shore. This accident proved to me what the management of the S. S. Company is composed of. If the steamer had sprung a leak, or blown up, or about the 25th of August, it would have been a disaster. I have travelled on boats, but such a reckless piece of business as this is not to be seen elsewhere. I have, getting \$1000 per annum, and not a seaworthy boat on board to save life in case of accident. Well, sir, in the meantime the boat was a "Gull" was passing, and a whistle was blown for assistance. The officers of the passing boat, who were looking upon the "Miramichi" to show that we were in distress. We again had to submit to disappointment. The steamer stopped, and the boat returned with the news that assistance would be sent from Chatham. About 10.30 the tug "St. George," after hunting us up in the darkness, came alongside. Our commander, I suppose thought he was doing right by having all lights up, but this was wrong, only one light was required, all lights being exposed, the vessel appeared as a moving craft. The boat was as soon as the tug got hold of us, and Chatham was reached at 2 a.m. Those who took passage to Bay du Vin returned earlier, if not wiser for the journey they had taken. Now, sir, I went on that boat for pleasure, having heard of this wonderful Company's boats. I can say the boat I took passage on is an outrage on the public—no safe boats in case of accident—inferior accommodation, and no certainty of when you may go or be taken. I would advise the owners to lay up the boats and get new machinery, as it appears to me, as a looker-on, and after hearing exclamations from the engineer and others, who never had any experience in making a boat, what seems to me to be necessary for this route, is a good paddle boat, wider and longer hull to draw less water than the "Miramichi," one adapted to near the shores and go into Bay du Vin river at all times. Until this is done I for one should be compelled to prosecute the present management of the S. S. Company. This management will pardon me if I suggest to them the propriety of selling the boat, and having another built for the route by next spring. If they do not act upon my suggestion they will find other capital put in a boat that will meet the public requirements. I am, yours truly, A. TRAVELLER.
