It is with a great deal of pleasure that we welcome to Montreal the members of the British Association for the Advancement of Science. Forty years ago your Association visited Canada for the first time, and although you are not now, as you were then, meeting in our city, we are none the less glad to be afforded an opportunity of greeting you during this brief interval of your journey.

We are looking forward to meeting you at Lord Atholstan's beautiful home on Sunday, to making new acquaintances and renewing old ones, in those most pleasant of surroundings.

Science has made long strides since the time you first came among us, indeed one has only to cast an eye upon our own ^{city} surroundings and our own university to see how far we have been carried by the application of that knowledge of the pent up wonders of nature which you for so many years have sought to provide. In those days we had gas light, horse cars, the telephone was in its infancy, steam was our only source of power, our harbour was fit only for small ships. To-day Science has given us tremendous hydro-electric

developments, electric light and power for our streets, our homes, our street railways, our factories, a harbour second only to one in North America, has made of telephones and telegraphs the ready handmaids of commerce. There is indeed one of the most wonderful and useful branches of scientific skill- wireless telegraphy - in the development of which, based as it is on the deepest study of Physics, we feel that McGill has played a not inconsiderable part, and it was with great pride that we saw Sir Ernest Rutherford as President of your Association for the 1923 meeting. He was for many years a member of the McGill staff and those who knew him and worked with him look back to their association with him as perhaps the most inspiring period of their lives. We are more than glad to have him among us again, even though for so short a period.

We recognize, of course, that in the two days of your stay in Montreal we cannot begin to entertain you as we should like to, but we trust that you will find something of value among the various excursions which have been arranged. Those who are interested in transportation and economic problems will, through the kindness of the Board of Harbour Commissioners, have an opportunity of seeing to the best advantage a port which we believe to be as efficient as any in the world. Those who are students of electrical developments will be able to visit one of our great power plants

and the proposed sources of power on the St. Lawrence. Professor Lloyd and his colleague from the University of Montreal are arranging to show some of your Botanists a spot where Canadian flora may be studied, and the Christian Brothers will welcome these visitors to the home of their studies. Dr. Harrison and his staff will introduce those who join them at lunch to the work of Macdonald College, work which is of the very greatest importance to Canada, including, as it does, the study of the whole range of food production as well as agriculture. We hope that those of you who prefer to remain in Montreal on Monday will avail yourselves of the opportunity to visit McGill and the University of Montreal.

We welcome you to our Universities and to our City, for the few hours which you can spend with us our gates are open to you, and we trust that you will carry away with you some pleasant memories of Montreal and McGill.



My dear Sirs,- At your request and representing McGill University, I attended the Inaugural Ceremonies of Mr. Ernest Hatch Wilkins as President of Oberlin College on Monday October 24, 1927. The day was an ideal Autumnal day. The ceremonies in all their details were perfect. There was a large inspirational representative attendance from the United States, from Canada and from beyond the Sea.

Dr. Wilkins is the first lay President of Oberlin College, the six former presidents being clergymen. This was not seriously considered as an innovation. With some small knowledge of men and affairs in this country and the needs of these changing days,- it seemed to me that the Trustees had selected wisely and well, when they chose Dr. Wilkins among 'among other eligibles.'

He is a forward looking man, a scholar with a clear cut mind, with strong mentality and possessing a rare type of personality, combined with a sense of the importance of the moral and religious emphasis. He was accorded an earnest and royal welcome to the Presidency of Oberlin College.

The other Canadian representatives, designated 'Foreign Universities' and myself,- were received and granted every courtesy and consideration during the day with a fine spirit of cordiality.

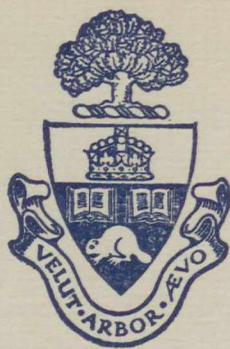
After the Luncheon, I had the pleasure of a brief hand shake with President Wilkins and personally expressed the greetings and good wishes of McGill University.




