And longs to see the day.

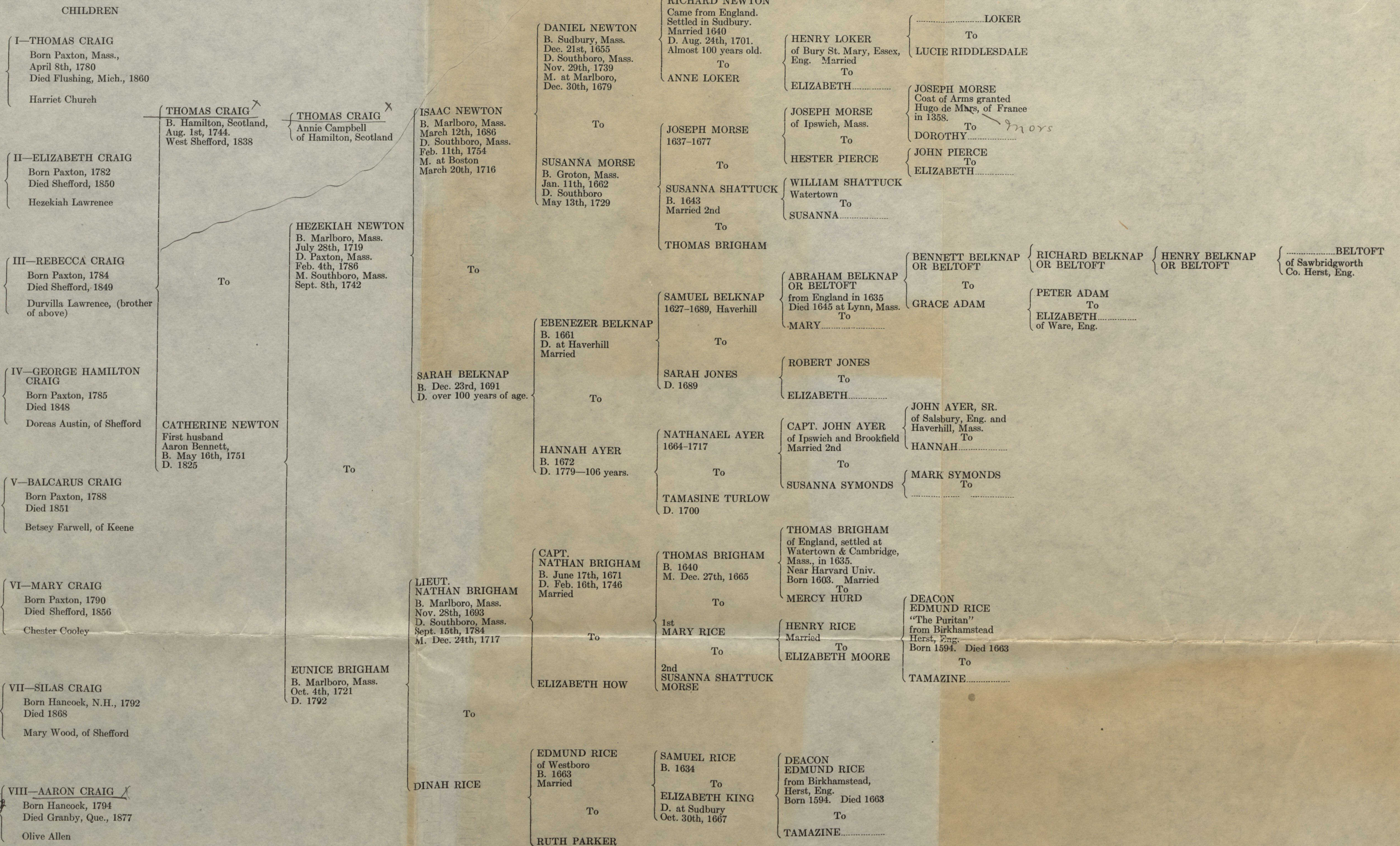
From sorrow toil and pain
