Letter from England.

ENGLAND, March 25th, 1859.

The state of Europe is more promising to-day than it has been since the beginning of the year. The proposal of Russia, concerning the assembling of a Congress on Italian affairs, met with the approval of the English and Prussian governments.

The business of the congress will be of the most difficult character. The whole question of the wrongs of Italy,—wrong which for so many years have excited the indignation of all lovers of liberty, and yet baffled all schemes of amelioration, will have to be comprehensively submitted to the tribunal, and not without seriously compromising the honour and character of many of the parties concerned.

The Neapolitan patriots, who after enduring untold sufferings in the bulks were exiled to America for the rest of their lives, and who compelled the captain of the vessel in which they were to be carried to America to leave them at Cork, are securing the sympathies of the great and good, and stirring up by the stories of their cruel wrongs such a storm of British indignation against the King of Naples, as would wither any monarch.

Both, and an Earl. Lord Clyde, whose return to England is delayed, is likewise receives some new distinction from the British Government. While on the Indian question, it may be well to say that Lord Stanley has excited considerable indignation, not only by the terms of his reply to the despatch of the Viceroy, but also by the tone of that reply.

Colchester Temperance Convention.

The regular quarterly meeting of the Colchester County Temperance Convention, was held at Folly Village, on Wednesday 6th April. Among other matters, the new prohibitory bill came under consideration, when, after considerable discussion, the following resolutions were severally moved, seconded, and unanimously agreed to.

1. This Convention regarding the permissive prohibitory bill which has recently passed the House of Assembly,—especially after the misnamed amendments which have been granted in it,—as a delusion and a snare, disclaim all responsibility in connection therewith; and protest against the result of the vote (when said bill is submitted to the people) being regarded as a test of public opinion upon the subject of prohibition.

2. This Convention respectfully recommends to the friends of Temperance in each polling district in the County of Colchester, and throughout the Province generally, to support the action of the Legislature by refraining from voting on this question on the day of General Election.
