Severe Strictures by the Judges

On May 18, before Mr. Baron Pollock and Mr. Justice Hawkins, the case of the Queen v. Barnardo came up, in which a writ of habeas corpus had been issued for the production of a boy named Harry Gossage, who had been sent to Dr. Barnardo's homes and been by him entrusted to a man who described himself as Mr. William Norton of Quebec, who undertook to adopt him and take him to Canada. The writ was originally issued in November, 1889, and, the House of Lords having decided that Dr. Barnardo must make a return to it, he now submitted an affidavit in which he declared he did not know the whereabouts of the boy, and that enquiries he had made in Canada had utterly failed to lead to his discovery.
