DID GOSSAGE COME TO CANADA?

On May 18, before Mr. Baron Pollock and Mr. Justice Hawkins, the case of the Queen v. Barnardo came up, in which a writ of habeas corpus had been issued for the production of a boy named Harry Gossage, who had been sent to Dr. Barnardo's homes and been by him entrusted to a man who described himself as a Mr. William Norton of Quebec, who undertook to stop him and take him to Canada.

The return was a long one. In it the Doctor stated that Harry Gossage was born in 1878, at Oldbury, West Bromwich, Worcestershire. He was deserted by his mother, and hence found his way to the Olham Union, where he was taken in charge, far away from his home.
