THE SITUATION.

It is not until now that the United States has been forced to hold her own not only against the United States but against the United States and Russia acting together.

English capital is very largely invested in the United States, and if capital is frightened it will soon withdraw from Great Britain, and the Russian, on their side, have always relied upon the United States to assist them if the two great powers of Europe came into conflict.
