The Work of the Session.

On Friday afternoon last His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor came down to the Council Chamber and presided over the Legislature with the following speech:

Mr. President and Honorable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council. Mr. Speaker and Gentlemen of the House of Assembly.

The diligent attention which you have bestowed upon the business brought under your consideration, enables me, after an unusually short session, to relieve you from further attention upon your legislative duties, and I desire to express to you my acknowledgments for the various measures which you have passed in the interests of the Province.

I feel confident that you will join me in deploring the unfortunate outbreak which has occurred in the North West Territories, and that you will join me in the hearty prayer that peace and good order may be speedily restored, so that the business of the Legislature may proceed in its usual course.

Mr. President and Honorable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council. Mr. Speaker and Gentlemen of the House of Assembly.

The joint address which you have adopted to Her Majesty the Queen, praying for the maintenance of a government of peace and order, as well as for compensation for loss sustained by reason of past legislation, I shall deem it my duty to support with your desire, and I sincerely hope that your appeal may result in the granting of a long and peaceful reign to our Queen.

In now taking leave of you, I earnestly pray that during the recess a kind Providence may direct and bless your individual labors, and that you may, when you represent, so that happiness and prosperity may abound in our Islands.

The volume of business which under our altered circumstances, since Confederation, there is to be disposed of by our Local representatives, is as large as ever, and, in fact, exceeding small, and the number of persons who annually meet together to transact it, is proportionately large. For this, however, I do not feel that it is the present Government after their accession to power, six years ago, should be held responsible for a reduction in the Legislature, but always without success, and when the people pronounced in favor of retaining the Upper Chamber, the Government accepted the declaration, and have since abstained from legislation in the matter. It does seem, however, that every winter, forty-three of the leading men of the Island should spend five or six weeks, at a cost to the country of twelve thousand dollars, in discussing an expenditure of a quarter of a million.

The session which closed last Friday was one of the shortest for many years, and the Government deservingly great praise for their expedition, the Opposition should also receive some credit. Their mission is to oppose everything and support nothing, but just now they have received the assistance from last session, their opposition was minimum. The result of the piers business thoroughly disheartened them, and when the Accounts were laid upon the table they completed their demoralization. The Opposition were sick—their leader was not in his place more than a few days, and when he was there he had nothing to do, and he preferred to look after his private business rather than by his presence give countenance to the buffoonery of Mr. Donald Foy, and Mr. Perry were so sorry, was unwell, and so was the Attorney General from East Point—the member from Fowey Beach never put in an appearance at all, the session was a failure, Belfast, conscious that since the partial election, he does not really represent that intelligent constituency, preserved a dignified silence, and it is for the representative from West River to make reasonable speeches and send out petty items of account. Even the member from St. John's, although he pitched into the Government, and the Opposition had no good word for the Davies Administration which he denounced for their extravagance. To make a show of doing something, the Opposition called for hosts of resolutions, which they well knew it would be impossible for them to get except at a most unreasonable expense of time, labor and money; and, at last, they accepted the Campbell resolution, repeated invitation to visit the Public Works Office and examine his vouchers, their anxiety centered in the matter, and by John F. Nicholson for carpenter work for the Government buildings, which turned out to be less than five hundred dollars.

The most important matter which engaged attention last session, was the memorial, adopted by both Houses, to the Queen upon the subject of Winter Communication, and it is curious to be desired that the unanimous appeal of both political parties, on behalf of the people of the Island, may have the desired effect. Just before the prorogation, the Government admitted a resolution in the Legislature, which was passed unanimously, but in the Lower House was resisted by the Opposition, declaring the impropriety of doing anything to embarrass the Government while occupied with a matter of such weighty moment to the Empire as the Rebellion in the Northwest, and expressing the desire that the memorial to the Queen should not be forwarded until such time as the Local Government should consider opportune.
