At the GENERAL Assembly of this Province of Nova-Scatia, begun and holden at HA-LIFAX, on the Fifth Day of December, 1785, in the Twenty Sixth Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord GEORGE the Third of Great-Britain, France, and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith, &c. and there continued by feveral Prorogations unto the Twenty Fifth Day of February, 1790, in the Thirtieth Year of this Majefty's Reign, being the Fourth Sellion of the Sixth General Affembly, convened in the faid Province.

### CAP. I.

AN ACT to provide for the Support and Maintenance of his Majefty's Government in this Province by reviving, amending and continuing the feveral Laws for raifing a Revenue hereinafter particularly mentioned and expressed.

HEREAS the feveral Arts of this Province bereinafter mentioned, have expired on the Thirty First Day of March last, and it is expedient, that the same should be revived, continued, altered and amended, in such Manner as is berein after expresfed.

I. Be it therefore. Enabled, by the Lieutenant, Governor, Council and Allombly, That the Act made in the Twenty fourth Year of his prefent Majefty's Reign, initialed, an Act for the more effectually raifing a Revenue within this Province, for the Support of its Government, and every Matter, Claufe and Thing therein contained, as altered and amended in, and by an Act made in the Twenty Ninth Year of his prefere Majefty's Reign, which Acts expired the Thirty First Day of Marce laft, thall be revived, and the fame are hereby revived in full Force and virtue from and after the Publication hereof, and the fame and every Part thereof fo revived as aforefaid, are hereby F f f

II. And be it further Enabled by the Authority aforefaid. That from and after the Publication hereof, all Wines of every kind, which shall be imported and fold, or expended within this Province, shall pay a further Excise Duty of three Pence per Gallon, in Addition to the Excise Duties heretofore paid and collected on the same Article by virtue of the several Excise Laws, which expired the Thirty First Day of March last, and which Excise Laws or Acts are herein after revived and continued. And all refined or Loaf Sngar, which shall after the Publication hereof be imported, fold, or expended within this Province, shall pay a further Excise Duty of One Half Penny per pound, in Addition to the Excife Duties heretofore paid and collected on the fame Article, by virtue of the feveral Excife Laws, or Acts herein last before mentioned, and herein after revived : And all brown Sugar, which shall hereafter be imported, fold or expended within this Province, shall pay an Excise Duty of Two Shillings and Six Pence, for every Grofs Hundred Weight, which shall be fo imported, fold and expended, the fame to be paid and collected in the fame Manner as all other Excife Duties were heretofore paid and collected in, and by faid last mentioned Excise Laws or Acts: And all Porter, Ale or strong Beer, which shall hereafter be imported, fold or expended within this Province, shall pay a further Excise Duty of Two Shillings and Six Pence for every Hogshead, containing Sixty Gallons, which shall be fo imported, fold or expended within the fame, in Addition to the Excife Duties heretofore paid and collected on the fame Article, by virtue of the faid feveral Excife Laws hereby revived : And all Tea of the lowest Quality, generally known by the Apellation of Bohea or common Teas, which shall hereafter be imported, fold or expended within this Province, shall pay an Excise Duty of One Penny, for each and every Pound; and all other Teas of whatever Kind, Name or Nature, the fame may be (other or different from the faid Bohea or common Tea) which shall be hereafter imported, fold or expended within this Province, shall pay an Excise Duty of Four Pence for each and every Pound, which thall be for imported, fold or expended within the fame, which Dury figlinge paid and collected in the fame manner, as all other the Excife Duties were heretofore paid and collected, in and by the faid last mentioned Excife Laws or Acts. भे तेवती त्रक

shall fell or vend any Article or Articles what sever, which are subject, or made liable to any, or either of the different Excise Duties imposed thereon, by Virtue of this Act, without having first entered the fame, and every part thereof, with the Collector of Impost and Excise for the District wherein such Person or Persons shall dwell, or if any of faid Articles subjected by this Act to an additional Excise Duty, thall be found in the Hands or Custody of any Person or Perfons, who usually fell or deal in Articles of that Kind, without such Article or Articles having been duly entered as aforefaid, and the faid Additional Excife Duties fecured thereon, as by the Laws or Acts herein after revived are directed ; all fuch Articles fo found, or which shall be fold as aforefaid, shall be feized and condemned in Manner and Form as the Excife Laws heretofore in Force and herein after revived and continued direct; and the Person or Persons felling the fame, or in whofe Cuftody the fame shall be found, shall be liable to all the Pains and Penalties imposed by faid Acts, on Perfons clandeftinely-landing Goods subject to Excise Duties.

IV. And be it further Enacted, That no Allowance or Return of the Duties of Excise, or any Part thereof, shall be allowed on the Re. thipment or Export of any of the before enumerated Articles, or any other Article fubject to an Excise Duty, except the Articles herein after mentioned, after the fame shall have been landed and bonded, unless the Quantity of each Article fo reshipped at one and at the same Time, shall exceed the following Rates, that is to fay, five Hundred Gallons of either Wine, Spirits or Porter: Of Refined or Loaf Sugar not less then Seven Gross, Hundred Weight : Of Brown Sugar Twenty Grofs Hundred Weight. Provided always, that fuch reshinment shall be made by the actual and bona fide Importer of the Article or Articles fo refhipped, and that fuch Export shall be made to the Places, and in the Manner directed, in and by the feveral Excife Laws now revived, and by this Act continued in Force. And provided always, that the Perfon or Perfons making an Export of any one of the before mentioned Quantities of exciseable Articles as aforefaid, shall not be entitled to receive an Allowance or Drawback of the Duties fecured thereon, unless fuch Export shall be made within Nine Months, to be computed from the Importation thereof, and the Certificates of the landing fuch Article or Articles at the Place to which the fame fhall be exported, shall be returned and lodged in the Excife Office in fix Months from the Date of the Export thereof; and unlefs fuch Exporter or Exporters shall make such Proofs, and conform to fuch Regulations relative to the Export of faid Articles as shall be fatisfactory to, and shall from Time to Time be made by the Commillioners of his Majefty's Revenue for this Province.

The above Articles to be entered with the Collector and on failure liable to confication if found in the hands of a Dealer.

VII. Be it therefore Enasted, by the Authority aforesaid, That from and after the Publication hereof all Sum or Sums of Money, which the Collectors of Impost and Excise for any County or District in the Province (Halifax excepted) shall receive or may already, have received by Virtue of an Act, intitled, "An Act for the better support of the Poor in the respective Counties within this Province, by laying an Impost Duty on all Articles imported into this Province, from the United States of America, which Act is herein revived shall immediately be by them paid to the Treasurer for the County or Diftrict, wherein the fame shall be fo Collected, which. Money shall be paid by fuch Treasurer or Treasurers to the Oversers of the Poor. to be by them applied to the Uses and purposes in and by the faid. Act directed, and the Receipt or Receipts of fuch Treasurer or Treafurers shall be received in the Treasury of the Province as a sufficient Discharge for such Collector or Collectors (the Collector of Halifax Diffrict only excepted) for the Sum or Sums fo by him or them Collected and paid over as aforefaid.

Dutiable articles imported between the expiration and revived of the Laws made liable to the old Duttes. VIII. And be it further Enalled, That the faid laft mentioned Act which expired the 31ft Day of March laft, and every Matter and Thing therein contained except as herein before altered or amended, thall be revived, and the fame is hereby revived, in full force and Virtue and the fame and every Part thereof, except as before excepted, is and are hereby continued in full Force until the first Day of July, which will be in the Year of our Lord One Thousand Seven Hundred and Ninety One.

### CAP. II.

# AN ACT, intitled, an Act for appointing Commiffioners to superintend and direct the Maintenance and Support of certain Poor Persons known by the general Appellation of Transfert Poor.

HEREAS the Maintance and Support of certain Poor Perfonse known by the general Appellation of Transient Poor, are found extremely burthensome and expensive to this Province, and sector tend greatly to the Encouragement of Idleness and Vice.

I. Be it therefore Enasted, by the Lieutenant Governor, Council, and House of Allembly, That from and after the First of May next exfuing, no Poor Person whatever shall be received into the Work-House or Poor-House in Halifax, or any other Place in this Province under the Designation of Transsent Poor or Persons to be maintained from the Province Treasury, but each Town shall maintain their own Poor, agreeable to an A& passed in the Tenth Year of his present Majesty's Reign, intitled, "An A& for the Settlement of the Poor in the fe-" veral Fownships within this Province."

And whereas it is necessary to provide a Maintenance for such Poor as boresofore have been deemed and received as Provincial or transient Poor, that their Maintenance and Support should be under the Direction and Controul of certain Commissioners hereaster to be appointed by his Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, or Commander in Chief for the Time being.

II. Be it further Enasted, by the Authority aforefaid, That it thall and may be lawful for the faid Committioner on fuch Appointment as sforefaid, and full Power and Authority is hereby given to the faid Commissioners to take under their Care and Direction fuch Poor Perfons as are at prefent maintained out of the public Revenue of this Province, and that the faid Commissioners on being appointed as aforefaid, shall faithfully examine and inspect the various Discriptions of Poor Perfons in the Town of Halifax, and on fuch Examination and Infpection to receive and take under their Care and Direction fuch Poor Perfons now maintained as Transfent Poor as to them the faid Commiffioners may appear to be without any legal Settlement in any particular Town within this Province, and that the faid Commissioners shall and may either continue the faid Poor in the Poor-House in Halifan or place them out to board collectively to seperately in any Part of the Province, of take fuch other Ways and Means for the Maintenance and Support of fuch Poor as to the faid Commitfioners shall feem proper, and least expensive to the Public.

III. And

Commissioners authorized to bind out Minors Boys until 21, Girls 18, and to pay a certain Sum of Money with them.

Commifficeners to apply to the Governor for Warrant or Warrants on the Treafury not exceeding £.500. for the Transfient Poor, but fhould a neceffity require it not exceed £.250. more firft producing to the Governor proper Vouchers for fuch Expenditure.

On the Demile of any one Commiffioner the Lieutenant Governor to sppoint others.

III. And be it furiber Enasted, by the Authority aforefaid, That it fhall and may be lawful for the Commiffioners aforefaid, by Indenture or otherwife to apprentice, or bind out to fuch Perfon or Perfons as in their Difcretion fhall feem proper, all, or any of fuch Minor or Minors as now are included among the Transfient Poor at prefent fupported out of the Revenue of this Province, that is to fay, Males until they fhall respectively arrive at the Age of Twenty one Years, and the Females until they fhall respectively attain to the Age of Eighteen Years, and the faid Commiffioners are hereby further authorized and impowered to make and enter into Indentures or Agreements under Seal with any Perfon or Perfons for the Purpofes aforefaid, and pay to fuch Perfon or Perfons fuch Sum or Sums of Money, as to the faid Commiffioners fhall appear a reasonable Confideration for the taking and bringing up fuch Minors or Apprentices in manner aforefaid.

IV. And be it further Enalted, by the Authority aforefaid, That from and after the Publication of this Act, it shall and may be lawful for his Excellency the Governor, Lieutenant Governor or Commander in Chief for the Time being, to draw by Warrant on the Treafury of this Province, from Time to Time for fuch Sum or Sums of Money as may be neceffary for the Maintenance and Support of the faid Poor, and for the apprenticing or binding out fuch Minor or Minors in Manner and Form as is herein before mentioned and directed, That is to fay, that his Excellency the Governor, Lieutenant Governor or Commander in Chief, shall on Application of the Commissioners aforefaid, draw by Warrant on the Treasury any Sum or Sums of Money not exceeding the Sum of Five Hundred Pounds for the Purposes aforefaid, and whenever, and so often as a further or other Sum or Sums of Money may be necessary for the Purposes aforefaid, it shall and may be lawful for his Excellency the Governor, Lieutenant Governor or Commander in Chief, from Time to Time to iffue other Warrants for the Purpoles aforelaid, for any Sum or Sums of Money, not exceeding at any one Time, the Sum of two Hundred and Fifty Pounds on Application of the Commissioners aforefaid, they having first exhibited to his Excellency the Governor, Lieutenant-Governor or Commander in Chief for the time being, a true and just Account with proper Vouchers of the Expenditure and Application of the Monies by them before fo had and received for the Purposes aforefaid.

V. And be it further Enabled, by the Authority aforefaid, That whenever, and to often as the Truft or Office of the Commiffioner or Commiffioners shall become vacant from Death or otherwife, that then and in fuch Cafe it shall and may be lawful for his Excellency the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Commander in Chief, to nominate

hominate and appoint other proper Perlon or Perlons Commissioners aforefaid for the Purpoles aforefaid.

VI. And be it further Enasted by the Authority aforefaid, That the Sum of Thirty Pounds be allowed annually, and payed to the Commillioners aforefaid out of the Treasfury by Warrant from his Exceltency the Governor, Lieutenant Governor or Commander in Chief for the Time being; for the Payment of a Clerk, and defraying the -Expences of Stationary and Postage of Letters.

VII. And be it further Enacted, That every Matter, Claufe and Thing herein contained shall be continued in Force until the First To C Day of July, which will be in the Year of Our Lord One Thousand Seven Hundred and Ninety One, and no longer, any Law or Statute to the contrary thereof notwithstanding.

## CAP. III.

AN ACT for reviving, continuing and amending the leveral Acts for suppressing unlicensed Houses, and for granting to his Majesty a Duty on Persons hereaster to be licensed; as also for compelling Persons retailing Gunpowder within the Peninsula of Halifax, to take out a Licence for retailing the same.

HEREAS it is expedient that the faid before recited Acts which expired on the 31st Day of March last, should be revived, and that some Alteration in the Duty on licensed Houses as well as in the Manner of granting Licences throughout the Province should be made.

1. Bell therefore Enacted, by the Lieutenant Governor, Council and Allembly, That from and after the Publication hereof, whoever shall flave of take a Tavern Licence, or Shop Licence to retail Rum, Brandy, Wine, Ale, Cyder, or other strong Liquors within the Province, such Person or Persons shall pay for the same, according to the following Rates, that is to say, all and every Person or Persons having or taking either a Shop or Tavern Licence within the Peninshill of Halisax, shall pay for a Licence of either kind, the full Sum of four Pounds yearly; and any Person or Persons having or taking "Shop Licence or Tavern Licence in any other Part of the Province (the faid Peninfula of Halisax excepted) shall pay for either the one of the other of such Licences the full Sum of Fifty Shillings yearly; H h h

All Perfons To pay L.4. per Annum for a Shop or Tavern Licence and 50s. in all other parts of the Province.

which feveral Duties shall be paid received and applied, and the faid Shop and Tavern Licenfes shall be granted in the Manner and form directed in, and by the feveral Acts hereby revived, and by this Act. continued for suppressing unlicensed Houses. Provided always nevertheles, That all and every Person or Persons holding or having either a Shop or Tavern Licence within this Province, who shall have paid one Quarter of a Year's Duty in Advance, agreeable to the several Acts hereby revived and continued, fuch Person or Persons shall not by reason of the present Reduction of the Licence Duties be intitled to any Allowance for fuch Payment or Payments fo made in Advance, and all fuch Person or Persons shall pay for the Quarter of a Year on which each and every of them shall have respectively entered at the time of the Publication of this Act, agreeable to the Rates heretofore established, that is to fay, fix Pounds for a Tavern Licence, and three Pounds for a Shop Licence, and fuch Perfon or Perfons fo having Licence as aforefaid, shall not be exempted from paying at the faid Rates heretofore established, until the End or Expiration of the Quarter of a Year, on which such Person or Persons, shall each have respectively entered at the time of the Publication hereof, when, and not before fuch Perfon or Perfons shall receive new Licence or Licences, for which fuch Perfon or Perfons shall pay at the several Rates in, and by this Act directed; any thing herein contained to the contrary thereof notwithstanding.

The above Licence intitles the Person to fell any Quantity. II. And be it further Enatled, That all and every Perfon or Perfons, who shall take out a Shop Licence or Licences under, and by Virtue of this Act, shall and may be at Liberty to fell and retail any quantity of Wine or spirituous Liquors, which he or they shall think proper; any Law, Usage or Custom to the contrary notwithstanding.

And whereas the granting of free Licence or Licences at lower Rates, than the general Establishment has been found to produce no Advantage to the Public.

No more free Liecnces to be granted. III. Be it therefore Enacted, That from and after the Publication hereof, it shall no longer be lawful for the Justices in their General Selfions, to grant any free Licences or other Licences to be paid for at a lefs Rate by the Person or Persons having or receiving the fame, than the feveral and respective Rates in, and by this Act established, and all and every such free Licence or Licences, which have been granted for lefs Duty than the general Duty heretofore imposed of fix Pounds, and three Pounds, shall from and after the Publication hereof cease, and be at an end; and all and every Person or Persons, who shall from and after the faid last mentioned period presume to keep Tavern or to retail any Liquors under, and by Virtue of such Licence or Licences, such Person or Persons shall be subject to the fame

pains and Penalties, that he, she or they would have been subject to if convicted of felling Liquors without Licence.

And whereas it is expedient and necessary, that all and every Person or Persons, who shall sell or vend Gunpowder by Retail within the Peninsula of Halifax should be licensed so to do.

IV. Be it therefore Enacted, That if any Person or Persons whatfoever, (Fourteen Days after Publication hereof) shall fell or vend to any Perfon or Perfons whatfoever within the Peninfula of Halifax, any Gunpowder by Retail, or in a lefs Quantity than Twenty five Pounds Weight, unless he, the or they to felling or Retailing the fame, shall have first procured and obtained a Licence for that purpose in the manner herein after directed, such Person or Persons so felling or retailing Gunpowder within the faid Peninfula without Licence, shall on Conviction thereof before any Two or more of His Majefty's Juffices of the Peace for the faid County of Halifax, forfeit and pay the Sum of Five Pounds, one half of which Penalty, shall go to the Informer, and the other Half for the Use of the Poor of the faid Town of Hali/ax, the fame to be levied by Warrant from faid Iuffices on the Goods or Chattles of the Offender or Offenders shall not on Conviction pay or fatisfy the faid Penalty or deliver to the proper Officer Goods, Chattles or Effects, sufficient on sale thereof to pay the same, such Offender or Offenders shall be imprisoned in the common Goal, for a Space not exceeding two Months at the Diferetion of faid Juffices.

V. And le it further Enasted, That immediately after the Publica. tion hereof, the Justices in their Sessions for the County of Halifax, shall proceed to grant Licences to retail Gunpowder to all fuch Perfons of good Fame and Reputation, as shall apply for the same. Provided always neversbeles, That the faid Justices shall not Grant to any Perfon or Perfons a Licence to retail Gunpowder, until he, fhe or they with one good and fufficient Perfon shall become bound in a Bond to our Sovereign Lord the King of One Hundred Pounds conditioned. That he, fhe or they shall, and will, well and truly conform to all such Regulations, as are now in force, or hereafter shall be made relative to the fafe keeping of Gunpowder; and that he, the, or they will not Receive, purchase or buy from any Person or Persons whatsoever, any Quantity of Gunpowder whatsoever, unless the Perfon or Perfons to delivering or felling the fame to him her or them, shall produce and deliver with fuch Gunpowder a Permit from the Impost and Excise Office, shewing that the same has been duly imported into the Province, and that the Duties thereon have been paid or fecured.

VI. And be it further Enasted, That the faid Justices in their Seffions shall give and grant to all and every Person or Persons, who shall

Licence to be granted for retailing of Gunpowder if felling a lefs quantity then 25 pounds.

On Penalty of £5. balf to the Informer, half to the Poor, if convicted before two Juffices, if unable to pay to be imprisoned not exceeding two Months.

Coft of Licence 1s. 6d. to be paid to the Clerk of the Peace. fhall apply for the fame as aforefaid, a Licence to retail Gunpowder free from any Coft, Charge or Imposition whatsoever, fave only one Shilling and fix Pence, which shall be paid to the Clerk of the Peace for drawing the Licence and Bond, and for performing every other Matter and Thing requisite for the Granting of said Licence.

VII. And be it further Enasted, That the faid Act for suppressing unlicensed Houses, and for granting a Duty to his Majesty on Perfons hereafter to be licensed, and the several Acts in Addition to, or Amendment or Alteration thereof, which have not been Amended or altered by this Act, shall be revived in full force, and the same and the said Acts, and every Matter and thing therein contained (except as before excepted) are hereby continued in full Force until the first Day of July, which will be in the Year of our Lord one Thousand Seven Hundred and Ninety One.

VIII. And be it further Enalled, That all and every Perfon or Perfons, who have done or transacted any Matter or Thing whatfoever, under or by virtue of the feveral Laws or Acts, hereby revived, during the Time fuch Laws or Acts were expired, fuch Perfon or Perfons is, and are hereby indemnified, and faved harmlefs. *Provided*, That the Act or Acts, which fuch Perfon or Perfons did or might have fo done by virtue of faid Laws would have been lawful to have. Been fo done, had fuch Acts or Laws not expired, but been continued in full Force and Virtue.

### CAP. IV.

# AN ACT for reviving and continuing in Force the feveral Acts herein after mentioned.

\* 22 \* HEREAS the several Acts or Laws of this Province bereinafter W mentioned, have expired on the 31st Day of March last, and it is expedient that the same should be revived and further continued.

I. Be it Enatted, by the Lieutenant Governor, Council and Affembly, That an Act made in the Twenty fixth Year of his prefent Majefty's Reign, intitled, An Act in Addition to, Amendment of an Act, to prevent Nuisances by Hedges, Wares and other Incumbrances, obstructing the Pasfage of Fish in the Rivers in this Province, Alfo an Act made in the fame year, intitled, an Act to enable one or more Justices of the Peace to iffue compulsory Process in the first Instance in Civil Causes, which are by Law triable before them: Alfo an Act made in the fifth Year of his prefent Majefty's Reign, intitled, an Act for the fummary Trials of Actions: And alfo an Act made in the Twenty Eighth Year of his prefent Majesty's Reign, intitled, an Act to raise a Sum of Money to repair the public Road leading from Halifax to Windfor, and to cause the Proprietors of

of Land on each fide of the faid Road to fettle the fame more expeditionfly, and every Matter, Claufe and thing contained in all and every the before mentioned Afts. And alfo in fuch as have been made in Explanation, Amendment or Alteration of any or either of the faid Acts which expired the faid 31ft Day of March laft, fhall be revived, and the fame and every matter and thing therein contained, are hereby revived, and the faid Acts, and every Matter and Thing therein contained fhall be continued in Force, and each and every of them, are hereby continued in full Force, until the first Day of July, which will be in the Year of Our Lord One Thoufand Seven Hundred and Ninety One, any thing in faid Acts or either of them to the contrary thereof notwithftanding.

II. And be it further Enabled, That all and every Perfon of Perfons who have done or transacted any Matter or Thing whatfoever, under or by Virtue of the feveral Laws or Acts hereby revived during the time fuch Laws or Acts were expired, fuch Perfon or Perfons is and are hereby indemnified and faved harmlefs; Provided that the Act or Acts which fuch Perfon or Perfons did or might have fo done by by Virtue of faid Laws would have been lawful to have been fo done had fuch Acts or Laws not expired, but been continued in full Force and Virtue, and fuch Acts as aforefaid, are hereby declared to be good and valid; any thing to the contrary thereof notwithftanding.

## CAP. V.

AN ACT in Amendment of an Act, intitled, an Act for establishing a public Market House in Halifax, and for regulating the same, also in Amendment of an Act, intitled, an Act for building a public Slaughter House in the Town of Halifax, and for regulating the same.

E it Enastied, by the Lieutenant Governor, Council and Af-B fembly, That any Perfon or Perfons other than Butchers, refident within the Peninfula of Halifax, bringing live Cattle, Sheep or Swine, for Sale to the Town of Halifax, fhall and may flaughter and kill the fame in any private Slaughter Houfe or other Building erected or to be erected for that Purpofe; Provided the fame be fituate on the Water, or on fome Wharf or Place, that fhall not create a Nuifance to any Part of the Town of Halifax, by fuch flaughtering as aforefaid; and that it fhall and may be lawful for fuch Perfon or Perfons by themfelves, their Servants or Agents, to fell and difpofe of the Meat or Flefh fo flaughtered at any I i j

All Slaughter Houfes to be near the Water Side.

All the above Acts continued in force until 1ft fuly 1990.

Place within the faid Town of Halifax, any Law, Ufage or Cuffom to the contrary thereof notwithstanding.

I. Provided always, That no Butcher resident as aforefaid shall be nominated or appointed the Servant or Agent of Persons bringing live Cattle, Sheep or Swine to the Town of Halifax as aforefaid.

JI. And be it further Engsted, That no Person or Persons whatso. ever, shall act as the Servant, Agent or Factor of any Person or Perfons what loever for the Purposes aforefaid, unless the Perfon or Perfons to conflict ing and appointing fuch Servant, Factor or Agent, shall actually be a Farmer or Farmers within this Province, and if fuch Servant, Factor or Agent, or any of them, after he or they, shall be appointed as aforefaid, shall purchase or buy any Cattle, Shapp or Swine, and shall fell the fame or any Part thereof in the manner permitted by this Act either for his own Account or for the Account of any other Person or Persons whatsoever, or shall sell for any Person any Cattle, Sheep or Swine, or any Part thereof, for any other Person or Persons other than those by whom he has been so conflituted; fuch Factor, Agent or Servant shall forfeit and pay for each and every Offence fo by him committed, the Sum of five Pounds the same to be recovered on Conviction before any two of his Majefty's Juffices of the Peace, one half of which Penalty shall go to the Informer, and the other half to the Poor of the Town, wherein fuch Offence shall be committed.

III. And be it further Enalted, That this Act and every Part, Matter, Claufe and Thing herein contained, shall be and remain in full Force, until the first Day of July which will be in the Year of our Lord One Thousand Seven Hundrod and Ninety One.
