Excitement at Ottawa—Great Gathering of Civil, Journalists and Politicians—The Premier's Programme—The Governor General to Leave Tonight.

OTTAWA, Aug. 12.

There was considerable excitement in this city yesterday and to-day.

The Crisis have held several meetings and will hold a final meeting this afternoon.

Nothing definite is known of their plans. It is supposed that they will move that the proposed committee be empowered to proceed with the enquiry forthwith, and that the issue of a Royal Commission is interference with the rights of Parliament.

Cabinet meetings are being held.

Lord Dufferin arrived this morning. He intends leaving to-night unless something unexpected occurs.

The following is the programme: The report of the Committee will be received; Sir John Macdonald will state the position of affairs, and announce that the Royal Commission will proceed immediately to take evidence; parliament will then proceed to the vote again in October, when it is thought, the enquiry will have been completed, and the evidence be ready for the consideration of Parliament.

Very few Government supporters are present. Leading papers have full staffs of reporters present.

Irreconcilable-Grits say the session must proceed.
