# RUSSIAN VICTORY SOUTH OF THE DNIESTER GREATER THAN OFFICIAL REPORTS SHOW

Berlin's Prompt Admission of Austro-German Retirement in This Quarter Shows Importance of Russian Success of the Past Week.

Nearly 63 Square Miles of Territory in Advance Through East Galicia.

100 SQUARE MILES OF ENEMY'S TERRITORY.

Petrograd, via London, Aug.
8—The Russians in their advance against the Austro-Germans in East Galicia have taken territory aggregating nearly 100 square miles, according to the Russian official communication issued tonight.
In pursuit of the Teutons the Russians have taken additional villages in the Dniester response.

Petrograd, Aug. 8, via London-General Letchitzky, who a week ago, despite flooded rivers and heavy rd ds, began anew his hammering of the right fank of Gen. Count You Bolmer's army, and by a cavalry at-tack took Ezerzany, has scored an other victory by the capture of Thu-mach, ten miles further to the north-

On the same date, the despatch adds, the evacuation of the city by the civilian population was ordered. The proclamation declared the Austrians would return shortly to wrest Lemberg from the Russians.

# TEUTONS SWEPT BACK ALONG 15 MILE FRONT IN EAST

Austro-German Forces Driven Back Along Fifteen Mile Front South of Denister River --- Town Tlumach Captured

London, Aug. 8—The Russians have renewed their attacks on the Caucasus front, west of Erzingan. An official Turkish statement received here today, dated August 5, says the Russians gained a footing in the Turkish lines, but were driven out, after heavy fighting.

SWEPT BACK ON FIFTEEN MILE FRONT. Petrograd, Aug. 8, via London—South of the Dniester River, in the lirection of Tyszienca, the Russians have driven the Austro-German cross back along the whole line for a breadth of fifteen miles, it was officially announced by the Russian war department today. The announcement adds that the Russians have captured the town of Tlumach, as well as the region to the east of the Dniester river, and the ridge of the heights there. Russian cavalry, it is stated, is now pursuing the Austro-Germans southwest of the Kolomea and Stanislau railway in Galicia.

# CANADIAN CAR AND FOUNDRY CO. ATTACKS JERSEY CITY EMBARGO

Begin Suit to Restrain City from Interfering with Shipment and Storage of Munitions Orders.

Trenton, N. J., Aug. 8.—Jersey City's embargo on shipment and storage of high explosives was attacked in the federal court today by the agency of the Canadian Car and Foundry Limited, in a suit to restrain the Jersey City commission from interfering with the Delaware, Lackawanna and Western Railroad Company accepting munitions at its piers. Argument on the application for a preliminary injunction will be heard next Thursday.

Action of Jersey City authorities in compelling the railroad to unload a car of explosives shipped by the Canadian Company from Kingsland, N. J., is the basis for the court action to day.
